CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA RELATING TO THE SUPPRESSION OF FALSE INDICATIONS OF ORIGIN ON GOODS.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and Roumania, relating to the suppression of false indications of origin on goods, which was signed at Bucharest on the 1st April, 1893, and of which the ratifications were exchanged on the 13th ult.

I have to call your attention to Article VI. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given to the Roumanian Government within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me as soon as possible of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA RESPECTING FALSE INDICATIONS OF ORIGIN ON GOODS.

Signed at Bucharest, March 20 [April 1], 1893.

[Ratifications exchanged at Bucharest, March 1st [13], 1894.]

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the King of Roumania, being mutually desirous of concluding a Convention relating to the suppression of false indications of origin on goods, have named as their respective Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, the Honorable Charles Hardinge, Her Britannic Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Bucharest, &c., &c., &c.;

And His Majesty the King of Roumania, M. Alexandre N. Lahovari, Grand Cross of the Royal Order of the Crown of Roumania, &c., &c., &c., His Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

All goods bearing a false indication of origin, in which one of the contracting States or a place situated in one of them shall be directly or indirectly indicated as being the country or place of origin, shall be seized on importation into either of the two States.

The seizure may also be effected in the State where the false indication of origin has been applied, or in that into which the goods bearing the false indication may have been imported.

If the legislation of either of the two States does not sanction seizure on importation, such seizure shall be replaced by prohibition of importation.

If the legislation of either of the two States does not permit seizure in the interior, such seizure shall be replaced by the remedies assured in such case to natives by the law of that State.

ARTICLE II.

The seizure shall be effected either at the request of the proper Government Department, or of an interested party, whether individual or society, in conformity with the domestic legislation of each State.

ARTICLE III.

The authorities are not bound to effect the seizure of goods in transit.

ARTICLE IV.

The present stipulations do not prevent the vendor from putting his name or address upon goods coming from a country other than that where the sale takes place; but in such case the name or address must be accompanied by a clear indication in legible characters of the country or of the place of manufacture or production.

ARTICLE V.

The tribunals of each country shall decide what appellations, on account of their generic character, do not fall within the provisions of the present Convention; regional appellations concerning the origin of products of the vine being, however, not comprised in the reserve provided for by the present Article.

ARTICLE VI.

The stipulations of the present Convention shall be applicable to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to:

India.
The Dominion of Canada.
Newfoundland.
The Cape of Good Hope.
Natal.
New South Wales.
Victoria.
Queensland.
Tasmania.
South Australia.
Western Australia.
New Zealand.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative at the Court of His Majesty the King of Roumania within one year from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

ARTICLE VII.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Bucharest as soon as possible.

It shall come into operation one month after the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the two High Contracting Parties may give notice of its intention to terminate the same.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—
