PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service

Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in
the Banks and Currency Act 1330 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III.,
section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the
Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the
days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public
Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places
respectively specified, viz.:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND OF MAY INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday at Castlemaine and within a radius of twelve miles thereof;

THURSDAY, THE 3RD OF MAY INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Bairnsdale and Tambo, and as a Bank Holiday at Bairnsdale and Bruthen;

Wednesday, the 9th of May, instant, as a Bank Holiday at Rochester;

THURSDAY, THE 10TH OF MAY, INSTANT, as a Bank Holiday at Casterton and Merino.
