## MARINE ACT 1892.—ROYAL ASSENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it was amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to Governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, should apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council made on the twenty-third day of November, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the

said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill intituled

"An Act relating to the Marking of Load Lines on Ships,"

which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the fifth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New South Wales until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify either by speech or message to the Legislative Council of the said Colony or by Proclamation as therein aforesaid that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled *An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*, it was provided amongst other things that the provisions of the said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled *An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria, to establish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria*:

And whereas on the 5th of December, 1892, the Governor of the said Colony of Victoria reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony, entitled *An Act relating to the Marking of Load Lines on Ships*, for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

The words "Each cheese must be not less than sixty pounds (60 lbs.) weight, and packed in substantial wooden octagonal-shaped cases, two in each case, with a centre division in each case of half-an-inch thickness, the sides of case to be of oregon or pine timber," are hereby repealed, and the following words substituted in lieu thereof:—"The cheese must be packed in wooden packages."

ELEVEN of the crew of the barque *Spirit of the Dawn*, which was wrecked on the Antipodes Island, on the 4th September last, having remained on the island for eighty-eight days without becoming aware of the existence of the depot of provisions and clothing for castaways which is established there, it is thought advisable to draw the attention of mariners to the fact that such depots are maintained by the New Zealand Government on that island, and on the Auckland, Campbell, Bounty, and Kermadec Islands, and that it is proposed to establish one on the Snares.

The following are the positions of the depots:—  
*Auckland Islands*.—A depot is placed on the south side of Erebus Cove, Port Ross, and another in Camp Cove, Carnley Harbor. A third will be placed at the head of Norman Inlet the next time the Government steamer visits the islands. One boat is placed on the north-west end of Adams Island, another on Enderby Island, and one will be placed on Rose Island.

*Campbell Island*.—A depot is erected in Tucker Cove, Perseverance Harbor, and a boat will be placed at the head of that harbor.

*Antipodes Islands*.—A depot is placed abreast the anchorage on the north-east side of the principal island.

*Bounty Islands*.—There is a depot on the principal island.

*Snares Island*.—A depot will be established on this island the next time the *Hinemoa* visits the place.

*Kermadec Islands*.—A depot is established on Macaulay Island, near Lava Cascade, on the north-east end of the island, and another on Curtis Island, at the head of Macdonald Cove, on the north-western end of the island.

Finger-posts to indicate the direction of the depots will be erected on the islands.

The Government steamer visits the Auckland, Campbell, Antipodes, Bounty, and Snares Islands twice a year, and the Kermadec Islands once a year.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BUNYIP GENERAL CEMETERY.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Bunyip General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave; and each grave must have at the head a distinguishing numbered iron label.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

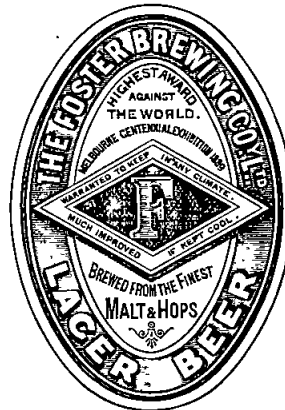

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose water district has for the purposes of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement whether occupied or not, a rate of Eightpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelvence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses will be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Sixteenpence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

  - (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
  - (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
  - (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
  - (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
  - (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
  - (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

**SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.—REGULATION No. 15.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district of Tungamah, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 20th January, 1891.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.
5. For every allotment or piece of land, vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.
6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust the amount of Two pounds per annum.
7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).
8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
9. Such rates and charges are hereby made, payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.**

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations, viz.:—

**REGULATION No. 1.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1894, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
  2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
  3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
  4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
  5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
  6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
  7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
  8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
  9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling, over Twenty pounds municipal valuation One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
  10. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 20,000 gallons, and for a supply to livery and carriers' stables Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
  11. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if applied otherwise than by measure.
  12. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
  13. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
  14. For water supplied to market gardens or for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may specially be agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.
- The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on demand, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1894.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

## ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

## REGULATION No. 1.

The following charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust.

1. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, 20,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch diameter.

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. No person shall connect any service-pipes or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified at his own expense provide a meter.

7. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

8. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks (which shall be of high pressure and of strong hard brass) shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

9. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 6 of this regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

14. No pipe shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

15. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice in writing of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose.

16. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officer of the Trust.

18. Stand-pipe or hydrant water, supplied other than by rate, under section 129 of the *Water Act 1890*—For each load of 100 gallons or under, Threepence; and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons, Threepence; to be paid for at time of taking.

19. For the temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water, notify the Trust.

20. The use of water by hose or otherwise for garden purposes shall be absolutely prohibited between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m.

21. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instrument, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied, or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such meter; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with said regulations and not otherwise.

23. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention to these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully, or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

25. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the "Rochester Waterworks Trust."

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound (£1) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Fifteen pounds a rate of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.). On houses or tenements exceeding Fifteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

3. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and upwards a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling.

4. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

5. A minimum rate of One pound and a maximum rate of Four pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

6. Water supplied to the Government Departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January, 1894, and 1st July, 1894.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

#### MILDURA IRRIGATION COMPANY LIMITED.— REGULATIONS.

THE Directors of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Mildura Rating Act 1893* (No. 2), do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. Any person who shall commit any of the following offences shall be liable, on conviction, in a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50 for each offence, viz.:—

- (a) Any person who shall take, or use, or cause to be taken or used, any water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company (other than within the town reticulated area) without the authority in writing of the said company.
- (b) Any person who shall raise or lower any sluice gate or weir, or in any manner interfere with any appurtenance of any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, without the authority in writing of the said company.
- (c) Any owner or occupier of land through or near to which there is a channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company who shall, without the authority in writing of the said company, obstruct or in any manner whatever interfere with the flow of water in the said channel, conduit, or pipe, or alter in any manner whatever any such channel, conduit, or pipe.
- (d) The owner or person having the control of any animal who shall drive or allow the same to stray upon the banks of the channels or fills belonging to or under the control of the said company.
- (e) Any person who shall throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing into any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, or wash or cleanse therein any clothes, cloth, or other thing.
- (f) The owner or person having the control of ducks or other fowls who shall allow the same to enter or swim in the channels belonging to or under the control of the said company.
- (g) Any person who shall bathe in any reservoir, channel, or conduit belonging to or under the control of the said company, or cause to enter, or, having charge of, allow to enter therein any horse, dog, or other animal.
- (h) Any person who shall maliciously or negligently destroy or damage any reservoir, dam, weir, tank, channel, conduit, pipe, bridge, culvert, box, or other part whatever of the works belonging to or under the control of the said company.
- (i) Any owner or occupier who shall allow any waste water from his land contaminated or charged with sediment or debris to enter any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company.

2. If any person cause the water of any sink, sewer, or drain, or other filthy water belonging to him or under his control to run or be brought into any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, or do any other act whereby the water of the said company shall be fouled, he shall for each such offence be liable in a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

3. If any person using water shall allow more than 5 per cent. of the water supplied to run to waste to the loss of the said company, to the detriment or injury of the public roads or private or public lands, the said company shall have the right to shut off the water, and to cease to supply the same till such means of preventing the said waste are provided by such person as shall appear sufficient to the said company; and if the said person shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any channel, reservoir, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the said company, he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

4. The said company shall have the right to specify what shall be the capacity of any head-ditch within the lands supplied by it with water, and failing compliance on the part of any owner or occupier of the said lands with such specification, or failing a head-ditch being kept in such condition that its capacity is not diminished, the said company shall have the right to refuse to supply water till the head-ditch is made of the required capacity or put in proper condition; and if the owner or occupier of such lands shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe, he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.

5. The said company shall have the right to refuse to supply water to any owner or occupier who shall be in arrear for three months with his water rates; and if such owner or occupier of such lands shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe, he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.

REGULATION for the making of a rate, under section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894.

2. Such rate is made payable on the 1st day of March, 1894.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

WHEREAS a certain question of disputed compensation has arisen between the Board of Land and Works (hereinafter referred to as the Board) and John Sheridan and Frederick Appleton, both of Eddington, in the colony of Victoria, brewers, carrying on business as brewers under the style or firm of "John Sheridan and Company" (hereinafter referred to as the claimants), in connexion with alleged or contemplated injuries, loss, and damage to the claimants through infringement and violation of their riparian rights and easements over the water of the River Loddon constantly or intermittently flowing in or through the property of the claimants, fronting and adjoining the said River Loddon, and being part of allotment twenty, section six, parish of Eddington, county of Talbot, in consequence of the construction by the Board of a weir known as the Laanecoorie Weir: And whereas the amount claimed by the claimants exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the powers in that behalf conferred upon him by the *Water Act 1890*, doth hereby appoint William Henry Gaunt, Esquire, a Judge of the County Court of Victoria, to whom has been assigned as next on the list to hold the said Court the County Court at Dunolly, being the County Court held nearest to the locality where the alleged injury or damage has taken place, as the arbitrator to determine the question of disputed compensation as aforesaid.

And the Honorable James Hiers McColl, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee of any vermin district may, in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate, to be called a "fencing rate," specifying the amount thereof to be paid by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district upon whose boundaries any vermin-proof wire-net fence has been erected by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the cost of the erection of such fence, or any portion thereof, and for the repair and maintenance of the same: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the Eastern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing to be the fencing rate payable for the current year under the provisions of Part II. of the Act aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing to be the fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District whose lands are on the vermin-proof fence.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District shall be Ten shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Five shillings and sixpence per square mile.

No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall, unless he hold a special permit, cut, dig, or remove timber or bark on or from the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Bolangum, Callawadda, Glynwylln, and Morri Morri, counties of Borung and Kara Kara, except timber for mining and saw-mill purposes only, which at a height of three feet from the surface of the ground is twenty-four inches or more in diameter.—(94.P.31133.)

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 63, for regulating the market place, and the buildings, stalls, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or on the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows, viz.:-

1. That the market shall be known as the Warrnambool General Market, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings appointed to be used for the purposes of such market, situated in Haglan parade, between Liebeg-street and Kepler-street, and bounded on the north by the Victoria market yards and buildings, which shall be used and appropriated for the sale of corn, grain, hay, straw, meat, poultry, eggs, milk, butter, vegetables, or other provisions.

2. That the market shall be open for the sale of the articles enumerated in clause 1 every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, from Six o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m., and every Thursday from Six o'clock a.m. till One o'clock p.m., and every Saturday from Six o'clock a.m. until Ten o'clock p.m., save and except that the market shall not be open on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or any other proclaimed or locally proclaimed public holiday.

3. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the said market any of the articles mentioned in clause 1 hereof before the opening or after the closing of the said market.

4. All articles as aforesaid exposed or offered for sale in the said market shall be subject to the payment of such stallage rents, tolls, and dues as shall from time to time be fixed by regulation as provided by the said Act.

5. No person shall place or keep any cart, carriage, or wheelbarrow in any part of the said market contrary to the directions of the inspector thereof.

6. No person shall place any article, matter, or thing so as to obstruct the passages or ways in the said market or the approaches thereto.

7. No person shall place any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any stall, or in any way fit up or enclose any such stall except with the consent and under the direction of the market inspector.

8. The holder of any stall or shed in such market shall, before Eight o'clock a.m. on the day such market is appointed to be open, thoroughly cleanse his or her stall or shed, and the footway and gutter in front thereof.

Every person wilfully committing any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

**BOROUGH OF MARYBOROUGH.****BY-LAW No. 39.**

A By-law of the Borough of Maryborough, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 39, for regulating the hours during which and conditions on which traction and locomotive engines and rollers impelled by steam or electricity may proceed over the roads within the Borough of Maryborough.

No person shall drive along any road within the Borough of Maryborough any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity if its weight exceeds 10 tons, or so that the same engine or roller shall push or haul over any road in the said borough any tender or other vehicle, if the weight of such tender or other vehicle, including its loading, exceeds 10 tons; or if the pressure per inch or width of tire which any one of its wheels exerts upon the road exceeds the pressure per inch of width of tire of the heaviest-laden wheel of the engine pushing or hauling it, or if the minimum width of tire of such tender or other vehicle be less than 8 inches, or so that any part of the said engine or roller shall be or remain upon the same bay, span, or arch of any bridge or culvert within the said borough at the same time as the tender or other vehicle or any part thereof pushed or hauled by the said engine or roller, unless the joint weight of the whole train, including the engine, be less than 10 tons. And no traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity shall proceed along or over any road within the said borough before the hour of Eight p.m. or after the hour of Six a.m.

Any person offending against this by-law shall for every such offence forfeit a sum of not less than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.
