WHEREAS at about Ten a.m. on Friday, the 10th Novem-
ber last, the dead body of a male child, wrapped in a

EXHIBITION OF A GROUP FLASHING WHITE LIGHT ON STEPHENS ISLAND, WESTERN ENTRANCE TO COOK STRAIT, NEW ZEALAND.

WITH reference to preliminary notice No. 35 of 1893, issued by this Department on the 18th August last, it is hereby notified that on and after Monday, the 29th day of January, 1894, a light will be exhibited from the light-house which has been erected on Stephens Island, the position and characteristics of which are as follows:—

The light-house is situated at the northern end of Stephens Island, western entrance to Cook Strait, New Zealand.

The tower is 50 feet in height from base to top of the lantern, is built of iron, and painted white.

The light is elevated about 600 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, it will be visible at a distance of about 32 nautical miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

"Ten shillings (10s.) if such registration is effected during January, February, or March; Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) if effected during April, May, or June; Five shillings (5s.) if during July, August, or September; and Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) if during October, November, or December, in each and every year." And the words "And all registrations so effected shall expire on the 31st December in each year" be inserted at the end of the aforesaid clause.

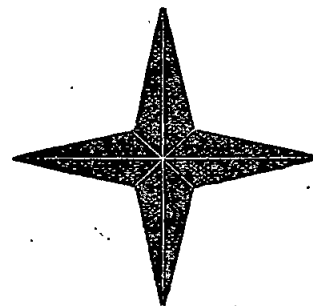

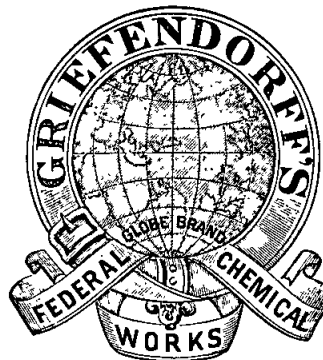

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MERTON.

WE, Duncan McIntyre, Martin Egan, Charles King, Donald Fraser, and William Drought, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Merton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first ascertained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
