TONNAGE OF ITALIAN SHIPS.

THE following copy of a Circular from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, together with copy of an Order in Council therein referred to, relating to the mode of estimating the net registered tonnage of Italian ships, is published for general information.

SIR,—With reference to the Earl of Derby's circular despatch of the 6th of March, 1883, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council modifying the provisions of the Order in Council of the 14th of February, 1883, in regard to the mode of estimating the net registered tonnage of Italian ships.

PRESENT :

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, therein called the Principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on their certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships :

And whereas Her Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 30th day of September, 1873, was pleased to direct that merchant, sailing, and steam ships belonging to the Kingdom of Italy, the measurement whereof had, after the 1st day of July, 1873, been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such ships testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their registers or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships ; provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any Italian steam-ship should desire the deduction for engine-room in such ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships

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instead of under the Italian rule, the engine-room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules :

And whereas Her Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 14th day of February, 1883, was pleased to declare that (the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to the steam-ships of Italy having been modified by Royal Decree of His Majesty the King of Italy, dated the 30th day of July, 1882), the steam-ships of Italy, the certificates of Italian nationality and registry of which were dated on or after the 21st day of September, 1882, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Italian nationality and registry :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that certain additions should be made to the provisions of the said last recited Order in Council in regard to the mode of estimating the net registered tonnage of Italian ships :

Now therefore Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is further pleased to direct as follows, viz., that in the event of the net registered tonnage of Italian ships, estimated under the British rules, being denoted on their certificates of registry or other national papers, the same shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted therein.

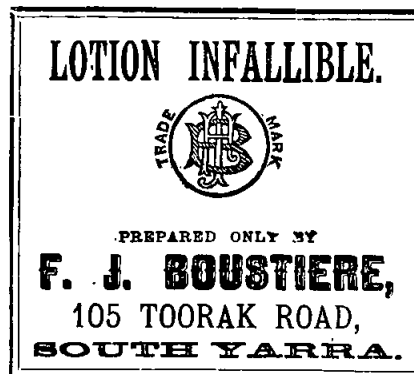

KERANG EAST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

REGULATION for the making of a rate, under section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1. *Service-pipes.*—The Trust may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes—one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid; and one for other than domestic purposes, with meter, for which supply the ordinary charges by measure shall be paid, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Trust to prevent the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for any purpose not domestic.

2. *Meters to be tested and approved.*—No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexion above ground in a conveniently accessible position properly protected and fixed to the satisfaction of the Trust's officers.

3. *Where meter ceases registering, average may be charged.*—If any meter in use ceases registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

4. *Hire of meters and rate of rent thereof.*—Meter rent to be exclusive of rate.—*Hirer to give notice of removal.*—The Trust will, if it so think fit but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent of which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch	Six shillings
For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch	Seven shillings
For 1-inch	Ten shillings
For $1\frac{1}{4}$ -inch	Twelve shillings

which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter, and the occupier of the premises shall, at his own cost, cause such meter to be fixed and kept in proper repair, and when required on behalf of the Trust so to do, shall cause such meter to be removed to the office of the Trust to be tested, and when it shall have been so tested, shall cause it, or such other meter as may be furnished to him in lieu of it, to be replaced at his own cost, and shall be in like manner responsible for the same. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. *Services to be separate except by permission.*—Excepting with the permission of the Trust not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service; and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

6. *Extensions subject to consent of the Trust.*—No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

7. *Service-pipes to be repaired by owner or occupier.*—Penalty for refusal or neglect to repair service-pipe.—The service-pipes from 3 feet on street from building line being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none the owner shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

8. *Waste of water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. *Water not to be used or supplied without written authority.*—Any person receiving water from the Trust who, without the written permission of the Trust, shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. *Non-ratepayers may obtain water at the stand-pipes at certain hours.*—Non-ratepayers may obtain water at the stand-pipes at the scale of charges and at the hours fixed from time to time. Payments to be made by coupons only, which may be obtained at the office of the Trust.

11. *Unlawful taking of water without permission.*—Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. *Unlicensed persons not to interfere with pipes or services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. *Licences to plumbers to be during pleasure of the Trust.*—Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Act or of this regulation.

14. *Proof of fitness to be given by the applicant before granting of licence.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the regulations of the Trust, and with the sections of the *Water Act 1890*, affecting his work, but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

15. *Notices to be given on printed forms.*—All notices and applications required by this regulation are to be made upon printed forms, to be obtained at the office of the Trust. Notices sent by post must be prepaid.

16. *Notice of proposed work to be given.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

17. *Fittings to be of the best quality and subject to approval.*—No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball, cock, valve, closet-cistern, service-box, waste-not regulator, bath-tap, or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

18. *High-pressure cocks to be used.*—No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not loose-valve screw-down high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

19. *Cisterns and tanks.*—No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and the overflow-pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Trust.

20. *Water-closets.*—No person shall construct or use any water-closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet-cistern or service-box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service-pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or tap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water-closet.

21. *Urinals.*—Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service-box fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service-pipe shall be suffered to communicate directly with any urinal.

22. *Mains to be tapped by Trust only.*—The Trust only is empowered to tap the water mains or sub-mains in the streets and attach service-pipes thereto, fixing wherever practicable a separate service for each house or tenement; but in all cases where a supply is desired to premises situated in public streets or highways where no mains exist, such supply will be given only under special agreement.

23. *Trust will lay pipes to three feet from building line.*—The Trust will lay all service-pipes from the mains to a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line of the street, and the owner or occupier shall at his own cost lay and maintain the remaining three (3) feet to the building line in addition to all the pipes and apparatus on his premises.

24. *Service-pipes not to communicate with tanks.*—No service-pipe will be allowed to communicate with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rain water, whether above or below the surface of the ground.

25. *Service-pipes to be best quality.*—*Weight, &c., of service-pipes.*—*Wrought-iron pipes, &c.*—All service-pipes must be of lead or wrought iron of the best quality, and, where lead pipes are used, they must be of equal thickness throughout and of at least the following weights:—

Wrought-iron pipes must be those known as "wrought-iron lap-welded steam tubes," and all pipes, fittings, &c., must be capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height. No pipe to be laid at a less depth than ten inches (10 inches) below the surface of the ground.

26. *Laying pipes in sewers.*—No pipe or other apparatus must be laid through any sewer, drain, ash-pit, manure-tank, or other place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unbound, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be fouled

or to escape without observation—unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.

27. *Size of service-pipes.*—Except when the supply is paid for by meter, the supply of water will be through separate service-pipes of the following diameters, according to the assessed annual value of the premises, as follows:—

For premises assessed at £20 or under ... ½-inch pipe
For premises assessed at more than £20 ... ¾-inch "

No pipe or larger bore than ¾-inch shall be allowed, except with the written authority of the Trust.

28. *Notice to lay services to be given.*—*Material to be approved and work inspected.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

29. *Maximum tapping without clip.*—The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—

For 3-inch and 4-inch pipes	...	¾-inch tapping.
For 5-inch, 6-inch, and 7-inch pipes	...	1 " "
For 8-inch pipes	...	1½ " "
For 9-inch pipes	...	1½ " "
Over 9-inch pipes	...	2 " "

30. *Private fire services, &c.*—Subject to previous written consent of the Trust, private fire services will be allowed, at expense of owner, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the Trust's officer shall have certified in writing that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof, and a sum of Ten shilling per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire no person shall, without authority of the Trust, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken, accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall, within 24 hours thereafter, give notice, in writing, of the fact at the office of the Trust, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a continuing penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

31. *Brass couplings.*—All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

32. *Lead joints to be "wiped."*—All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who by himself or his workman shall break these regulations.

33. *Stop-cock and cover-box.*—A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line, at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the latter.

34. *Baths, restriction as to capacity.*—No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the special permission of the Trust. The inlet pipe must be placed above the highest water level of the bath, and no overflow pipe will be allowed except when the bath is fitted with an improved waste-preventer.

35. *Regulator valve to be fixed in steam services.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

36. *Street watering to be by permission.*—No person other than an employee of the Trust or a municipality, or member of a fire brigade on duty shall, without the written permission of the Trust, be allowed to take water from the fire-plugs for watering the streets or any other purpose (except in case of fire). The streets shall not be watered from fire-plugs or hydrants directly, but the water is to be supplied to the streets by means of carts or manual labour. Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

37. *Supply to public parks and gardens.*—The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

38. *Hose, when allowed.*—No person shall convey water supplied by the Trust through a hose for any purpose except when the water is supplied by measure. Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

39. *Reward for information.*—The Trust will pay a reward of not less than Ten shillings to any person who will give such information as shall lead to the detection of any person or persons who shall wrongfully attach (temporarily or otherwise) any pipe to any of the mains or services of the Trust, or to any pipe or apparatus connected therewith, or who shall wrongfully draw off, use, or take water of the Trust, or who shall knowingly permit the same to be done.

40. *Consent of Trust.*—*Notices to be addressed to secretary.*—*Conditions as to notice.*—*Consent may be given by chairman, secretary, or engineer.*—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in any regulation of the Trust, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent, in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the chairman of the Trust, the secretary, or the engineer, who, severally, shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Water Trust for confirmation.

41. *Penalties.*—For every offence against any provision of this regulation for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall upon conviction be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

42. *Interpretation clause.*—In the construction of this regulation, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, the words "the Trust" shall be understood to mean the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust, and the words "the Act" shall be understood to mean the *Water Act 1890*.

The foregoing Regulation was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust on the 17th day of January, 1893, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in the presence of

SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.— URBAN PORTION.—REGULATION FOR 1894 BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans, in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf, and the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust:

And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 5th December, 1893, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1894, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 5th December, 1893, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1894, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1894 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban Districts.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1894.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the 13th day of December, 1893.

Teachers Act 1893.

APPOINTMENT AND TRANSFER OF PUPIL TEACHERS, MONITORS, AND SEWING MISTRESSES.—REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth
day of February, 1894.*

WHEREAS by the *Teachers Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for certain purposes therein specified, and generally for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid dealing with the appointment and transfer of Pupil Teachers, Monitors, and Sewing Mistresses, and the Regulation made under the provisions of the *Education Act 1890* respecting the treatment of Monitors in connexion with examinations for payment by way of results, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz.:—

REGULATIONS.

PUPIL TEACHERS.

1. As vacancies occur, monitors will be regarded as having the first claim to appointment as pupil teachers in the schools in which they have been appointed monitors, provided there is no pupil teacher recorded for transfer, or any candidate recorded on the Employment Register for such appointment. In the event of there being more than one monitor employed in a school in which there is a vacancy for a pupil teacher, the order of seniority for appointment shall be determined by competitive examination, and the subjects for examination shall be decided by the district inspector. Monitors who have been removed on account of reduced average attendance will be permitted to compete for vacancies in the school in which they were employed.

2. Candidates for appointment as pupil teachers must be not less than fourteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed in reading spelling and composition, writing, arithmetic, grammar, and, in the case of girls, needlework, as prescribed for the Fifth or the Sixth Class in the course of Free Instruction (Regulation 1); or (2) must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne; or (3) have been the holders of State School scholarships or exhibitions; or (4) have been employed as teachers in unclassified schools, by virtue of their having passed an examination under the Education Department; or (5) have passed the departmental examination for admission to training.

3. Where there is no applicant recorded for transfer and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy the name of such candidate shall be entered on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

4. When there is no applicant recorded for transfer and there are more qualified candidates than one a competitive examination shall be held, the subjects of which shall be some or all of those specified in the programme of instruction for the Sixth Class of State Schools as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department. In determining the order of merit

of the candidates, consideration shall be given to the aptitude of the respective candidates for teaching as reported on by the district inspector. The examiner shall place the names of candidates in order of merit, and shall report to the Secretary of the Education Department, for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, the names of as many candidates as there are vacancies. The names of such candidates shall be entered in the Employment Register in the same order.

5. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the district inspector of schools for examination for qualification at any ordinary visit for inspection.

6. Pupil teachers' names shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer in the following order:—

First.—Pupil teachers in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or who are in excess of the staff allowed under the Third Schedule of the *Teachers Act* 1893.

Second.—Pupil teachers recorded for transfer—

I. In the public interest.

II. On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.

III. For some other satisfactory reason, such as removal of parents or guardians.

MONITORS.

Section 18n, *Teachers Act* 1893 (No. 1302).

1. Monitors will be appointed as vacancies occur, and every such appointment will be temporary and will cease while the average attendance of the school in which the monitor is employed falls below the requirements of the Third Schedule of the *Teachers Act* 1893, and may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the Minister.

2. The salary for monitors will be at the rate of £12 per annum for males and £10 per annum for females.

3. Candidates whose names are on the Employment Register by virtue of their having been placed first, second, or third at a competitive examination for appointment as pupil teacher, held prior to the 16th day of May, 1893, shall have the first claim to appointment as monitors in the schools in which they are so recorded for appointment as pupil teachers.

4. The qualifications for appointment will be the same as those for the Fourth Class of pupil teachers. When there are more qualified candidates than one for any vacancy a competitive examination, as prescribed for pupil teachers, shall be held to determine the candidate to be appointed.

5. When the reduced average attendance at any school in which there are more monitors than one employed renders the removal of a monitor necessary, the order of seniority for retention shall be determined by the annual pupil teachers' examination passed by such monitors; but in the event of their not having so passed then the services of the monitor placed lowest in order of merit at the original examination shall be terminated.

6. Except that they will not be required to attend the special class, monitors shall be entitled to receive instruction with, and as provided for, pupil teachers, and may present themselves at the annual examinations in the literary work prescribed for the pupil teacher examinations.

7. Monitors who have passed the literary examination for any class of pupil teachers will be entitled, on their being appointed

pupil teachers and completing their examinations, to be classified in such class and to be paid accordingly.

8. Monitors may be recorded for transfer on their satisfying the Department that such transfer is necessary.

Section 23, *Education Act* 1890 (No. 1086).

Monitors.

Monitors will not be reckoned as scholars in any examination for payment by way of results under Regulation No. III. of the Regulations under the *Education Act* 1890, and their attendance at school must not be recorded in the school rolls.

SEWING MISTRESSES.

1. Candidates shall not be less than seventeen years of age, and, prior to appointment, must furnish satisfactory evidence as to good character and sound health.

2. When there is no person recorded for transfer, and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, the Secretary of the Education Department shall, when satisfied that the candidate is competent to perform the duties of the position, inform the Committee of Classifiers thereof, who shall enter the name of the candidate on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

3. When there is no person recorded for transfer and there are more qualified candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held in the subjects for the Third Class of State Schools, as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department, and in the other subjects specified in 1 *supra*. The examiner shall arrange the names of the candidates in their order of merit as determined by the examination, and report to the Secretary of the Education Department for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, who shall enter in the Employment Register in such order the names of the first two.

4. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the district inspector for examination at any ordinary visit for inspection.

5. The names of sewing mistresses shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer in the following order:—

First.—Sewing mistresses in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or whose services have been discontinued through the operation of the provisions of the Third Schedule of the *Teachers Act* 1893.

Second.—Sewing mistresses recorded for transfer—

I.—In the public interest.

II.—On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.

III.—For some other satisfactory reason.

And the Honorable Richard Baker, Her Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. V. (Examination and Classification of Teachers) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz. :—

V.—EXAMINATION AND CLASSIFICATION OF
TEACHERS.

1. Permits to teach in temporary unclassified schools will be granted to persons who possess the following qualifications :—

They must be not less than seventeen years of age if females, or eighteen years of age if males, of good character, sound health, and—

- (1) Hold the licence to teach or any higher certificate under the Education Department ; or
- (2) Satisfy an inspector of schools that they are able to impart elementary instruction ; and
 - (a) Hold an approved certificate of qualification from the Committee of Council of Education, or from any recognised board or department of education, in any British possession ; or
 - (b) Have passed the Matriculation or any higher examination of a recognised University ; or
 - (c) Have passed a satisfactory examination held by the Department in reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, elementary science, and history, as specified below.

Reading.—To read fluently and with proper emphasis.

Writing.—To write any passage dictated, with correct spelling and punctuation, and with fair penmanship.

Arithmetic.—Notation, numeration, the simple and compound rules, bills of parcels, reduction, practice, proportion, interest, vulgar and decimal fractions.

Grammar.—Parsing, analysis, and the inflexions.

Geography.—Easy questions on the map of the world generally ; explanation of the lines marking latitude and longitude and the zones on a map of the world.

Elementary Science.—As required for the Third and Second classes of pupil teachers.

History.—As required for the Third and Second classes of pupil teachers.

2. Licences to Teach will be granted—

- (a) To candidates who have passed in all subjects for a certificate of competency, except those included under "Theory and Practice of Teaching," on their passing an examination in the "Art of Teaching."
- (b) To candidates who show sufficient proficiency by examination in the subjects prescribed for the certificate of competency.
- (c) To pupil teachers who have completed their course.

3. The requirements in "Art of Teaching", for a licence to teach will be—

To give a satisfactory lesson to a class in reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, or geography; to keep the class in order, attention, and activity; and to be able to drill a class.

4. Certificates of competency will be granted to candidates upon examination.

5. Trained teachers and teachers classified in honours will have their additional qualifications entered upon their certificates.

6. The examination for a certificate of competency will comprise the following subjects:—

Reading.—To read fluently, and with proper expression and emphasis, both prose and poetry, from any book or newspaper.

Dictation and Composition.—To write from dictation, with correct spelling and punctuation, from any ordinary book or newspaper, and to compose a short essay on some given subject.

Writing.—To write neatly text or half-text and small hand. The general character of the writing in the examination papers will be considered in judging this subject.

Grammar.—Grammar, including structure of words, analysis, and syntactical parsing; to answer questions on the language and subject-matter of a work of some standard English author (to be prescribed from time to time), and on the life of the author.

Geography.—The form, motions, magnitude, and measurement of the earth; latitude and longitude; the surface of the earth, including mountain systems, plateaux, plains, and valleys, volcanoes and their distribution, river systems and lakes, oceans and their phenomena; climatology, including winds, heat, and moisture; distribution of plants and animals; descriptive and political geography of the world generally; map drawing.

Arithmetic.—Arithmetic generally, and the elements of mensuration, viz., the calculation of the sides and areas of rectangular surfaces and of triangles, the diameters, circumferences, and areas of circles, and the contents and dimensions of rectangular and cylindrical solids.

Bookkeeping.

History.—General outlines of the history of the British Empire, with a more detailed knowledge of Australasian discovery and settlement, and of the history of Victoria.

Elementary Science.—A knowledge of the subjects specified under "Elementary Science" in the programme for pupil teachers.

Singing.—Theory: As for Class VI. in Regulation I.

Practice: To pitch, sing, and conduct an easy school song; to sing at sight a simple junior-class song of not greater difficulty than the "Minstrel Boy."

Drawing.—As for Class VI. in Regulation I.

Needlework.—Females to be able to cut out and to do any kind of plain needlework, including patching and mending, to darn and to knit, and to give a class lesson in such work.

Theory and Practice of Teaching.—

- (a) To compose the notes of, and to give, a collective lesson on a subject chosen by the inspector; to be able to drill a class.
- (b) To answer questions in school organization and management, and methods of teaching. A knowledge of the subjects to be treated of, and of the methods to be adopted, in giving lessons on health, morals, and manners will be included under this head.
- (c) Males to draw up and carry out a time-table suitable for the school of which the candidate has charge.

7. The requirements for classification in honours will be as under :—

FOR SECOND HONOURS :

- (1) To have obtained one of the first four literary qualifications prescribed for a Third-class teacher under the Public Service Act, viz.:—
 - (i.) To hold a certificate of competency and to have also passed the Matriculation examination at the Melbourne University.
 - (ii.) To hold a certificate of competency, and also hold two of the Department's Science certificates.
 - (iii.) To have obtained the trained teacher's certificate subsequently to 31st December, 1875.
 - (iv.) To have obtained a trained teacher's certificate of first or second class under the Board of Education; and
- (2) To hold a degree of the Melbourne University in Arts, Science, or Laws; or to have passed at the Melbourne University the first ordinary examination for the degree of Bachelor of Arts; or to have passed in four of the subjects prescribed for one of the ordinary examinations in Arts, at least two of which must be passed at one examination, and the remaining subject or subjects at one examination held in the same or the next succeeding year.
- (3) To have passed a satisfactory examination in the theory of teaching, embracing—
 - (a) The leading principles of education; the faculties, their training and development; habit and character.
 - (b) School organization and management; methods of teaching; notes of lessons.
- (4) To have satisfactorily discharged the duties of a classified teacher for at least two years, and to be recommended for classification in honours in a special report by the Inspector-General or by some other inspector of schools deputed to report on the candidate's application for such classification.

FOR FIRST HONOURS :

- (1) To have obtained second-class honours, and to hold a degree of the Melbourne University in Arts, Science, or Laws, or to have passed at the Melbourne University the second or the third ordinary examination for the degree of Bachelor of Arts; or to have obtained second-class honours, and to have passed in four of the subjects prescribed for the second ordinary examination in the course for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, at least two of which must be passed at one examination, and the remaining subject or subjects at one examination held in the same or the next succeeding year.
- (2) To have passed a satisfactory examination in the theory and history of education.
- (3) To be recommended for classification in first-class honours in a special report by the Inspector-General or by some other inspector of schools deputed to report on the candidate's application for such classification, and, if males, to have satisfactorily conducted a classified school for at least two years.

Provided that the candidate, unless he hold a trained teacher's certificate, shall have passed at some examination of the University of Melbourne—(a) in Latin or Greek, and also (b) in Mathematics, as in any ordinary examination for the completion of a year, or in Algebra and Geometry, as in the Matriculation examination. Provided also that no candidate shall be awarded First Honours on the same examination as that on which he has been awarded Second Honours.

Application for permission to attend the University examination at the reduced fee must be made to the Secretary, on or before 7th September in each year, on a form which will be supplied on application at the Education Office.

8. Examinations for certificates of competency will be held annually at Melbourne and such other places as the Minister may appoint, when all male candidates of eighteen years of age, and female candidates of seventeen years, except pupil teachers of the Second or a lower class, who present themselves for examination, and who produce satisfactory certificates of moral character and health, may be examined in the literary subjects required.

9. Candidates must bear their own travelling expenses; and all candidates who are not actually employed as teachers, pupil teachers, or sewing mistresses will be required to pay a fee of Ten shillings previous to examination.

PUPIL TEACHERS.

10. Pupil teachers will be divided into four classes.

11. Pupil teachers will, as vacancies occur, be appointed to the Fourth or lowest class, in accordance with the Regulations made by the Classifiers under Section 68 of the *Public Service Act* 1890. (The requirements for the Fourth Class of pupil teachers are shown in the Regulations under the *Teachers Act* 1893.)

12. The requirements for the three higher classes will be as follows:—

FOR THIRD CLASS.

Reading.—To read fluently from the Fifth Royal Reader, or equivalent.

Poetry.—To be able to write from memory, or repeat, any passage from prescribed poetry in the Reading Book.

Writing.—To write fairly half-text or text and small hand.

Dictation.—To write out neatly in small hand, with correct spelling and fair punctuation, any passage dictated from the Fifth Reader, or equivalent.

Arithmetic.—Numeration and notation, the simple and compound rules, reduction, and bills of parcels, the meaning and notation of a vulgar fraction and a decimal, addition and subtraction of such fractions, practice, and simple proportion; mental arithmetic.

Grammar.—Analysis of complex sentences, inflexions of parts of speech, the full parsing of an easy sentence.

Geography.—The descriptive geography of Europe and of the Australasian Colonies; the form, magnitude, and motions of the earth; meridians, parallels, and zones.

History.—History of England; the outlines from the Conquest to the accession of Henry VII.

Elementary Science.—The chief forces of nature; the properties of solids, liquids, and gases; the simpler phenomena of heat (expansion of matter, liquefaction of solids, &c.).

Singing.—Theory: As for Class IV. in Regulation I., or Tonic Sol-fa equivalent.

Practice: Common chord in any order; to pitch and sing an Infant-class song.

Drawing.—As for Class IV. in Regulation I.

Needlework (for Girls).—

- (1) Cut out and make a chemise.
- (2) A plain darn of hole in stocking, web material.
- (3) Paper patterns, cut and tacked together, of a pinafore and a night-shirt.
- (4) To knit a sock.

Art of Teaching.—To be able to give satisfactory lessons in reading and geography. Class drill: Attention, right turn, left turn, half right turn, half left turn, marching, wheeling in file, and extension exercises.

FOR SECOND CLASS.

Reading.—To read with fluency and expression from the Sixth Royal Reader, or equivalent.

Poetry.—To be able to write out from memory, or repeat, any passage from prescribed poems.

- Writing*.—To write half-text or text and small hand.
- Composition*.—To write from memory neatly, in small hand, with correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation, the substance of a narrative read aloud.
- Arithmetic*.—The work of the Third Class; vulgar and decimal fractions, and interest; the calculation of the sides and areas of rectangular surfaces; mental arithmetic.
- Grammar*.—The rules of syntax and their application; analysis and full parsing, prefixes and affixes.
- Geography*.—The descriptive geography of the continents.
- History of England*.—Outlines from the accession of Henry VII. to the accession of William and Mary, and such historical lessons on the same period as may be contained in the Reading Books.
- Elementary Science*.—The causes of Day and Night, and of the seasons; the atmosphere and its phenomena (winds, rain, &c.); the simpler kinds of physical and mechanical appliances, *e.g.*, the thermometer, barometer, lever, pulley, pump, spirit-level.
- Needlework (for Girls)*.—
- (1) Cut out and make an infant's night-dress.
 - (2) A patch in calico, one in flannel, and one in print.
 - (3) Patterns of boy's shirt and woman's night-dress drawn to scale on paper.
 - (4) To knit a stocking.
 - (5) To give a class-lesson on hemming.
- Singing*.—Theory: As for Class V. in Regulation I., or Tonic Sol-fa or equivalent difficulty.
- Practice: To read at sight a simple melody of not greater difficulty than the "Old Hundredth;" to pitch, sing, and conduct an Infant-class song.
- Drawing*.—As for Class V. in Regulation I.
- Art of Teaching*.—To be able to give satisfactory lessons in writing, grammar, or arithmetic; to understand class drill.

FOR FIRST CLASS.

- Reading*.—To read with fluency and expression any prose or poetry.
- Writing*.—To write text or half-text, small, and running hands.
- Composition*.—To write from memory neatly, and with correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation, the substance of a short essay read aloud.
- Arithmetic*.—The work of the lower classes; compound proportion, square root, the calculation of the sides and areas of rectangular surfaces and of right-angled triangles, the diameter, circumference, and area of circles, and the contents and dimensions of rectangular and cylindrical solids; mental arithmetic.
- Grammar*.—The work of the Second Class, with the structure of words, and a knowledge of some English classic to be prescribed from time to time.
- Geography*.—The descriptive geography of the world, including the physical geography of the oceans; climatology, including the laws relating to winds, and the distribution of heat and moisture; to draw maps of the continents, showing their outlines, chief mountains, inland waters, and towns.
- History*.—Outlines of history of the British Empire from the Revolution to the present time, with such historical lessons on the same period on Australasian discovery and settlement, and on the history of Victoria, as may be contained in the Reading Books.
- Elementary Science*.—To know the general characteristics of animal and vegetable life; the principal divisions of the animal and vegetable kingdoms; the chief organs of the body.
- Singing*.—Theory: As for Class V. in Regulation I.
- Practice: To pitch key-note from given C; to read at sight a simple junior-class song of not greater difficulty than "The Minstrel Boy."

Drawing.—As for Class VI. in Regulation I.

Needlework (for Girls).—

- (1) A specimen required in the making of calico garments.
- (2) Specimen in flannel, showing all stitches required in making flannel garments.
- (3) Hedge-tear darn.
- (4) Paper patterns, cut out and tacked together, of child's drawers and a pinafore.
- (5) To teach any kind of plain sewing.

Art of Teaching.—

- (1) To draw up lesson notes and to give general lessons.
- (2) To answer easy questions on methods of teaching, and to be able to keep the school records.
- (3) To understand class drill.

N.B.—*Candidates in all classes will be required to show and explain how short mental exercises in arithmetic are to be solved.*

In judging of the writing, the general character of the penmanship in the examination work will be taken into consideration in all classes.

13. A general examination of pupil teachers will be held annually, and all pupil teachers who have been appointed not less than twelve months will be required to attend thereat under pain of forfeiting their salaries.

14. At the annual examination pupil teachers will be classed for the year. They must pass in order the examination for each class.

After the 31st December, 1894, pupil teachers will not be allowed to advance more than one class in any one year, unless (a) they are not less than seventeen years of age on the first day of January of such year, or unless (b) they have in a previous year failed to obtain promotion. When, under the provisions of the preceding clause (b) a pupil teacher under seventeen years of age is allowed to advance more than one class in a year, he shall not be promoted in such year to a higher class than he would have obtained had he passed each successive yearly examination.

15. Pupil teachers in the Fourth Class, who have passed in singing, drawing, and the art of teaching for the Third Class of pupil teachers, as prescribed in section 12 of this regulation, and who have, in addition, obtained the merit certificate awarded to pupils who pass fully in the subjects prescribed for Class VI. in the course of free instruction (Regulation I.) may, without further examination, be promoted to the Third Class of pupil teachers. In the case of pupil teachers who obtain the merit certificate prior to their appointment, such promotion shall not take place before the first day of January next succeeding the date of their appointment.

16. Pupil teachers will be liable to dismissal, on the recommendation of the Classifiers, for misconduct or failure to pass the annual examination.

17. Head teachers and assistants will be required to give to their pupil teachers instruction outside of the ordinary school hours, as follows:—

In a school having but one pupil teacher, except as hereinafter provided, five hours per week; in a school having more than one pupil teacher, except as hereinafter provided, at least six hours per week. *The time for such instruction and the names of the teachers giving the instruction must in all cases appear on the time-table.* The time actually given to the instruction shall be entered in the teachers' rolls by such head teacher or assistant, as the case may be. The exercise books kept by the pupil teachers, showing the work done under the direction of the head teachers and assistants, shall be dated from day to day, and shall be produced to the district inspector at his half-yearly visits.

18. Special classes for the instruction and training of pupil teachers will be formed in the principal centres of population, and pupil teachers employed in schools situated at convenient distances from the places in which these classes are held will be required to attend such classes, at such times as the Minister may from time to time direct.

19. Where pupil teachers attend the central classes referred to in the preceding section, the instruction to be given by the head teachers and assistants under section 17 *supra*, shall not be less than three hours per week. Such instruction shall be given at suitable times, and shall embrace such portions of the pupil teachers' course as may from time to time be determined by the Minister.

20. Pupil teachers will not be reckoned as scholars in any examination under Regulation III., for payment by way of results.

MUSIC.

21. Licences to teach and certificates of competency will be granted upon examination.

FOR A LICENCE TO TEACH, THE CANDIDATE WILL BE REQUIRED—

Reading.—To read at sight an exercise consisting of diatonic intervals, easy modulations only being admitted.

Writing.—To write a short and simple passage, composed of minims, sung in the presence of the candidate.

Theory of Music.—Notation in the various clefs, time, accent, the major and minor scales, the common chord and its inversions.

Teaching.—To be able to teach a class properly.

FOR A CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY, THE CANDIDATE WILL BE REQUIRED—

Reading.—To read at sight any ordinary passage from an oratorio or opera.

Writing.—To write in correct time an ordinary passage from an oratorio or opera.

Theory of Music.—To know the theory and practice of harmony and thorough bass, and to understand the formation of the voice.

Teaching.—To be able to teach a class properly; to produce a class taught by the candidate for a period of twelve months which shall pass a satisfactory examination.

22. Licences to teach will be granted without examination to all teachers who passed for the Second or Third Class under, or who hold a second division certificate from, the Board of Education; and certificates of competency to all those who passed under the former National or Denominational Board, or who passed for First Class under, or hold a first division certificate from, the Board of Education.

DRAWING.

23. Licences to teach and certificates of competency will be granted upon examination.

PROGRAMME OF EXAMINATION FOR A LICENCE TO TEACH.

Freehand.—An outline drawing from the flat of an example, which may contain a combination of straight lines, simple and compound curved lines, and may illustrate such elementary principles of ornamental construction as radiation, tangents, symmetry, gradation, breaks, &c.

Practical Geometry.—The construction of angles, the usual simple plane figures, the plain and the diagonal scale, and the scale of chords; the inscription of figures within, and the description of figures without, simple given figures; the simple application of proportionals; the plan and elevation of points, lines, and planes, and of such solids taken singly as the cube, the four simpler right prisms, the four simpler right pyramids, and the right cylinders and cones.

Perspective.—The perspective representation of points, lines, and planes, and of simple objects based upon the solids required for Practical Geometry above.

Model Drawing.—A linear representation of any group of three simple objects.

Teaching.—To draw from memory or otherwise examples under any of the above heads, and to teach a class satisfactorily.

PROGRAMME OF EXAMINATION FOR A CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

Linear Drawing.—An outline of a small portion of conventional ornament from a cast, or an equivalent in low relief; an analysis of the principles of composition used in the example.

Shading.—To draw, in light and shade, from a simple object of uniform colour, and to give a linear analysis of the chief shades.

Teaching.—(1) To draw from memory or otherwise simple examples under each of the above heads, and to teach a class satisfactorily. (2) To produce a class taught by the candidate for twelve months that can pass a satisfactory examination.

N.B.—Candidates for a certificate of competency must have passed the examination for a licence to teach drawing.

24. Licences to teach will be granted without examination to all teachers who passed under the Board of Education prior to 1st January, 1870, or who subsequently obtained a second division certificate from that Board; and certificates of competency to all those who passed under the former National or Denominational Board, or who hold a first division certificate from the Board of Education.

GYMNASTICS.

25. Certificates in Gymnastics will be granted upon examination in the following programme:—

- (1) *Theory of Gymnastics*, including so much anatomy and physiology as is required for explaining generally the uses of the various exercises, and the muscles and organs affected by them.
- (2) *Practice of Gymnastics*.—To perform exercises on any gymnastic apparatus, free exercises, exercises with dumb bells and rods, running and jumping. (Female candidates will not be required to perform exercises on the horizontal and parallel bars.)
- (3) *Teaching*.—To be able to teach a class satisfactorily any gymnastic exercises.

SCIENCE.

26. Certificates for each of the following subjects will be granted upon examination:—

27. Examinations will be held annually, when all teachers who hold a certificate of competency, or have passed in all the literary subjects required for that certificate, may be permitted to attend.

WHEREAS by the *Mines Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of Victoria into a mining district, and to divide any such district into any number

of divisions, and to give to such district and each of such divisions some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries of, and also again to abolish any such district and divisions, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter and vary the limits and boundaries of the Yackandandah and Buckland Divisions of the Mining District of Beechworth, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof as so altered and varied in manner following (that is to say):—

THE MOUTH OF THE RIVER MOYNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, may define the limits of and what waters shall be deemed to be and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake, and may fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used: And whereas it is expedient to vary the Proclamation dated the 11th day of December, 1876, defining the limits of and what waters shall be deemed to be and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of certain rivers, creeks, and streams therein mentioned, and fixing the distances from the mouths of the said rivers, creeks, and streams within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, so far as such Proclamation relates to the River Moyne: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the said Proclamation by defining the limits of and what waters shall be deemed to be and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of the River Moyne, and fixing the distance from the mouth of the said river within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, as follows, viz.:—From a line running north-west from the extreme westerly point of Griffith's Island to the nearest point on the main land to 400 yards seaward from the end of the Training Walls and within such walls.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTE.—During the year 1893, the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 20,060, viz., 9,288 of males and 10,772 of females. The births, which numbered 36,572, were fewer by 1,259 than those in 1892; but the deaths, which numbered 16,512, were more numerous by 661 than those in 1892.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 74,047, but the recorded departures by sea numbered 80,460, the apparent loss by excess of emigration over immigration by sea being thus 6,413. Unrecorded departures, however, estimated at 6,998, being taken into account, the actual loss is found to have been more than double this, viz., 13,411. In 1892, the excess of emigration over immigration was 12,283, so that the loss in the last two years has been 25,690.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) to the end of 1893, the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 16,251, viz., 12,615 males and 3,636 females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of 1893 would have been 1,190,273, viz., 620,680 males and 569,593 females.

In 1893, the recorded arrivals from were more numerous than the recorded departures for Tasmania by 2,047, and New South Wales by 208. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from New Zealand by 2,890, Western Australia by 2,255, the United Kingdom by 1,616, Queensland by 655, Foreign Ports by 561, South Australia by 372, and the South Seas by 319.

At the end of 1893, the estimated population of New South Wales was 1,223,370, the increase during the year being 26,320; that of Queensland was 432,298, the increase during the year being 11,001; and that of Tasmania was 154,424, the increase during the year being 1,280. The estimated populations of the other Australasian Colonies were as follow at the dates in 1893 placed against their respective names:—South Australia, exclusive of the Northern Territory (1st November), 339,892; Western Australia (30th September), 64,046; New Zealand (30th June), 660,542. These are the latest estimates which have reached this colony.

As regards the Victorian estimate, it should be stated that the figures of births and deaths in 1893, and consequently those of the population, will be slightly altered when the returns of the deputy registrars are finally examined.
