**WILFUL MURDER.**  
**FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.**

**WHEREAS** on the morning of Wednesday, the 28th February last, between the hours of Twelve and One o'clock, a disturbance took place at the corner of Victoria and Elizabeth streets, Melbourne, during which a man named Peter Petersen interfered with the object of protecting a female who was engaged in a quarrel with a man unknown: And whereas the unknown man drew a pocket-knife and stabbed the said Peter Petersen in the breast, thereby causing his subsequent death on the 9th March last: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the man who committed the deed.

2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

**KYNETON SHIRE.**

**I**N pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—  
The petitioners purport to be at least one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the Shire of Kyneton.

Petitioners state that they are desirous that the Shire of Kyneton should be re-subdivided into six (6) ridings, to be named as follows:—

Kyneton West Riding.  
Kyneton East Riding.  
Carlsruhe Riding.  
Lauriston and Edgecombe Riding.  
Tylden Riding.  
Trentham Riding.

**SHIRES OF EUROA AND BENALLA.**

**PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREAS AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.**

**I**N pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the ratepayers in the respective portions of the Shires of Euroa and Benalla which are described in their petition, and they desire that the areas so described may be severed from the Shires of Euroa and Benalla respectively, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Violet Town."

Area described in petition:—All that portion of the municipal area of the Shire of Euroa, being the subdivisions or parts of them of Wills, Caniambo, Gowangardie, Tamleugh, Shadford, Marraweeney, Strathbogie, Lima, Boho, and part of the subdivision of Balmattum: Commencing at Nalinga, on the Broken River, at the boundary line between the Shires of Euroa and Benalla, and bounded on the north by Broken River, running westerly to north-west corner of allotment 35, subdivision of Caniambo, which is part of Mr. Thomas Graham's land; thence south following the boundary between Caniambo and Kialla and the boundary between Tamleugh and Karramonus as far as the main road between Violet Town and Miecpoll; thence easterly along the said main road to the north-east corner of A. Godden's land; thence south following the road through the land of Mr. Charles Koyan and Charles Ewart and that of Mr. A. Fullerton and Henry Estall to a point where the roads join on the north-western boundary of Mr. W. W. Casement's land; thence south-westerly along the said W. W. Casement's land to the south-west corner; thence south-easterly following the road in a straight line across the railway to a point where the roads join on the eastern boundary of allotment 96c, Balmattum, of Mr. J. Gall's land; thence south-westerly along the boundary of the said allotment, and following the road through Mr. Collier Gall's land, then along the southern boundary of Miss Jessie Gall's land, and to a point on the southern boundary of Mr. Thos. Gall's land; thence south-westerly to the north-west corner of Mr. James Willis's land; thence south-easterly along the southern boundary of Mr. Thomas Deane's land and Mr. William Deane's land; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Elizabeth A. Trimbel's land and between the land of Mr. George McCombe and that of Mr. J. McCombe; thence further south between the land of E. P. Farris and that of Mr. H. Robinson, and following the road through the land of Mary Farris; thence east along the southern boundary of Mr. Henry Robinson's, Mr. James Wickliffe's, and Mr. James Mackrell's land; thence south-westerly to the north-east corner of Mr. R. Jaffer's land; thence east through Mr. W. Steen's land, along the southern boundary of the lands of Messrs. J. Whitfield, P. H. L. Jackson, W. Gerrard, H. H. Jackson, James Walker, and through Mr. W. Nagel's land to a point on the western boundary; thence south-easterly along the eastern border of Mr. Wm. Walker's land to the north-eastern corner of Mr. Charles Parker's land; thence northerly following the boundary line between the Shires of Euroa and Benalla back to the commencing point at Nalinga. And also all that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Benalla, being the subdivision of Uptopotpon and part of the subdivision of Warrenbayne: Commencing at Nalinga, at the north-western corner of the Benalla Shire, and bounded on the north by the Broken River, running east as far as the north-east corner of the said subdivision of Uptopotpon; thence south along the eastern boundary of the said division of Uptopotpon to the south-east corner of the said subdivision; thence east at right angles to the last line to the north-east corner of allotment 46A, in the said subdivision of Warrenbayne; thence south along the road at right angles to the last line to the south-east corner of G. Chesterfield's land; thence east at right angles to the last line as far as the junction of the roads on the southern boundary (near the south-west corner) of Mr. M. Henry's land; thence south-easterly along the road to the west corner of the Warrenbayne pre-emptive right; thence south to the southern boundary of Mr. S. J. Boucher's land on the boundary line between the Shires of Benalla and Euroa; thence west and north following the boundary line between the Euroa and Benalla Shires to the commencing point at Nalinga.

Petitioners state that Violet Town, which is becoming a place of considerable importance, is twelve and a half miles from Euroa, the head-quarters of the Euroa Shire, and they find that the town cannot get such an amount of attention and supervision as such a town and its neighbourhood require. That the same difficulty occurs with regard to the area proposed to be severed within the Benalla Shire, principally owing to the impracticable nature of the country preventing any direct road to Benalla being made; that they consider they do not obtain a proportionate expenditure for the rates they pay, nor do they receive a fair share of the services of the shire officers, &c.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said areas and constitute them a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Violet Town," such municipality to be subdivided into three ridings.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Woorayl, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Woorayl and annexed to the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

Area described in petition:—Commencing at a point at the extreme northern end of the road known as the Kardella-road, where it forms a junction with the road known as the two-chain road, at the centre thereof, at a point situate at a distance of about ten chains and a half (10½) to the east of the north-west angle of allotment No. 49A, in the parish of Korumburra; thence south by the centre of the line of the said Kardella-road to the centre of the Great Southern line of railway at Kardella; thence by the centre of said railway line westerly to the western boundary of allotment 32, in the parish of Korumburra; thence north by the western boundaries of allotments Nos. 32, 37, and 41, in the parish of Korumburra, to the centre of the before-mentioned two-chain road; thence easterly by the centre of the said two-chain road to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that they are desirous that the Shire of Colac should be re-subdivided into three (3) ridings, to be named as follows:—

Forest Riding.  
East Riding.  
West Riding.

The petitioners state that the subdivision of the shire as now in force is unfair and unequal, and although the scheme proposed will not remove the whole of the disabilities under which the ratepayers in the present Corangamite Riding labour, believe it would be a fair way out of the difficulty, and acceptable to a majority of the ratepayers of the shire; that for a long time past the population, the value of rateable property, and the number of ratepayers of the Corangamite Riding has exceeded those of the other two ridings together; that the revenue contributed by the said riding is nearly three-fifths of the revenue of the whole shire; that for many years the construction and maintenance of main roads have been made a first charge on the revenue of the whole shire, and in that expenditure the Corangamite Riding has had the smallest share; that they consider the forest portion of shire entitled to be formed into a separate riding, the representatives of which would be better able to understand its wants than councillors residing in the northern part of the ridings of Corangamite and Beac, &c.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the shire as desired.

## Section 125 of Act 1098.

The estimated population of Greater Melbourne at the end of 1893 was 444,832, as compared with 474,810 at the same period of the previous year. There was thus a decrease of 29,978, or about 6 per cent. As there was a gain of 7,533 by excess of births over deaths, as many as 37,511 persons, or 8 per cent., must have left the metropolitan district during the year.

According to the estimates of the Municipal authorities, the population fell off in 1893, as compared with 1892, in all the sub-districts except Brunswick, Oakleigh, Caulfield, Malvern, Boroondara, and Preston. The following table shows the population of each sub-district at the two periods, and the amounts of increase or decrease during the twelve months:—

In the year 1893, the registered births exceeded the registered deaths in Greater Melbourne by 97 per cent., but excluding the births and deaths which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., the excess of the former over the latter was 125 per cent.

In 154 instances twins, and in two instances triplets, were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 15,338, the confinements must have numbered 15,180. Thus one mother in 97 gave birth to more than one infant.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1893 numbered 1,255, or 208 less than in 1892. Nearly a third of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 12, which proportion was the same as in the previous year.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1893. Births and deaths in hospitals, asylums, &c., are excluded and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate being placed first and the rest in succession:—

In calculating the rates for the above table, the births and deaths occurring in hospitals, asylums, &c., have been excluded as already stated. If these should be included, the proportion per 1,000 of the mean population of Greater Melbourne would be—births, 33.55; deaths, 17.07.

According to the table, the birth-rate is lower in Melbourne City than in any other sub-district, and the death-rate in that city is also somewhat below the average.

In view of their open and apparently healthy positions, the high death-rates in Oakleigh and Footscray will, no doubt, excite surprise; as will also the low birth-rate in St. Kilda, a town in which the preponderance of females over males was found at the last census to be greater than in any other part of Victoria.

In consequence of the excessive mortality which attends the period of infancy, high death-rates are usually concurrent with high birth-rates. This is especially noticeable in the case of Oakleigh, Footscray, Northcote, and Brunswick.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, there was an average of about 27 persons to the acre at the end of 1893, but the density of the population varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from nearly 37 persons to the acre in North Melbourne Town, to 1 person to the acre in Coburg, and less than 1 to the acre in Boroondara, Oakleigh, Preston, and the detached portions of shires. The following table shows the area of, and density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

It should be remarked that in some of the sub-districts extensive parks, gardens, and other public reserves exist, so that the population is really living in closer proximity than the figures indicate. Melbourne City contains 1,723 acres of such reserves; detached portions of shires, 782 acres; Kew, 634 acres; South Melbourne, 482 acres; Williamstown, 446 acres; Flemington and Kensington, 307 acres; St. Kilda, 250 acres; Richmond, 190 acres; Brighton, 167 acres; Port Melbourne, 80 acres; Essendon, 65 acres; Footscray, 46 acres; Fitzroy, 41 acres; and smaller areas in the other municipalities.

The births in Greater Melbourne during 1893 were fewer than in the five years immediately preceding, but were more numerous than in any prior year; their proportion to the population was lower than in any of the previous nine years.

A remarkably low mortality prevailed in 1892 and 1893. The deaths were fewer in those years than in any others since 1886, whilst the proportions of deaths to the population were much lower than in any other year named in the table.

The proportions by which the births exceeded the deaths was higher in 1893 than in any previous year, except 1892. All the figures in this table relating to births and deaths include those which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., which accommodate large numbers of persons coming from country districts. Should these be eliminated, the number of births would be somewhat less and that of deaths would be considerably less, whilst the excess of births over deaths would be very much higher.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year 1893 was 105.5° on the 2nd March; and the lowest was 31.0° on the 28th July. The mean temperature of the year (57.9°) was slightly above the average of the decade. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.8°) took place on the 10th December, and the least range (4°) on the 2nd August. The mean daily range was 16.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.556 inches on the 11th August, and the lowest was 29.273 inches on the 12th November. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.88 inches) was about the average. Rain fell on 140 days, and the amount of rainfall was 26.81 inches, the latter being .96 of an inch above the average. The number of days in which fog occurred was 9.

Of the births registered in Greater Melbourne during 1893, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. were of females. Of the deaths during the year, 55 per cent. were of males, and 45 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 41 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 38 per cent. in 1892, 40 per cent. in 1891, 39 per cent. in 1890, 44 per cent. in 1889, 42 per cent. in 1888 and 1887, 41 per cent. in 1886, 35 per cent. in 1885, 41 per cent. in 1884, 36 per cent. in 1883, 40 per cent. in 1882, and 38 per cent. in 1881.

The deaths of 2,210 infants under 1 year of age occurred in Greater Melbourne during 1893, the proportion being 14.41 to every 100 births. This was the third lowest infantile death-rate that has occurred in the district during the last twenty-one years, the highest being 19.43 in 1889, and the lowest 12.86 in 1892. The corresponding proportion in 1891 was 15.88; in 1890, 14.40; in 1888, 17.18; in 1887, 17.51; and in 1886, 17.84. In the twenty years ended with 1892, the mean proportion to every 100 infants born of those who died before completing their first year of life was 16.64.

The deaths of 497 persons, viz., 264 males and 233 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards occurred during 1893, or 15 more than in the previous year. Of these, 246 were between 75 and 80, 153 between 80 and 85, 65 between 85 and 90, 25 between 90 and 95, 7 between 95 and 100, and 1 at 102. The number is 1,402 in all, which figures, compared with the total deaths (7,805), furnish a proportion of 18 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 5·6 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1893 ended his days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol.

According to the experience of the ten years named, the general mortality and the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases are greatest from November to April, the worst months being December and January; the mortality from typhoid fever is greatest from January to June, the worst months being February, March, and April; and the mortality from diphtheria and croup is greatest from April to September, the worst month being May. It will be noticed that the last-mentioned complaints are the only ones named which appear to be more destructive in winter than in summer.

It will be noticed that the birth-rate was higher in Melbourne than in Sydney, Brisbane, Adelaide, or Wellington, but lower than in Perth or Hobart; that the death-rate in Melbourne was lower than in Adelaide, Perth, or Hobart, but higher than in any of the other cities; and that the proportion of excess of births over deaths was lower in Melbourne than in any, except Adelaide, Perth, and Hobart.

It should be mentioned that the death-rate of Melbourne is much swelled by the large number of country residents who are admitted to and die in the Metropolitan hospitals. In some of the other colonies it is the custom to eliminate such entries, and it is probable that in Melbourne such deaths bear a higher proportion to the total number of deaths recorded than they do in any of the other cities named.

Singapore, New Harbor.—Entry of foreign men-of-war.

INFORMATION has been received from the Colonial Secretary, at Singapore, that all restrictions upon the entry of foreign transports and of men-of-war into the New Harbor, Singapore, have been withdrawn by the instructions of Her Majesty's Government. The only case in which the entry of a foreign ship of war or transport is likely to be prohibited in time of peace is where no room is available, having regard to the general convenience of the Port.

It will not be necessary in future to apply for permission for the entry of a man-of-war or transport into New Harbor.

Lombok Island, West Coast.—Unsuccessful search for reported sunken reef.

NARRACAN AND WOORAYL RE-DEFINED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment: and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of the East Riding of the Shire of Woorayl, and of portion of the East and of portion of the West Ridings of the Shire of Narracan, praying that such East Riding of the Shire of Woorayl and such portions of the East and West Ridings of the Shire of Narracan may be severed from the said shires respectively and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Mirboo: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Mirboo, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shires of Woorayl and Narracan and of the East and West Ridings of the Shire of Narracan as respectively reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth hereby further order that the Council of the said newly-constituted Shire of Mirboo shall consist of six members, and that the said new shire shall not be subdivided at present:—

SHIRE OF MIRBOO CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.
