PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland: Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by the Constitution Statute it was amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to Governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, should apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the Constitution Act of Victoria and the now reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council made on the twenty-third day of November, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the No. 19.—FEBRUARY 2, 1894.—1.

said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill intituled

"An Act relating to the Marking of Load Lines on Ships,"

which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the fifth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies, it was provided among other things that the provisions of, the said former Act comeering the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria:

And whereas on the 5th of December, 1892, the Governor of the said Colony of Victoria reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony, entitled An Act relating to the Marking of Lord Lines on Ships, for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BUNYIP GENERAL CEMETERY. In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Bunyip General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2: The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four
- 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereimatter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein. erection therein.
- 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- 6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
- 7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave; and each grave must have at the head a distinguishing numbered iron label.
- 9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.
- 10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- 12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- 13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
- 14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.
- 15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
- 16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
- 17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

- 2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.
- 3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
- 4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.
- 5. For every allotment or piece of land, vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.
- For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust the amount of Two pounds per annum.
- 7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).
- 8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
- 9. Such rates and charges are hereby made, payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894.
- 10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 15 was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of section 122 of the Water Act 1890 this 4th day of December, 1893.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1894, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

- 1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
- 2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
- 3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
- 4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
- 6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
- 7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
- 8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling, over Twenty pounds municipal valuation One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 10. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a neter shall be 20,000 gallons, and for a supply to livery and carriers' stables Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
- 11. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- 12. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
- 13. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
- 14. For water supplied to market gardens or for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may specially be agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on demand, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1894.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust.

- 1. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.
- 2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—
 - (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 - (2) If for other than domestic purposes, 20,000 gallons per half-year.
- 3. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—
 - For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter.
 - For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, 2 inch diameter.
 - For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- 5. No person shall connect any service-pipes or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 6. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupiers shall within the time specified at his own expense provide a meter.
- expense provide a meter.

 7. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the kegs of the moter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.
- 8. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks (which shall be of high pressure and of strong hard brass) shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.
- Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.
- 10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.
- 11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five bounds.
- 12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.
- 13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 6 of this regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a nucter within the time in such notice specified shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding. Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.
- 14. No pipe shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

- 15. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice in writing of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose.
- 16. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 17. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of axinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officer of the Trust.
- 13. Stand-pipe or hydrant water, supplied other than by rate, under section 120 of the Water Act 1830—For each load of 100 gallons or under, Threepence; and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons, Threepence; to be paid for at time of taking.
- 19. For the temporary supply during the crection of a new building, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water, notify the Trust.
- 20. The use of water by hose or otherwise for garden purposes shall be absolutely prohibited between the hours of Seven a.n. and Five p.m.
- and Five p.m.

 21. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instrument, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied, or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such meter; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

 22. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust
- 22. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with said regulations and not otherwise.
- 23. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person commiting a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- not exceeding five pounds.

 24. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention to these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or willfully, or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
- 25. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the "Rochester Waterworks Trust."

MILDURA IRRIGATION COMPANY LIMITED.— REGULATIONS.

THE Directors of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limiteds in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Mildura Rating Act 1893 (No. 2), do hereby make the following regulations:—

- 1. Any person who shall commit any of the following offences shall be liable, on conviction, in a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50 for each offence, viz.:--
 - (a) Any person who shall take, or use, or cause to be taken or used, any water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company (other than within the town reticulated area) without the authority in writing of the said company.
 - (b) Any person who shall raise or lower any sluice gate or weir, or in any manner interfere with any appurtenance of any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, without the authority in writing of the said company.
 - (c) Any owner or occupier of land through or near to which there is a channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company who shall, without the authority in writing of the said company, obstructor in any manner whatover interfere with the flow of water in the said channel, conduit, or pipe, or alter in any manner whatever any such channel, conduit, or pipe.
 - (d) The owner or person having the control of any animal who shall drive or allow the same to stray upon the banks of the channels or fills belonging to or under the control of the said company.
 - (c) Any person who shall throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing into any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, or wash or cleanse therein any clothes, cloth, or other thing.
 - (f) The owner or person having the control of ducks or other fowls who shall allow the same to enter or swim in the channels belonging to or under the control of the said company.
 - (g) Any person who shall bathe in any reservoir, channel, or conduit belonging to or under the control of the said company, or cause to enter, or, having charge of, allow to enter therein any horse, dog, or other animal.
 - (h) Any person who shall maliciously or negligently destroy or damage any reservoir, dam, weir, tank, channel, conduit, pipe, bridge, culvert, box, or other part whatever of the works belonging to or under the control of the said company.
 - (i) Any owner or occupier who shall allow any waste water from his land contaminated or charged with sediment or débris to enter any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company.
- 2. If any person cause the water of any sink, sewer, or drain, or other filthy water belonging to him or under his control to run or be brought into any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, or do any other act whereby the water of the said company shall be fouled, he shall for each such offence be liable in a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

- 3. If any person using water shall allow more than 5 per cent. of the water supplied to run to waste to the loss of the said company, to the detriment or injury of the public roads or private or public lands, the said company shall have the right to shut off the water, and to coase to supply the same till such means of preventing the said waste are provided by such person as shall appear sufficient to the said company; and if the said person shall, nothwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any channel, reservoir, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

 4. The said company shall have the right to specify what shall
- enalty not exceeding the sum of 200.

 4. The said company shall have the right to specify what shall be the capacity of any head-ditch within the lands supplied by it with water, and failing compliance on the part of any owner or occupier of the said lands with such specification, or failing a head-ditch being kept in such condition that its capacity is not diminished, the said company shall have the right to refuse to supply water till the head-ditch is made of the required capacity or put in proper condition; and if the owner or occupier of such lands shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe, he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.
- 5. The said company shall have the right to refuse to supply water to any owner or occupier who shall be in arrear for three months with his water rates; and if such owner or occupier of such lands shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe, he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.

No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Government Gazette, to declare any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the United Shire of Beechworth has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets in the Township of Beechworth within the said Shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the United Shire of Beechworth aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—
