BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, at Seymour;

FRIDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MARCH NEXT, at Kingston;

TUESDAY, THE 6TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 8TH, DAYS OF MARCH NEXT, at Cobram and Strathmerton;

FRIDAY, THE 9TH, AND FRIDAY, THE 16TH, DAYS OF MARCH NEXT, at Yackandandah;

MONDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, at Casterton and Kilmore.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.
