YELLOW FEVER ON BOARD THE BARQUE "CORUNNA."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of July, 1894. PRESENT:

W HEREAS by the Health Act 1830 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as may be deemed expedient upon any unforescen emergency or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion, and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the barque Corunna has arrived in Victorian waters: And whereas it appears that when the vessel was at Rio Janeiro four months ago most of her crew suffered from yellow fever, and were removed as they fell ill and treated in the local hospital ashore: And whereas there is not satisfactory evidence as to the efficiency of the disinfection processes that had been conducted on the vessel during the time of her stay at Rio Janeiro: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent as far as possible the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order direct that while the said barque is in Victorian waters she shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the outer anchorage Williamstown only, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head: And doth further direct that no person whatever of the ship's company, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said barque except only that her mails and cargo for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection and under the supervision of the Health Officer, afterwards be conveyed to shore under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that cargo, luggage, provisions, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said barque under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer, or persons authorized by

afterwards, together with their clothing fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer on duty; and, lastly, that any persons landed from the said barque at the Quarantine Station shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

And the Honorable Robert Reid, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
