By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. REFERRING to the grounding of the s.s. *New Guinea* on the 31st July, 1893, on an uncharted rock near the Ashburton Island, on the north-west coast of Western Australia, notice is hereby given that the existence of such reef has been verified, and is described as being about 300 feet in diameter, with 18 feet of water on it at Low Water Neap Tides, and 4 fathoms on the outer edge, gradually deepening to 7 and 8 fathoms. The reef consists of rock and hard coral, and the discoloured water on it can be plainly seen from aloft at low water. Bearings of surrounding islands from the centre of reef are as follow:—

Ashburton Island, S. 22° E. Distant 1½ miles.

**STEAM-SHIP "MASSILIA" DETAINED IN  
QUARANTINE.**

**W**HEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria, and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steamship *Massilia* is about to arrive in Victorian waters: And whereas cases of the contagious disease known as small-pox have occurred on board the said steam-ship on her voyage: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now, therefore, the said Board hereby orders and directs that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship, on arrival in Victorian waters, shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the outer anchorage, Williamstown only, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast head. And doth further direct that no person whatever nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her; nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions. And further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or persons authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer. And lastly, that any person landed from the said steam-ship at the Quarantine Station shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

**PUBLIC HEALTH.**

**SHIRE OF BULN BULN.**

BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Buln Buln, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 6, for the purpose of altering By-law No. 4, providing for the inspection and management of dairies within the Shire of Buln Buln.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Buln Buln order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this by-law being duly published in the *Government Gazette*, the following alterations be

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made in By-law No. 4, providing for the inspection and management of dairies, that is to say:—That in clause 1, after the words "a fee of," the words "Five shillings" shall be deleted and the words "One shilling" inserted instead.

BOROUGH OF KEW.

BY-LAW No. 30.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Kew, made under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Kew, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kew, do hereby order and direct as follow, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 27, made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of Kew under the *Health Act 1890*, shall be and is hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Kew.
3. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is abolished.
4. Instead thereof every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service.
5. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Borough of Kew.
6. At least once a week, or as much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the day time in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed by superheated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the council left in its place.
7. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such double-pan service as specified in this by-law and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
8. The occupier of every tenement within the Borough of Kew shall daily place in each pan in use at such tenement a quantity of a suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to efficiently deodorize and disinfect such pan and the contents thereof.
9. No person, unless authorized in writing in that behalf by the Council of the Borough of Kew, shall remove any night-soil pan or the contents thereof, and no person shall remove any such pan or the contents thereof except between the hours of Six o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of each working day.
10. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law No. 30, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF MEREDITH.

BY-LAW No. 4.

For providing for the supervision of earth-closets and cess-pits, the removal of night-soil, and its deposit at the depot to be appointed, and for the prevention of the pollution of water-courses, &c.

THE Council of the Shire of Meredith, in the colony of Victoria, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, do hereby, in the name and on behalf of the president, councillors, and ratifiers of the said Shire, make the following by-law, being By-law No. 4, that is to say:—

1. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content thereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof; and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.
2. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
3. Where any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.
4. Every contractor and his employes, and every servant of the Council, removing any pans containing night-soil from any premises in the said shire, shall convey the same to such "night-soil depot" as shall be directed or provided by the Council.

*Prevention of Pollution of Water.*

5. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.
6. No person shall empty, or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.
7. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the Council or by any one of its officers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Meredith this 20th day of November, 1893.

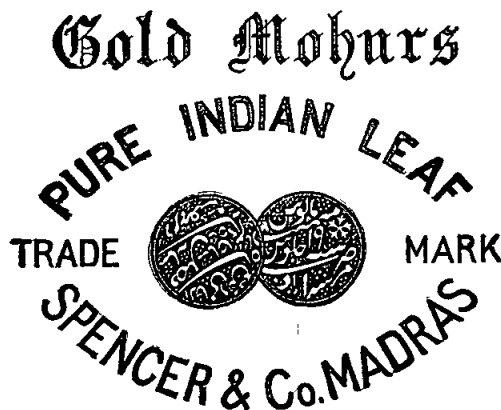

- (6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I., sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with

the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid, and dated the 3rd day of July, 1893, and also the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

CHAPTER IX.—OF SALES BY AUCTION AND CROWN GRANTS.  
(Sections 11 and 12, Land Act 1891.)

In Regulation 5 the figures "52b" are hereby substituted for the figures "52." Schedule 52 to the said Regulations is hereby rescinded, and the subjoined Schedule 52b is substituted therefor.

The fee for digging and taking away gravel within the Shire of Korong shall be Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.
