EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND LIBERIA.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 10th of March, 1894, for giving effect to the Treaty between

Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Liberia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, signed at London on the 16th of December, 1892, the ratifications of which were exchanged at London on the 31st of January, 1894.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.—EXTRADITION TREATY WITH LIBERIA.

Windsor, 10th March, 1894.

At the Court at Windsor, the 10th day of March, 1894.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870, by the Legislature of any British possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such Law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in 1886, and entitled *An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals*, provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

No. 72.—MAY 25, 1894.—1.

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the sixteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, between Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Liberia for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Excellency the President of Liberia, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, the said High Contracting Parties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, the Right Honorable Archibald Philip, Earl of Rosebery, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

His Excellency the President of Liberia, Henry Hayman, Esq., Consul-General of the Republic of Liberia in London;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

ARTICLE II.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
4. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
5. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
6. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for counterfeiting coin.
7. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged or counterfeited or altered.
8. Embezzlement or larceny.
9. Malicious injury to property, if the offence be indictable.
10. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
11. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
12. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
13. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member, or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
14. Perjury or subornation of perjury.
15. Rape.
16. Carnal knowledge or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under 16 years of age.

17. Indecent assault.
 18. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.
 19. Abduction.
 20. Child-stealing.
 21. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.
 22. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
 23. Burglary or housebreaking.
 24. Arson.
 25. Robbery with violence.
 26. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.
 27. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort.
 28. Piracy by law of nations.
 29. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.
 30. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life or to do grievous bodily harm.
 31. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.
 32. Dealing in slaves in such a manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.
- Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the British Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Liberian Government, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the British Government, or if the person claimed on the part of the Liberian Government, should be under examination, or is undergoing sentence under a conviction for any other crime within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal, or on expiration of his sentence, or otherwise.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made in the following manner:—

Application on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty's Government for the surrender of a fugitive criminal in Liberia shall be made by Her Majesty's Consul at Monrovia.

Application on behalf of the Liberian Government for the surrender of a fugitive criminal in the United Kingdom shall be made by the Diplomatic Representative of Liberia in London, or in the absence of such Representative, by the Consul-General for Liberia in London.

The requisition for the extradition of the accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

If the fugitive has been arrested in the British dominions he shall forthwith be brought before a competent magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the British dominions.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the British dominions shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in Liberia, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of, a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of Liberia.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of Liberia, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of Liberia.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of Liberia; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law in that part of the British dominions where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XI.

If the fugitive has been arrested in Liberia, his surrender shall be granted if, upon examination by a competent authority, it appears that the documents furnished by the British Government contain sufficient *prima facie* evidence to justify the extradition.

The authorities of Liberia shall admit as valid evidence records drawn up by the British authorities of the depositions of witnesses, or copies thereof, and records of conviction, or other judicial documents, or copies thereof, provided that the said documents be signed or authenticated by an authority whose competence shall be certified by the seal of a Minister of State of Her Britannic Majesty.

ARTICLE XII.

The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime has been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to. The fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within three months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such Colony or possession as a Consular officer of Liberia, or if there is no such Consular officer in the Colony, by the Diplomatic Representative of Liberia in London, or in his absence by the Liberian Consul-General.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Liberia who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done at London the sixteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at London on the thirty-first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-third day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Liberia, and of the said Treaty with the Republic of Liberia.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to Liberia and to the said Treaty, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.

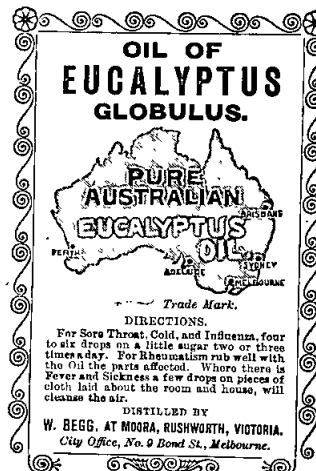

KILMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The charge for water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

For street water-troughs, Twenty shillings per year. All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

6. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

The stop-cocks to be provided on service connexions from cast-iron mains to be built up with bricks round cock, with iron box on top to be the depth of one pitcher below the service, to be covered with one pitcher level with the surface.

Galvanized iron mains.
Stop-cocks to be on footpath, bricked up with pitcher on top, level with the surface. Bricks to be built up round box and tightly rammed.

On unmade footpaths, stop-cocks to be fixed 3 feet from fence. All works to be completed to the satisfaction of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust.

7. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

8. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

9. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

11. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

12. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

14. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

15. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person

affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-lay or re-fix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

17. Before any licensed person shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Twenty shillings, and in case he shall not immediately, after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Twenty shillings shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

18. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All end of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

19. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct which, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash, or throw or cause to enter therein, any dog or other animal, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

21. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

22. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

23. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

25. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the "Kilmore Waterworks Trust."

CASTLEMAINE AND BENDIGO WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—ADDITIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IT is recommended that the Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following additional Rules, Regulations, and Orders respecting the Castlemaine and Bendigo District Water Supply, the same being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act, viz:—

1. The by-law No. 3, section (viii.), made on the 3rd day of February, 1891, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder; and in lieu thereof it is ordered that—

For water supplied from the channels to crushing mills, pyrites works, &c., the rate shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 4, 7, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—

During the first quarter of 1894 there was a loss to the population of 1,862 persons, made up of 2,498 males, less 636 females.

The registered births during the quarter numbered 8,166, and the registered deaths 4,398; thus the former exceeded the latter by 3,768, or 86 per cent. As compared with the first quarter of 1893, the births in the quarter under notice were fewer by 605, whilst the deaths were more numerous by 69.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 25,235, but the recorded and unrecorded departures (the latter being estimated) numbered 30,855. The loss by excess of departures over arrivals was thus 5,620.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 18,717, viz., 14,520 of males and 4,197 of females. Had no such allowances been made, the apparent population at the end of March would have been 1,190,861, viz., 626,071 males and 570,790 females.

During the quarter, the recorded arrivals from were more numerous than the recorded departures for New South Wales by 2,661, New Zealand by 750, and South Australia by 322. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from Western Australia by 4,340, the United Kingdom by 1,201, New Zealand by 647, Foreign Ports by 335, Queensland by 251, and the South Seas by 123.

The persons leaving Victoria for South Australia and Western Australia (the ultimate destination of most of whom was probably the latter) exceeded the persons arriving from those colonies by 1,422 in 1890, 100 in 1891, 6,259 in 1892, 2,627 in 1893, and 4,018 in the first quarter of 1894, or by 14,426 in the last four and a quarter years.
