EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 29th of January, 1894, for giving effect to the Treaty between Her Majesty and the President of the Argentine Republic, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, signed at Buenos Ayres on the 22nd of May, 1889, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Buenos Ayres on the 15th of December, 1893.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.—ARGENTINE REPUBLIC EXTRADITION.

Osborne House, Isle of Wight, 29th January, 1894.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 29th day of January, 1894.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

No. 61.—APRIL 20, 1894.—1.

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 17th day of November, 1888, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the 22nd day of May, 1889, between Her Majesty and the President of the Argentine Republic, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and His Excellency the President of the Argentine Republic, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty (that is to say):—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Her Chargé d'Affaires *ad interim* Mr. George Jenner;

And His Excellency the President of the Argentine Republic, His Excellency Doctor Don Norberto Quiro Costa, Secretary of State for the Department of Foreign Affairs;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II., committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Carnal knowledge or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under sixteen years of age, if the evidence produced justifies committal for those crimes according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties.
6. Indecent assault.
7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child-stealing.
8. Abduction.
9. Bigamy.
10. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
11. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
12. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
13. Perjury or subornation of perjury.
14. Arson.
15. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.
16. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, punishable with imprisonment for not less than one year by any law for the time being in force.

17. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained, the value thereof exceeding 1,000 dollars, or £200 sterling.

18. (a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.

(c) Forgery, or uttering what is forged.

19. Crimes against bankruptcy law.

20. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or being upon a railway.

21. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

22. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition offences, and are punishable by more than one year's imprisonment.

23. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects or citizens to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of the Argentine Republic, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of the Argentine Republic or in the United Kingdom respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or on the part of the Government of the Argentine Republic, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of the Argentine Republic or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

It shall likewise not take place when, according to the laws of either country, the maximum punishment for the offence is imprisonment for less than one year.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political nature.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered. This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

A fugitive criminal may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction: Provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be

sent as speedily as possible before a police magistrate in London. He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in the Argentine Republic as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of 30 days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime has been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

ARTICLE XII.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and Foreign Possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and Foreign Possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or Foreign Possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or Possession by the Chief Consular Officer of the Argentine Republic in such Colony or Possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of (subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or Foreign Possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty) by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and Foreign Possessions for the surrender of Argentine criminals who may take refuge within such Colonies and Foreign Possessions, on the basis, so far as the law of such Colony or Foreign Possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or Foreign Possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

The Treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of the Argentine Republic, shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Buenos Ayres as soon as possible.

In-witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.
Done at Buenos Ayres on the 22nd day of May, 1889.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at Buenos Ayres on the 15th day of December, 1893.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 9th day of February, 1894, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the Argentine Republic and of the said Treaty with the Argentine Republic.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to the Argentine Republic and to the said Treaty, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.

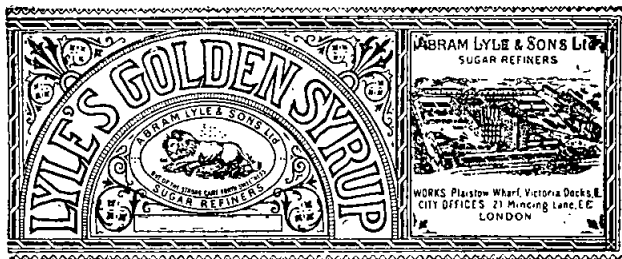

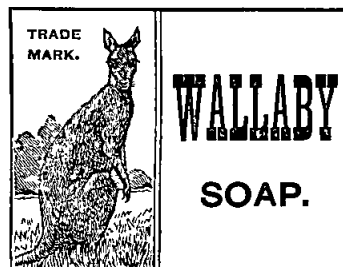

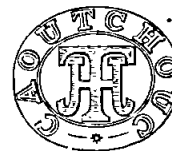

The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Lunatic Asylums at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, King-street, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, St. Kilda-road, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

Samples of the sago, soaps, rice, teas, and sugars required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, Ararat, and Ballarat can be seen at the respective lunatic asylums; and samples of the teas, sugars, soaps, and tobacco required at Geelong, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale can be seen on application to the governors of the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The prices must be expressed without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of the tender stated.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and the conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale; and the Medical Superintendent, Lunatic Asylum, Sunbury, by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received). Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for Lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for Lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

23. *Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

The births of 1,259 children, viz., 622 boys and 637 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. In the month of February, 1,057 births were registered, or 202 less than in the month under review. The births were 41 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 118 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 623, viz., 334 of males and 289 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 636, or 102 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in February by 21, but were below the average of March during the previous ten years by 145. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 190.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.83, and of deaths registered 1.40.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 93.0° on the 8th, and the lowest was 47.3° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (65.5°) was 1.6° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34.3°) took place on the 12th, and the least range (6.5°) on the 9th, the mean daily range being 18.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.127 inches on the 28th, and the lowest was 29.342 inches on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.920 inches) was a fraction of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being .88 inch. The average rainfall in March during the previous ten years was 1.63 inches, or three-quarters of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 42 per cent. to that mortality, as against 48 per cent. in March, 1893; 47 per cent. in March, 1892; 44 per cent. in March, 1891; 44 per cent. in March, 1890; 43 per cent. in March, 1889; and 44 per cent. in March, 1888.

Thirty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a clerk, aged 76, died of apoplexy; a male of no occupation, aged 76, of disease of stomach; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of tabes mesenterica; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of peritonitis; a female, aged 76, of nephritis; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a labourer and a female, each aged 78, of peritonitis; a female, aged 78, of paralysis of the bowels; a female, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of fracture of the femur; a butcher, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a farmer, aged 80,

of dysentery; a female, aged 80, of anæmia; a female, aged 80, of heart disease; a storeman, aged 81, of syncope; a female and a sea captain, aged 81 and 82 respectively, of cancer; a female, aged 83, of congestion of the brain; a gentleman, aged 85, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 86, of hernia; a stockman, aged 89, of rheumatic gout; a female, aged 89, of hepatitis; a female, aged 94, of heart failure; a gentleman, aged 76, two labourers, aged 77 and 78 respectively, a female, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a labourer, aged 83, a gentleman and a female, each aged 84, a female, aged 86, a blacksmith, aged 93, and a farmer, aged 94, of old age.

Thirty-two deaths were set down to violence during the month, of which twenty-one were ascribed to accident, four to homicide, six to suicide, and one to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A clerk, aged 16, and a labourer, aged 26, were passed over by railway trains; a boy, aged 14, a seaman, aged 48, and a female, aged 80, died of injuries consequent on falls; a jockey, aged 30, was killed by a fall in a race; a gardener, aged 58, by a tree falling on him; a female, aged 17, died of fracture of the leg; a female, aged 78, of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a female infant, aged 2, of scalds; a male infant, aged 2, of heat apoplexy; a house painter, aged 60, of plumbism; a labourer, aged 22, a bootmaker, aged 36, a cabinetmaker, aged 42, a farmer, aged 43, a driver, aged 60, and a wool classer, aged 72, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two female infants, aged 1 month and 2 hours respectively, were overlain; and a gentleman, aged 50, was suffocated in a fit. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born female infants who were smothered, and of a boilermaker, aged 30, who died of blood poisoning, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case; also of a butcher, aged 22, who was shot, a verdict of justifiable homicide being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a commission agent, aged 43, who shot himself; a bootmaker, aged 25, an engine-driver, aged 46, and a baker, aged 32, who hanged themselves; a labourer, aged 25, who threw himself from a wall; and a quarryman, aged 57, who killed himself by exploding gunpowder in his mouth. The execution was that of a labourer, aged 21, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol, for murder.

One hundred and fourteen deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—17 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 12 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 259, of which 144, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 115, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 188 were under one year of age, 46 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 364. Of these, 190, or 52 per cent., were males, and 174, or 48 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 31 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 11 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 49 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 34 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, 13 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

The deaths from miasmatic diseases which occurred in the 31 days of March exceeded those in the 28 days of February by 14. Under this head, deaths from scarlet fever rose from 2 to 3, from whooping-cough from 9 to 12, from diphtheria from 5 to 7, and from typhoid fever from 22 to 31. At the same time, deaths from diarrheal diseases increased from 21 to 25, and deaths of infants from improper feeding or want of breast milk from 5 to 8. In both February and March, the whole mortality was much below the average.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first three months of 1894 :—

No person or persons shall drive along any road within the Shire of Maldon any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity if its weight exceed four tons, and the said owner of any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity will be held responsible for any damage done to any culvert or bridge that they may cross in the Shire of Maldon, or that the same engine or roller any tender or haul over any road in the said Shire of Maldon any tender or other vehicle, if the weight of such tender or other vehicle (including its loading) exceed four tons, shall be held equally responsible for any damage they do to any culvert or bridge that they may cross in the Shire of Maldon; and should the width of tyre of such engine, tender, or other vehicle be less than eight inches the weight shall be proportionately decreased by one ton for every inch less than eight inches wide; and no traction or locomotive engine or roller, impelled by steam or electricity, shall proceed along or over any road within the said Shire of Maldon between the hours of Six o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m., unless the owner has the authority in writing of the President, for the time being, to proceed along any street or road in the shire between the hours of Six o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m., and if the permission is granted, a man must proceed before the engine with a red flag by day and a red light by night, and the engine must proceed at a slow rate of speed in the township; also in travelling along any road or street, and meeting any horse, or horse and vehicle, the engine must stop, and the man in charge of the engine must lead the horse, or horse and vehicle, past the engine.

The name and address of the owner of the engine to be printed in legible letters on some conspicuous place on the rear side of the engine.

Every person offending against this by-law shall for every such offence forfeit a sum of not less than Ten pounds sterling and not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.
