## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to provide facilities for carrying out certain of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890* at Mildura, and for other purposes.”

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

for a period of two months from the 1st August, 1895, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than fifteen females and three males under the age of sixteen for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifteen females and three males under the age of sixteen shall not be employed for more than fifty-eight hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female and each male under the age of sixteen so employed shall be paid for overtime at the rate of time and a half.
3. That none of such females or of such males under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

**PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF WODONGA.**

By-Law No. 4.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.**

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *ex tunc* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s. Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

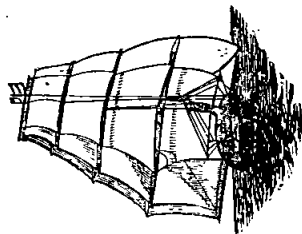

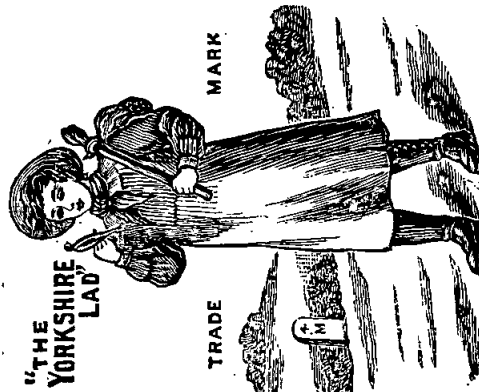

The births of 1,032 children, viz., 539 boys and 493 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. In the month of June 1,272 births were registered, or 240 more than in the month under review. The births were 262 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 283 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 621, viz., 338 of males and 283 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 411, or 66 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in June by 36; but were below the average of July during the previous ten years by 22. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 32.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.68, and of deaths registered 16.66 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.2°, on the 18th, and the lowest was 33.3°, on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (47.7°) was three tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.9°) took place on the 18th, and the least range (8.1°) on the 27th; the mean daily range was 14.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.232 inches, on the 2nd, and the lowest was 29.373 inches, on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.965 inches) was about one-ninth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.78 inches. The average rainfall in July during the previous ten years was 2.35 inches, or nearly three-fifths of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 27 per cent. to that mortality, as against 27 per cent. in July, 1894; 50 per cent. in July, 1893; 29 per cent. in July, 1892; 33 per cent. in July, 1891; 38 per cent. in July, 1890; and 37 per cent. in July, 1889.

Seventy-six deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of cancer; a male of occupation unknown, aged 75, of insanity; a minor and a female, each aged 75, of bronchitis; a gardener and a labourer, each aged 75, of pneumonia; a surgeon and a female, each aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a male of occupation unknown, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; an engine-driver, aged 76, of obstruction of the hepatic duct; a female, aged 76, of dropsy; an undertaker, aged 77, of valvular heart disease; a gentleman, aged 77, of thrombosis; an engineer and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; two females, each aged 77, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 77, of nephritis; a female, aged 77, of disease of the hip joint; a farmer, aged 78, of rheumatism;

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A driver, aged 64, was passed over by a railway train; a driver, aged 44, received a fatal fracture of the skull through having been accidentally knocked down by a cart; a house-painter, aged 36, was killed by a ladder; and a miner, aged 50, by a bucket falling on him; a salesman, aged 26, and a green-grocer, aged 34, were thrown from horses; a baker, aged 21, and a dealer, aged 32, died of injuries sustained by being thrown from carts; a seaman, aged 21, and a fire brigade superintendent, aged 41, fell into the hold of a ship; a chorus singer, aged 33, ruptured the intestines, and a female, aged 72, fractured her leg by falls; a labourer, aged 16, died of fracture of the skull, a chemist, aged 33, of the leg, and a labourer, aged 90, of the thigh, how caused not stated; a butcher, aged 38, died of a gunshot wound; two female children, each aged 4, and two others, aged 5 and 7 respectively, of burns; a bootmaker, aged 27, was drowned in the River Yarra whilst drunk; a male child, aged 1 year, was suffocated with vomited food, a male, of no occupation, aged 30, by bread, and a pipe-layer, aged 55, by gas. The suicidal death was that of a jeweller, aged 62, who drowned himself. The execution was that of a labourer, aged 21, who was hanged in the Melbourne gaol for murder.

One hundred and thirty-nine deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 19 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 8 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 11 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Deaf and Dumb Asylum, 6 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 166, of which 90, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 76, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 121 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 455. Of these, 248, or 55 per cent., were males, and 207, or 45 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 43 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 43 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 35 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 26 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, 7 were between ninety and ninety-five, 1 at 95, and 1 at the age of 100 years.

In the month under review, as compared with the previous one, there was an increase of 8 deaths under the head of zymotic diseases, 3 under dietic diseases—due to intemperance, 13 under developmental diseases, 14 under local diseases, and 6 under ill-defined or indefinite causes; but a decrease of 6 deaths under constitutional diseases, and of 3 in the number of violent deaths. The increase in the zymotic class was contributed to by whooping cough, which proved fatal in 2 cases in July as against nil in June; diphtheria, in 4 as against 2; syphilis, in 7 as against 3; and puerperal fever in 4 as against 2. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from cancer fell from 41 to 33; and those from phthisis from 71 to 68. The increased mortality of children—especially infants, took place under the diseases of premature birth and malformations, which caused 26 deaths as compared with 16 in the previous month, atrophy and debility, 18 as against 11; as well as under other heads. Under local diseases, the principal increase was in deaths from diseases of the respiratory system (chiefly bronchitis and pneumonia), which rose from 94 to 125; deaths from enteritis also rose from 9 to 16, but under most other diseases there was a decrease—deaths from diseases of the nervous system having fallen off by 5, those of special sense by 4, of heart diseases by 5, of the generative organs by 4, of parturition by 3, and of the integumentary system by 4. One death in the month under review, and one in the previous one, were ascribed to septicæmia after vaccination.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1890 to 1894, and the first seven months of 1895. It will be noticed that in the last two months the mortality from both causes was very low:—

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
