CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY ISSUED BY THE MARINE BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE following copy of a Circular from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, together with copy of an Order in Council therein referred to, legalizing Certificates of Competency under the Merchant Shipping Act granted by the Marine Board of Victoria, is published for general information.

MY LORD,—My attention having been drawn by the Agent-General for Victoria to the fact that the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria, which is named in the Order in Council of the 9th May, 1891, as a body granting Certificates of Competency in the Mercantile Marine, had been superseded by the Marine Board of Victoria, I caused the matter to be brought to the notice of the Board of Trade, and I have now the honour to transmit to you the accompanying copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council legalizing the Certificates of Competency granted by the Marine Board of Victoria from and after the 21st December, 1888.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869* it is (amongst other things) enacted that where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the examination of and grant of certificates of competency to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council—

1. To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts;
2. To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order;
3. To impose such conditions and to make such regulations with respect to the said certificates, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations.

And that upon the publication in the *London Gazette* of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained shall from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order take effect as if they had been contained in the Act, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made as aforesaid:

And whereas by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1876* it is provided that Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order in Council made by Her under the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the Order in Council of the 9th day of May, 1891, Her Majesty was pleased to declare, *inter alia*, that, subject to certain exceptions, conditions, and regulations therein contained or set out in the schedule thereto, the colonial certificates of competency granted by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria, appointed by the Government of the Possession of Victoria, from and after the 4th day of January, 1870, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of British sea-going ships should be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts and subject to the conditions and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Trade, and set out in the schedules to the said recited Order in Council:

And whereas the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria was, on the 21st day of December, 1888, superseded by the Marine Board of Victoria, and such last-mentioned Board is now, by virtue of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, No. 965, and the *Marine Act 1890*, No. 1165, of the Legislature or legislative authority of Victoria, the authority authorized to grant colonial certificates of competency in that Possession:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the colonial certificates of competency granted by the Marine Board of Victoria should be of the same force as those heretofore granted by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, is hereby pleased—

To declare that the colonial certificates of competency granted by the Marine Board of Victoria from and after the 21st day of December, 1888, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of British sea-going ships shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts relating to merchant shipping, and shall be subject to the same conditions and regulations as are set out in Schedule A. to the aforesaid Order in Council of the 9th day of May, 1891.

BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

By-Law No. 22.

A By-law for permitting the hairdressers' shops within the Borough of Eaglehawk to be kept open after the hours mentioned in section 46 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*; also under section 47, for the following purposes:—For closing such shops for one afternoon in each week; for imposing penalties on any shopkeeper failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of this by-law made in pursuance thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, numbered 1091, and in pursuance of the petition presented by the hairdressers of the said borough to the Municipal Council, which petition has been certified to by the town clerk of the said borough as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class mentioned therein, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses order as follows:—

1. That it shall be lawful for all keepers of hairdressers' shops within the said borough, upon obtaining a licence so to do from the town clerk of the said borough, which licence the said town clerk is hereby empowered by the said Municipal Council to issue on its behalf, upon application made for the same, to keep their shops open every week-day evening except Wednesdays and Saturdays, and except during the months of June and July, after the hours mentioned in the said Act, and not later than Eight o'clock in the evening, and on Saturday not later than Eleven o'clock in the evening, provided that on the day immediately preceding any public holiday any such shop may be kept open until Eleven o'clock in the evening.

2. That every such shop shall be closed on the Wednesday in each week at Two o'clock in the afternoon, subject nevertheless to the said proviso.

3. That every such shop shall be closed every week-day evening except Wednesdays and Saturdays during the months of June and July in each year at Seven o'clock in the evening, subject to the aforesaid proviso.

4. Any shopkeeper failing or neglecting to close his in accordance with the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One shilling nor more than Ten pounds. Made and passed this 30th day of January, 1894, by the Council of the Borough of Eaglehawk, and confirmed by the said Council on the 27th day of February, 1894.

BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD.

By-Law No. 45.

By-law making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes, and for fixing a Scale of Charges for Water supplied by Measure.

THE Council of the Borough of Saint Arnaud doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by Part VI. of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rate for one year, from the 1st day of January, 1894, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Saint Arnaud, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of £5 and under, the annual sum of Ten shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £5 and not exceeding £10, the annual sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of Twenty shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE.

The charges for water supplied by measure for all purposes, except in cases of special agreement with the council, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the council for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 5,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 7,500 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons.

For every additional half acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of market gardens shall be as follows:—

One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 10,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 15,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons.

For every additional half acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of livery, bait, and coaching stables, shall be as follows:—

(a) For each stall not exceeding ten, per annum, 1,750 gallons.

(b) For each stall above the first ten, and not exceeding twenty, per annum, 1,000 gallons.

(c) For each additional stall above twenty, per annum, 750 gallons. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 1,000 gallons for every 1,000 bricks or fractional part thereof, and 500 gallons for every cubic yard of concrete or fractional part thereof, used in the construction of the building or of the appurtenances thereto.

For manufacturing purposes, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, where water is so supplied by measure, shall be the quantity for which the charge at two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of 4d. in the £1 of valuation for the lands and tenements used for such manufacturing purposes. And the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the said borough in which such lands or tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of this section of this By-law.

The rates and charges for water supplied by measure under special agreement with the council shall be payable as agreed upon.

The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance as from the 1st day of January, 1894.

In the construction of this By-law, the word "Council" shall mean the Borough Council of Saint Arnaud.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Council of the Borough of Saint Arnaud, on the 19th day of February, 1894, and shall take effect from the 1st day of January, 1894.
