- This Order is made under the Queen's Regulation, No. 3, 1894 (Section 23).

THE recruiting of natives at the Islands of Nukulailai, Funafuti, and Nukufetau, in the Ellice Group, is prohibited until further notice, owing to the reduced population.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

Candidates must give notice, in writing; of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the oxamination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have compiled with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager,

some competent mining surveyor or engitieer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:

ts:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carrentry.

strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of viva voce or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Notk.—The number of births registered during the second quarter of 1895 was 8,756; and the number of deaths 3,725; thus the former exceeded the latter by 5,031, or 135 per cent. As compared with the corresponding quarter of 1894, the births in the quarter index in the actual loss is increased to 4,017.

The net increase of population during the quarter was 1,014, made up of a gain of 1,697 femilies, less a loss of 683 indies. The net increase was smaller by 303 than in the corresponding quarter of 1894.

Froin the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for infectored departures has been 28,291, viz., 21,975 of males and 6,316 of femiles. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,208,334, viz., 627,785 males and 580,546 femiles.

During the quarter the records show, a balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales of 1,078 persons, Tasmania of 1,041, and Foreign Ports of 382. But there was a balance in favour of emigration to Western Australia of 2,104, United Kingdom was 244 greater, but that to Western Australia 267 less, than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The 5x0dus to Western Australia has amounted since the beginning of the current year to 3,785 persons; during the year 1894 the total was 10,145.

According to official estimates, the population of New South Wales was 1,238,150, and that of Queensland 454,234, on the 30th June, 1895. In the former colony the increase of population during the last six months was estimated at 16,700, and in the latter at 9,079.

5. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty tot exceeding Tive pennds to the exceeding Ten pounds.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding £20, which the committee of management may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the committee of management may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting and hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, buildings, stands, enclosures, or erections for the time being thereon.

  6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any grass or rubbish, nor roll or throw any stones therein.

)

- 9. No person shall place in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.
- 10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.
- 11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
- 12. No person, except workinen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein, which may be inclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 13. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may, be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto or to any part thereof:—
  - . (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene
- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.
  (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or rictous manner.
  (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
  (d) Being found in any part of the first or second division of the reserve, and not producing on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized a ticket for the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place.
- such place.

  (c) Obtaining admission to any part of the first or second division of the reserve, when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
