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## EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication the *London Gazette*, in the Colony under your Government, a copy 11th May, 1894, of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 30th April, 1894, for giving effect to the Treaty between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Roumania, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, signed at Bucharest on the 21st of March, 1893, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Bucharest on the 13th of March, 1894.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.—EXTRADITION TREATY WITH ROUMANIA.  
Windsor, 30th April, 1894.  
At the Court at Windsor, the 30th day of April, 1894.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870, by the Legislature of any British possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such Law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in 1886, and entitled *An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals*, provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 should be suspended within

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the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Roumania for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the King of Roumania, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, the Honorable Charles Hardinge, Her Britannic Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Bucharest, &c. &c.;

And His Majesty the King of Roumania, M. Alexandre N. Lahovari, Grand Cross of His Order of the Crown of Roumania, &c. &c., His Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

### ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

### ARTICLE II.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
4. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
5. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for counterfeiting coin.
6. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering, or uttering what is forged or counterfeited or altered.
7. Embezzlement or larceny.
8. Malicious injury to property, by explosives or otherwise, if the offence be indictable.
9. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
10. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
11. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
12. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member, or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
13. Perjury or subornation of perjury.
14. Rape.
15. Carnal knowledge or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under 14 years of age.
16. Indecent assault.
17. Procuring miscarriage, administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.
18. Abduction.
19. Child-stealing.

20. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.

21. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.  
 22. Burglary or housebreaking.  
 23. Arson.  
 24. Robbery with violence.  
 25. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.  
 26. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort.  
 27. Piracy by law of nations.  
 28. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.  
 29. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life or do grievous bodily harm.  
 30. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.  
 31. Dealing in slaves.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

#### ARTICLE III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

#### ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination, or is undergoing sentence under a conviction for any other crime within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal, or on expiration of his sentence, or otherwise.

#### ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

#### ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

#### ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of the accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

#### ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

#### ARTICLE X.

If the fugitive has been arrested in the British dominions he shall forthwith be brought before a competent magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the British dominions.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the British dominions shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in Roumania, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of, a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or judicial officer of police of Roumania.
2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or judicial officer of police of Roumania, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.
3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or judicial officer of police of Roumania.
4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or of Foreign Affairs of Roumania;

but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law in that part of the British dominions where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

#### ARTICLE XI.

On the part of the Roumanian Government, the extradition shall take place as follows in Roumania:—

The Minister, or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in Roumania, shall send to the Minister for Foreign Affairs, in support of each demand for extradition, an authentic and duly legalized copy either of a certificate of condemnation or of a warrant of arrest against an incriminated or accused person, showing clearly the nature of the crime or offence on account of which proceedings are being taken against the fugitive. The judicial document so produced shall be accompanied by a description and other particulars serving to establish the identity of the person whose extradition is claimed.

In case the documents produced by the British Government to establish the identity, and the particulars gathered by the Roumanian police authorities for the same purpose, should be deemed to be insufficient, notice thereof shall forthwith be given to the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in Roumania, and the individual whose extradition is desired, if he has been arrested, shall remain in detention until the British Government has produced new elements of proof to establish his identity, or to clear up any other difficulties arising in the examination.

#### ARTICLE XII.

The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime has been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to. In Her Britannic Majesty's Dominions the fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

#### ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

#### ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such Colony or possession as a Consular officer of Roumania.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Roumania who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE XVIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Bucharest as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate at Bucharest, the twenty-first (ninth) day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

And whereas a Protocol relative to the aforesaid Treaty was signed at Bucharest on the twenty-first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

At the moment of proceeding to the signature of the Treaty of Extradition concluded this day, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and of His Majesty the King of Roumania, have agreed upon the following declaration:—

The Roumanian Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up any person charged with a crime punishable with death.

This Protocol shall have the same force and the same duration as the Treaty of Extradition signed to-day.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate at Bucharest the twenty-first (ninth) March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

And whereas a Protocol explanatory of Section twenty-one of Article II. of the aforesaid Treaty, was signed at Bucharest on the thirteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

In order to avoid the possibility of any misunderstanding arising from the present text of § 21 of Article II. of the Treaty of Extradition concluded between Great Britain and Roumania, on the 21st (9th) of March, 1893, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries, duly authorized thereto by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

The fact of having kidnapped or falsely imprisoned one or more persons will not admit of a requisition for extradition being made unless the act shall have been committed by private individuals. No such requisition can be made as against public functionaries who may have been guilty of the act in question while in the performance of their duties.

The present Protocol shall be considered as approved and sanctioned by the respective Governments without any special ratification, by the sole fact of the exchange of the ratifications of the Treaty to which it refers.

Done in duplicate at Bucharest, the thirteenth (first) day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty and Protocol of the twenty-first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, were exchanged at Bucharest on the thirteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Roumania, and of the said Treaty and Protocol of the twenty-first of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and of the Protocol of the thirteenth of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, with the King of Roumania.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to Roumania and to the said Treaty and Protocols, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.

## REMOVAL OF FLAGSTAFF AND SIGNAL-STATION, WESTPORT.

THE Westport Harbor Board notify that on the 16th, 17th, and 18th inst. the flagstaff will be in course of removal to a new site, 3,600 feet seaward of its present position, and 2,100 feet from outer end of Western Breakwater.

While the flagstaff is being removed the usual bar signals for day or night work, will be shown from a new beacon, 50 feet high, which now occupies the position of former flagstaff, and on which a temporary yard is fixed for signalling purposes.

5. Bar safe for vessels drawing 11ft 6in.: A green light under the harbor-light.
6. Bar safe for vessels drawing 14 feet: A green light over the harbor-light, and a green light under the harbor-light.
7. Fairway lights for entering the harbor: Two lights shown on beacons bearing S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., magnetic; back light white, front light green. The back beacon, 50 feet high, has a semaphore attached, which will be used when required for the guidance of vessels entering or leaving the port.

The fairway lights (white and green) and the harbor-light will be shown from dark to daylight. The fairway beacons are painted white; but back beacon has a red band across its centre.

The signals to take the bar will be shown from flagstaff. Shipmasters in command of vessels drawing over 10 feet are requested to show their draught of water when arriving outside after half-ebb; smaller draughts, when arriving at low water.

The breakwater lights remain intact—red light on west side, and green on east.

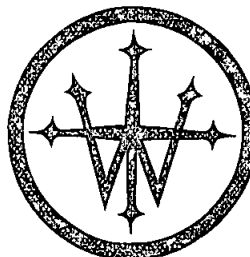

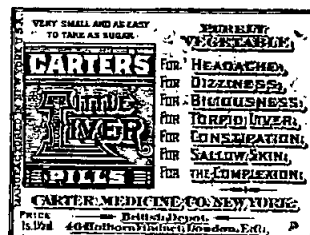

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have

obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

FITTINGS AND CONNEXIONS FOR THE DIAMOND DRILLS.

- The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labour, and also all material where not otherwise specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall, as soon as finished, deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge. The contractor shall, in every case, immediately after despatching any goods to the Department or to any of the drills, send or give notice to the officer in charge of the time of despatch, of the place where such goods have been forwarded, and the number of the order for the same; failing which being done, the contractor will be liable to have his contract cancelled without further notice, at the option of the Secretary for Mines.
- The contractor will be required to furnish, in duplicate, any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied; each account must include all the goods mentioned in the order.
- The contract will be for such articles or repairs as may be ordered from the 1st July, 1894, to 30th June, 1895. All material and workmanship in connexion with this contract are to be of the very best description, and to be to the entire satisfaction of

any officer who may be authorized by the Minister of Mines or Secretary for Mines to act on behalf of the Department of Mines in connexion with this contract, and such officer (herein designated the officer in charge) shall have full power to reject any articles he may deem to be not satisfactory or not in every way suitable.

4. When any order shall have been given to the contractor, he must use every despatch in getting the work done; if he do not, or if the work or material be not to the entire satisfaction of the officer in charge, it shall be optional with such officer in charge to cancel such order and get the work required done wherever he shall think fit, at the contractor's risk and expense; and any extra expense so incurred over the contract price will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor. The officer in charge shall be the sole judge as to whether the contractor is using all necessary despatch in getting the work done, and as to whether the work or material is of the very best description. On the contractor receiving any portion of drills, machinery, or tool for repairs or otherwise from any of the drills, or from any other source, he must, in every case, send a receipt for the same to the officer in charge.

5. When any work is required that does not appear in the Schedule, offers may be obtained in the usual way without in any way infringing this contract.

6. As soon as possible after the contract is signed, the Department will lend the gauge-taps and nuts to the contractor for fourteen days, when the contractor must return them to the Department, having first made gauge-taps and dies for his own use at his own expense. The Department will require the contractor to make standard gauges for all necessary work at his own expense. The contractor must also make duplicate gauges for his own use and at his own expense.

7. When goods shall be ordered of a size not exceeding one-quarter of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price for such goods shall not be more than that quoted in the Schedule. In cases, however, where the size required shall be more than one-quarter of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price specified in the Schedule for the next larger size will be paid to the contractor.

8. It will be competent for the Secretary for Mines on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of one month.

REGULATIONS AMENDED AND CONSOLIDATED.

**W**HEREAS by Part I. (section 142) of the *Land Act 1890* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make alterations in the Regulations made under Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, and dated the 3rd day of July, 1893, as set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

**REGULATIONS RELATING TO PART I.**

**Chapter II.—Of Survey.**

Chapter II. of the aforesaid Regulations is hereby rescinded, except as to all matters done, rights acquired, and obligations incurred thereunder, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. The boundaries of every survey district shall be defined by the Surveyor-General. Every surveyor, when making surveys, shall comply with the following requirements, that is to say:—

2. He shall use a theodolite in correct adjustment, the readings of both verniers of which must be entered in field book on taking an observation or laying out an angle; and a tape maintained at the true standard length of sixty-six feet by comparison, when in use, with a standard tape kept exclusively for such purpose, the standard itself to be compared, at intervals, with the standard recognised by the Department.

3. He shall conspicuously mark on the ground by pegs (split from sound timber and squared on top) and trenches all the boundary lines of each allotment surveyed by him, and shall distinctly blaze all trees within ten feet of such lines, and at all angles of such allotment, if a tree is available within two chains radius, remove a square foot of bark from it and grave with a chisel or scribe in the solid wood the number of the allotment or a broad arrow, the bearing and distance of number or arrow from the angle peg being carefully entered in the field book. All pegs shall be not less than two inches square and twelve inches long. Intermediate pegs and trenches shall be placed at regular intervals of ten chains along the lines on plains or flat country, but where hilly and undulating, in such position that from each peg one other peg, at least, on either side, will be visible, the distance apart not to exceed ten chains; the position of each peg to be correctly given in field notes. When the slope of ground exceeds five degrees a clinometer shall be used for correction of chainage, and all measurements reduced to the horizontal plane. All pegs shall be driven level with the ground. Corner trenches shall be fifteen links long from the corner stake, cut exactly in the direction of the several boundary lines, and the trenches at the intermediate stakes shall be five links in length, cut in the direction of the line on each side of the peg, leaving a spit twelve inches long between the trenches, thus  $\text{---}\square\text{---}$ . All such trenches shall be not less than ten inches wide and six inches deep. In places where, on account of rock, such trenches cannot be cut, the corner and intermediate pegs shall be protected by piles of stones placed around them.

4. Every allotment shall, where it is practicable, contain at least two right angles, and be quadrilateral, and shall not have a shorter depth than double its frontage except where prevented by a boundary or natural feature, nor shall any allotment be allowed to cross a road or water-course that should reasonably form a boundary. If a narrow strip of land not less than 50 links in width be left between any allotment and a water frontage, the shortest side of the allotment shall front such strip of land, and where such strip is required for a roadway it is to be not less than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains in width. If an allotment abuts on a main road, the shortest side shall face such road. The boundary lines of allotments within a defined parish shall conform to the

locally established meridian of that parish, or as nearly thereto as circumstances will permit. Any departure from these instructions will necessitate a special report to be sent in with the plan.

5. Every allotment shall, where it is practicable, be surveyed as provided for in preceding clause; and no allotment will be allowed to be surveyed in a position or in a form which would, in the event of its being held separately, cut off access to water from any Crown land, or interfere with the profitable occupation of the same.

6. The surveyor shall in all cases chain the actual boundaries of allotments, unless there be insuperable difficulties in the way, such as a wide river, lake, &c. In such cases the method observed in measuring the distance and prolonging the line should be clearly shown in the field book. Running new boundary lines by traverse will not be permitted, the principle of parallel offsets must be observed, and only where trees over two feet in diameter obstruct the true line will any departure be allowed.

7. When a creek is the boundary of an allotment, the traverse of the creek is to form part of the geometrical figure used in calculating the area, and the areas of the portions lying between the traverse lines and the creek are to be computed from the offsets and insets which must not exceed one chain.

8. In establishing a connexion with a previous survey, the most reliable line of that survey shall be adopted as a datum for bearings, and the surveyor will be careful to ascertain before adopting any line that its bearing on the ground is relatively correct with reference to adjacent lines of the survey. If no Government survey has been made in the immediate neighbourhood of the site, the surveyor shall establish a datum for his bearings, and shall connect his survey by traverse with some durably constructed signal station or large tree on or near the most remarkable feature in the vicinity.

9. The subject of the selection of roads being one of vital importance, the attention of surveyors is specially directed to the following instructions in reference thereto:—As soon as a surveyor has been assigned a division, he shall put himself in communication with the shire council or councils exercising control within his division, and request the co-operation of their engineer in selecting the best routes for leading lines of road through the unappropriated portions of the district. In the event of any shire council neglecting or refusing to comply with his request, after receiving twenty days' notice in writing, the surveyor shall proceed to select the best lines according to his own judgment; but the failure of the shire authorities to co-operate shall not relieve him from the responsibility of making proper provision for all necessary roads; and in no case shall he survey a detached selection so as to block an existing track, or in a position likely to interfere with the public convenience, or block access to back country, until he has satisfied himself as to the road requirements of the locality in these respects, and made proper provision therefor. In cases where a difference of opinion may arise between himself and the shire engineers, or where the surveyor has doubts in his own mind as to the proper course to pursue, he shall refer to the District Surveyor, and be guided by his directions. He shall also from time to time report to the District Surveyor any road which he may consider it desirable to survey, and if the District Surveyor deem it necessary, in the public interest, to traverse any track, leading feature, or permanently survey any line of road in advance of settlement, he will consult with the Surveyor-General.

10. In addition to the necessary main roads, accommodation roads leading thereto are to be provided for as required or at intervals of from a mile to a mile and a half.

11. Surveyors shall be held responsible for any inconvenience that may arise either to the public or individuals through the improper blocking of existing tracks, the omission of necessary roads, or the selection of impracticable roads where practicable ones are possible.

12. In making the permanent survey of a road, grades over 3° must be given on field notes and plan, both sides are to be marked by pegs and trenches, trees along the run side and nearest to the laid-off pegs on the other side blazed as specified for boundary lines.

13. Any previously surveyed roads, lines, blocks, or allotments that may adjoin or be contiguous to the area or allotment under survey shall be connected by tie lines with such survey, and be shown on the plan and field notes.

14. In all cases where his measurements differ from those of any previous surveys, the surveyor shall furnish a special report with reference thereto.

## FIELD NOTES, ETC.

15. Proper field notes of all surveys are to be recorded in the form of a diagram in books of a convenient size, and any correction in the entries made for practical errors are to be shown in red, with an explanatory note on the page in which it occurs; such books to be the property of the Department, and to be given up at the end of every three months. The date on which survey was commenced and completed must also be entered in the field book. Field notes must show clearly all new marks of the survey and all old ones (if any) along previously surveyed lines; also all methods of running the lines, clinometer readings, reductions of chainage, and full detail description of country, character of soil, vegetation, &c. He must also certify on the field book that his notes as recorded are the actual results of his observations and measurements on the ground. With the plan must be sent in a certified copy of the actual field notes, together with copy of the computations of the figure and its area in the usual form adopted for computation by reduction of traverse and double areas. The aforesaid instructions will be most stringently enforced, affording, as they do, the only assurance of accuracy to the Certifying Surveyor, in cases where he may not have an opportunity of making a personal check.

## PLANS.

16. The surveyor shall supply a plan of the allotment, showing all features correctly and the course within its boundaries of any stream, race, road, track, and the position of any waterhole, dam, hut, fence, garden, old gold workings, and any other information that may help to distinguish the allotment. He shall also state on the plan whether the bearings of the boundary lines have reference to the true or to the magnetic meridian, and how determined; or, if taken from an adjacent survey, the datum line adopted must be shown on the face of the plan. The scale of the plan, where the area of the allotment is 100 acres or less, shall be eight chains to one inch; where the area is over 100 acres, twenty chains to one inch, unless a larger scale be required to show distinctly the matters hereinbefore directed to be shown. All plans shall be dated, below signature, as of the day when the plan was completed, and be certified as follows:—  
"I certify that this survey has been effected and marked on the ground in accordance with regulations, and that this plan is a true and correct representation of the lines so marked."

17. Plans are to be drawn in accordance with the specimen plans prepared by the Department for the guidance of surveyors, and are to be forwarded to the Land Officer for the district on completion.

## ADJUSTMENT OF BOUNDARIES.

18. Whenever it may be necessary to adjust the boundaries of any surveyed land, the Surveyor-General shall on such adjustment certify as to the correct boundaries and area of the land or any portion or portions thereof, and for every such certificate there shall be charged such fee as the Minister may direct.

## LEASEHOLDS.—TRANSFER OF PARTS.

19. Every application for the transfer of a part of a leasehold must be lodged in the Department of Lands and Survey with the Surveyor-General, accompanied by a plan and field notes of such part, showing its position in the original leasehold and its boundaries as defined on the ground by actual survey made by a duly authorized or licensed surveyor, strictly in accordance with the Survey Regulations.

20. No transfer shall be recognised or Crown grant issued by the Department of Lands and Survey in respect of any such application unless and until the requirements of the foregoing regulations have been complied with.

21. Immediately on receipt of application with plan and field notes, the necessary checks will be applied, and, if found correct, a certified copy of plan with application will forthwith be sent to the Office of Titles.

## SURVEY FEES.

22. Whenever it shall become necessary to survey and define on the ground the boundaries of any allotment under the provisions of this Act, at the expense of an applicant, lessee, or licensee, the fee payable for the survey by such applicant, lessee, or licensee shall be in accordance with the following Schedule of Fees and Scale applicable to the class of country in which such allotment is situated; and the Surveyor-General shall determine the scale which shall apply to each district or locality of the colony.

Surveys not specified above to be the subject of special arrangement.

All previous Scales of Fees or Schedules of Prices for selection and departmental surveys are hereby superseded.

24. Whenever it shall appear to the Surveyor-General that the survey of any allotment is exceptionally difficult or expensive from its isolated position or any other cause, such extra charge as the Minister may deem fit may be imposed for the survey.

25. No survey shall be held to be a survey under the direction of the Board within the meaning of the 54th section of the *Land Act* 1890 until the Surveyor-General shall be satisfied of its accuracy, and the applicant shall be responsible for the payment of any further sum that may be required for the survey of the allotment, or for any modification of the plan thereof, where such modification is not caused by the neglect of the authorized surveyor.

26. When the right of selection is exercised over already surveyed land in any detached portions, a separate survey fee, according to scale, will be required for each portion.

27. The Land Officer shall, if a survey be ordered by the District Surveyor, notify to the applicant that on his depositing with a Receiver of Revenue the amount chargeable to him for survey, and producing or forwarding the receipt therefor to the Land Officer, an authorized surveyor will be instructed to survey the land for and on account of the applicant. Should the said charge not be paid within one month from the date of such notification, the application shall be deemed to be abandoned, and the area shall thereafter be available for selection.

28. All moneys payable on the orders of the Land Officers towards the expense of surveys shall be deposited by the applicant for the land at the Treasury, and credited to an account called the "Survey Fees Account."

29. Accounts passed against deposits placed to the credit of the "Survey Fees Account" shall be signed by the Land Officer ordering the collection of the money, or his successor in office, and shall be countersigned by the District Surveyor.

30. In any case where the whole of the fee collected shall not have been expended on the survey, the Land Officer shall report the fact to the Surveyor-General or District Surveyor immediately on certifying the surveyor's account, and such balance as may remain shall be carried to Revenue or otherwise disposed of as the Surveyor-General may direct.

31. Every surveyor, before being authorized to effect surveys for the permanent alienation or appropriation of any land under any Land Act, shall deposit with the Board of Land and Works the sum of £50 as a guarantee for the faithful discharge of his duties; and in the event of his failing to perform the duties to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General, or of his neglecting or refusing to rectify any defects or errors in his surveys when called upon to do so, the Board may, on the Surveyor-General certifying that the surveyor has failed to perform his duties to his satisfaction, forfeit such deposit, and order the whole or any part

thereof to be applied to the rectification of such defects or errors, or in satisfaction of any claim made against the Department by reason of such conduct on the part of the surveyor. In the event of a surveyor having performed his duties satisfactorily, such deposit shall be returned to him on his services being dispensed with, or on his resigning after giving reasonable notice of his wishing to be relieved.

32. The Surveyor-General shall define the limits of the division within which any authorized surveyor may be employed.

33. Every authorized surveyor may from time to time and at any time be required, by the District Surveyor or other inspecting officer, to run, in his presence, with his own men and instruments, check lines over any surveys performed by him; and in the event of any errors or defects being discovered in such surveys, he shall rectify the same at his own expense and pay cost of inspection.

34. Periodical examinations of the instruments used by authorized surveyors shall be made by the District Surveyors or such other officers as the Surveyor-General may direct, and any instrument condemned on such examination shall not be again used in the work of the Department.

35. Every authorized surveyor shall keep a record of the dates of all orders for surveys received by him, and such orders shall be executed with care and judgment according to the relative priority of their dates; and all orders must be executed with as little delay as possible.

36. If from some unavoidable cause a survey is delayed over two months, a special report from the surveyor must accompany the plan explaining the cause of delay; and the Land Officer shall furnish to the District Surveyor monthly reports of orders issued and surveys effected.

37. Every authorized surveyor shall, when so directed, at his own expense, attend Local Land Boards before which applications are heard in respect to lands he may have surveyed.

38. Every authorized surveyor shall be required to perform his duties personally as far as possible, especially as regards the field work, and in the allotment of divisions, all other things being equal, surveyors who are in a position to personally perform the duties shall have preference.

39. Any authorized surveyor employing an assistant will be held responsible for any work performed by him, and both shall certify all plans and field notes of surveys made by such assistant, who must be paid by wages, sub-contracting of every kind being disallowed.

40. If from any cause an authorized surveyor shall find himself unable to carry out his instructions, he shall immediately inform the District Surveyor or officer from whom he received his instructions.

41. Every authorized surveyor will be required to furnish any information the Lands Department may consider necessary relating to lands surveyed by him, as a part of his duties, without extra fee.

42. Any authorized or licensed surveyor who shall wilfully or from carelessness ignore the Survey Regulations, or neglect to comply with any orders or instructions he may from time to time receive from the Surveyor-General or District Surveyor relative to his duties, will be liable to be at once dispensed with; and, in addition to the penalty provided under clause 33 hereof, may be disqualified for future employment.

## THE DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1894 in respect to water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st day of August, 1894.

2nd. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of £13 10s. and under, the annual minimum sum of Ten shillings per annum.

3rd. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of £13 10s., the annual sum of Ninepence in the pound on the amount of said valuation.

4th. Warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Ninepence in the pound on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of Sixpence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing purposes to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

7th. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

8th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries, cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied to syphon-pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

10th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

11th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick, and plastering.

**REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE ARGYLE COMMON.**

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd July, 1893, the Managers of the Argyle Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months shall not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers; and sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

4. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock, and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable thereon, give a receipt for the same in the prescribed form, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such stock may depasture on the common.

5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named, on the first Tuesday in the months of February, June, and October, for the purpose of registering stock. Due notice of such attendance shall be given by the managers, by public notice issued at least two days beforehand.

6. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

7. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within two days after date for renewal of licence shall be liable to be impounded.

8. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall place their respective fire-brands on the stock depasturing in their names.

9. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock from the common.

10. All dead carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving 24 hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

11. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is affected with any such disease, he shall report the same to the managers, and shall give the owner of such stock notice, in writing, to remove them from the common.

12. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—

For every horse six months old and upwards, Eight shillings per annum.

For every head of other large cattle six months old and upwards, Four shillings per annum.

For every sheep or goat, Two shillings per annum.

Progeny (under six months old) of large cattle legally depasturing on the common, Free.

13. Whenever in these Regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 26, for regulating keeping goats within the Shire of Heidelberg, being sections 1 to 8 inclusive, Part VIII., 13th Schedule of Act No. 1112.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered, and if any person shall without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. If any goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the Council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Whenever a goat, having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district registered as aforesaid, shall be seized hereunder, the proper officer of the Council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid, which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid may, by the proper officer of the Council, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may, by the said officer, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.
