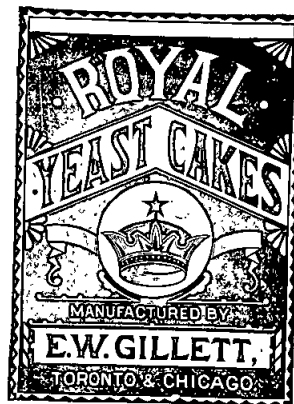

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment: and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of the North Riding of the Shire of St. Arnaud, praying that the North Riding of the said shire be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Wycheproof: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Wycheproof, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of St. Arnaud as reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth hereby further order that the Council of the said newly-constituted Shire of Wycheproof shall consist of nine members, and that the said new shire shall not be subdivided at present:—

Health Act 1890.
CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 17.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf the Council of the City of Footscray, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, do hereby make a By-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. *Carriage of night-soil.*—No person shall cart or carry with carts drawn by horses or otherwise within the boundaries of the said City of Footscray any night-soil produced within the city without the written permission of the said Council first had and obtained.

2. *Unlicensed person not to remove pans.*—No person, unless duly authorized and licensed in that behalf by the said Council, shall remove or empty any privy-pan used in or belonging to any earth-closet or privy within the said City of Footscray.

3. *Removal of pans.*—No owner or occupier of any house, building, or tenement within the said City of Footscray shall contract for the removal of any night-soil, except in accordance with the By-laws and Regulations of the Council.

4. *Penalties.*—Every person found guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law by any Justices or Court of Petty Sessions shall be liable for every such offence to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF BURKE'S FLAT COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the managers of the Burke's Flat Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent thereof in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in every year:—

For every head of large cattle, Four shillings (4s.) per annum.

For every head of small cattle, Two shillings (2s.) per annum.

Provided always that the full fee shall be paid for the half-year or any portion thereof.

4. All cattle shall be branded with the common brand at the time of registration and before being placed on the common.

5. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

6. No bull or entire horse shall be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the managers.

7. All stock depasturing on the common shall be mustered for branding at some convenient place and at such times as may be specified by the managers.

8. All unregistered stock found on the common shall be liable to be impounded without notice, provided always that seven days' notice shall be given when a muster of the stock on the common is to take place.

9. All stock depasturing on the common if not registered, branded as required, and duly paid for shall be liable to be impounded.

10. All stock depastured on the common shall be run at the owner's risk.

11. When any animal on the common is believed to be affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice to that effect from the managers or herdsman.

12. The managers shall be at liberty to remove, at the owner's expense, from the common all diseased animals after twelve (12) hours' notice to the owners thereof, and to remove, bury, or destroy at the owner's expense, after like notice, all dead carcasses found on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—

1. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter casks, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharp, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. 17. TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Noon of Friday, 25th May, 1894, for the occupation, for grazing purposes only, of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 123 of the *Land Act 1890* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under section 7 of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*, all licensees under the section for which these licences will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licences.

Conditions:

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*, except under the 123rd section thereof, under which the licence is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1890*, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence-fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the *Land Act 1890* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.
