REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visa voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

POSITION OF ROCK REPORTED IN POVERTY BAY.

CAPTAIN FAIRCHILD, of the Government steamer *Hinemoa*, who has been engaged searching for rocks in Poverty Bay on which the steamers *Anglian* and *Waikora* are reported to have struck, reports that he has found a rock with 10 feet of water on it at low-water spring tides, near the position given by the masters of those vessels, and states that it is fully half-a-mile further out than anything shown on the chart, and is very dangerous, being just in the track of vessels. A red buoy has been placed on the west side of this danger.

Tua Motu bears E. ½ N., and Pah Hill N.N.E. from the rock. Bearings magnetic.

TORRES STRAIT.

Reported dangers west and south of Mulgrave Island, and reported dangers south-west of Woody Wallis Island, Endeavour Strait.

CAPTAIN MICHAEL, of the pearling schooner *Olice*, reports as follows, viz.:

That a rocky patch awash at L.W.S. exists in the following approximate position:—

Latitude	10° 6' 50" S.
Longitude	142° 3' 55" E.

Asp Rock bearing S. 32° W., distant ⅓ mile.

That there are two (2) small islets midway between Green Island and Rugged Point, Mulgrave Island, lying N.W. and S.E. from each other ⅓ mile apart, and one small islet lying ¼ mile east from Rugged Point; also, that two small rocks exist lying S. 51° E., distant ⅓ mile, and S. 42° E., distant ⅓ mile from the nearest extreme of Rugged Point, none of which appear on the charts.

That shoal water was found S.W. of Woody Wallis Island, Endeavour Strait, in the unsurveyed area, several sandy shoals, with not more than 9 feet over them, being discovered. The approximate position of two of these patches is as follows, viz.:

South extreme of Woody Wallis Island bearing N. 61° E. 2½ miles.

South extreme of Woody Wallis Island bearing N. 51° E. 1½ miles.

Mariners are hereby cautioned to exercise great care in these localities.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM SINGAPORE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place, and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria, and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid, shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act, and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of the departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid, or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And it is also enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others) and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid, shall, upon their arrival at any place in Victoria, be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats, persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine, no such persons or things shall, either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria, come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation notify that Singapore is infected with cholera, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

SMALL-POX ON BOARD THE STEAM-SHIP
"LUSITANIA."

At Government House, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of August,
1895.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as may be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion, and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship *Lusitania* has arrived in Victorian waters: And whereas a case of the contagious disease known as small-pox occurred on board the said steam-ship on her last voyage from Albany to Adelaide, as was on board until the 13th ultimo: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent as far as possible the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order direct that while the said steam-ship is in Victorian waters she shall be detained and anchored at the outer anchorage, off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head: And doth further direct that no person whatever, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer, or persons authorized by such officers, necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, lastly, that all persons landed from the said steam-ship shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE
TOWNSHIP OF KYNETON (BARKLY SQUARE)
FOR CRICKET GROUND, INFANTRY DRILL, AND
RECREATION PURPOSES.

THE Council of the Shire of Kyneton, duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve in the township of Kyneton (Barkly Square) for Cricket Ground, Infantry Drill, and Recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve shall be divided as follows, viz.:—
 - The grand stand, pavilion, members' and ladies' reserve.
 - The playing ground.
 - The remainder of the reserve.
- All persons shall be admitted to the third division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
- No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division, except on production of a ticket duly authorizing such person in that behalf.
- Every person paying for admission to the third division, or any part thereof, or to the grand stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.
- Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed therefrom, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:
 - Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
 - Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
 - Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
 - Being found in any part of the first, second, or third divisions of the reserve and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized in that behalf a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part therein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.
 - Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

8. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the third division and grand stand on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the committee of management may determine shall be as follows:—

- (a) For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket or football match or sports, such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding Sixpence.
 - (b) For admission of each person to the grand stand, such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding Five shillings.
- Provided always that the committee of management shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

9. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained any of the military forces of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria shall be allowed the free use of the reserve at any time for military exercises.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who, knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF GLYNWYLLN.

WE, Thomas Skene, Charles Frederick Procter, and James Hutchings, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of public recreation in the Town of Glynwylln, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

Special Conditions :

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st September, 1895, to 30th June, 1896.
2. The licence-fee must be paid in advance. The fee for the period from 1st September, 1895, to 30th June, 1896—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.
3. Tenders to be for so much per lot and block per annum.
4. Separate tenders must be lodged for each block.
5. Tenders to be indorsed—"Tender for Lot 1, Block 109," or "Lot 2, Block 168," or "Lot 3, Block 184," as the case may be.
6. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.
7. Tenderers must give their full name and ordinary postal address.

IN pursuance of the *Water Act 1890*, and of every other right, title, or power in anywise enabling it in that behalf, the Corporation styled "The Ballarat Water Commissioners" doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Visitors will be allowed access to the Gong Gong and Kirk's Reserves only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of each day.
2. Public conveyances or vehicles used for hire will be permitted to enter the reserve known as "Kirk's" for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, but must retire to such stand or portion of the reserve as may be set apart for such conveyances, or as may be pointed out by the caretaker or other employes of the Commissioners, and in no case, and under no pretext, will the owners or persons in charge of such vehicles be permitted to ply for hire from any other stand or place within the reserves.
3. 4. No fires shall be lighted in any part of the water reserves except in such places as are specially provided for the purpose, and in the event of injury or damage being done to the works, buildings, fences, plantations, trees, shrubs, timber, grass, or other property of the Commissioners, by or through the lighting of any fire upon any lands belonging to the Commissioners, the person or persons causing the same will be held responsible for the same.
5. No person shall wash utensils, cloths, or clothes, or throw any live or dead animal, empty bottles, tins, rubbish, refuse, debris, stones, sticks, or thing of any kind whatsoever, in or into any of the reservoirs, aqueducts, channels, creeks, or other water supply works belonging to or under the control of the Commissioners.
6. No person shall commit a nuisance or deposit offensive matter on the reserves, or do any act or thing whereby the water is or may be defiled, polluted, obstructed, or otherwise interfered with.

9. No person shall angle for fish or shoot or snare wild fowl in or upon any of the reserves, reservoirs, or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any fish or wild fowl therefrom.
10. All dogs found upon lands reserved for water supply purposes shall be liable to be destroyed.
11. No person shall remove any timber, firewood, trees, shrubs, grass, stone, gravel, sand, earth, or other material from the lands vested in or under the control of the Commissioners, or erect any dwelling, tent, booth, shed, or other structure thereon, or sell any refreshments or other commodities within the reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Commissioners.
12. No person shall enter or remain in any of the reserves or upon any of the lands under the control of the Commissioners who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
13. Each and every person who enters upon the land vested in the Commissioners does so at his or her own risk.

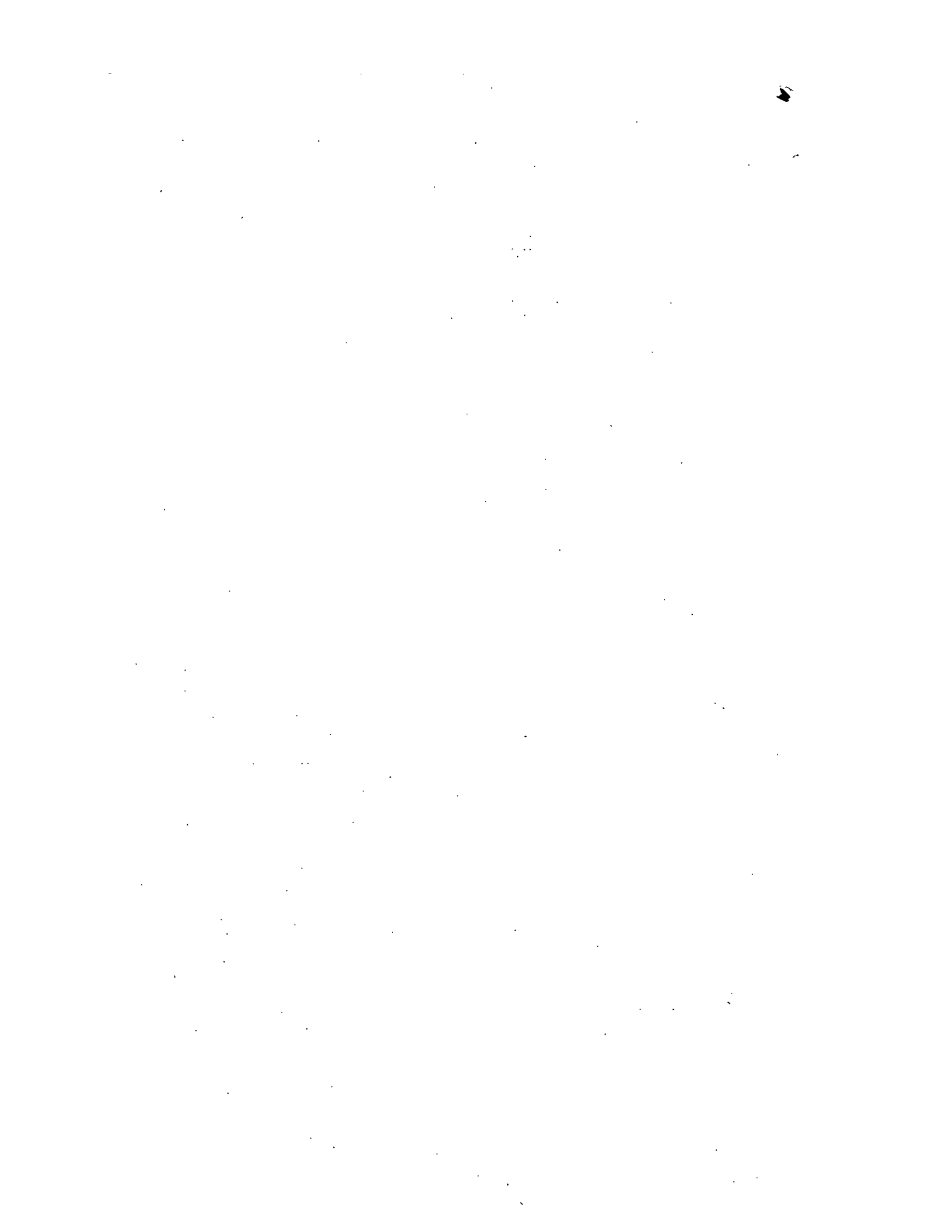
