Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the Factorica and Shops Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the WATERPROOF FACTORY OF MR. I. ISAACS, 181 RUSSELL-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of three months from the 24th April instant, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

- 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than thirteen females and four males under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
- 2. That each female and each male under the age of sixteen so employed shall be paid for the extra work she or he is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
- That none of such females nor males shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
- That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.



3. Removal of pans.—No owner or occupier of any house, building, or tenement within the said City of Footscray shall contract for the removal of any night-soil, except in accordance with the By-laws and Regulations of the Council.

4. Penalties.—Every person found guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law by any Justices or Court of Petty Sessions shall be liable for every such offence to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings. shillings

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF BURKE'S FLAT COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the managers of the Burke's Flat Common having drafted the follow-ing Regulations for the management thereof submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council :--

REGULATIONS.

In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations
the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers,
horses, mares, geldings, colts. fillies, asses, and mules; and the
words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent thereof in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in every year:—

For every head of large cattle, Four shillings (4s.) per annum.

For every head of small cattle, Two shillings (2s.) per

annum.

Provided always that the full fee shall be paid for the half-year or any portion thereof.

4. All cattle shall be branded with the common brand at the time of registration and before being placed on the common.

time of registration and before being placed on the common.

5. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.

6. No bull or entire horse shall be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the managers.

7. All stock depasturing on the common shall be mustered for branding at some convenient place and at such times as may be specified by the managers.

8. All unregistered stock found on the common shall be liable to be impounded without notice, provided always that seven days notice shall be given when a muster of the stock on the common is to take place.

9. All stock depasturing on the common in not registered, branded as required, and duly paid for shall be liable to be impounded.

10. All stock depastured on the common shall be run at the owner's risk.

11. When any animal on the common is believed to be affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall re-

11. When any animal on the common is believed to be affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice to that effect from the managers or herdsman.

12. The managers shall be at liberty to remove, at the owner's expense, from the common all diseased animals after twelve (12) hours notice to the owner's thereof, and to remove, bury, or detroy at the owner's expense, after like notice, all dead carcasses found on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
