REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visâz rocc* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

Section 125 of Act 1093.

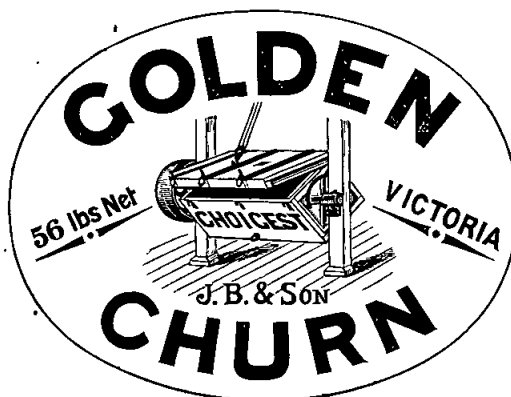

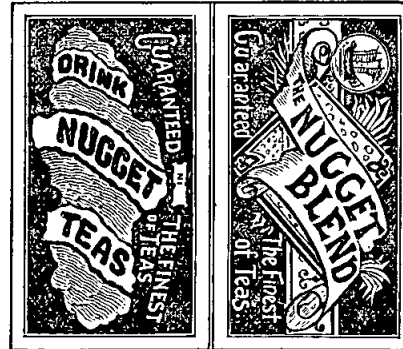

NOTE.—The number of births registered during the second quarter of 1895 was 8,756; and the number of deaths 3,725; thus the former exceeded the latter by 5,031, or 135 per cent. As compared with the corresponding quarter of 1894, the births in the quarter under notice were fewer by 22, but the deaths more numerous by 120.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 18,897, but the recorded departures by sea numbered 21,082, there being thus an apparent net loss of 2,185 by emigration. Taking unrecorded departures, estimated at 1,832; into account, however, the actual loss is increased to 4,017.

The net increase of population during the quarter was 1,014, made up of a gain of 1,697 females; less a loss of 683 males. The net increase was smaller by 303 than in the corresponding quarter of 1894.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 28,291, viz., 21,975 of males and 6,316 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,208,334, viz., 627,788 males and 580,546 females.

During the quarter the records show a balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales of 1,078 persons, Tasmania of 1,041, and Foreign Ports of 382. But there was a balance in favour of emigration to Western Australia of 2,104, United Kingdom of 1,676, Queensland of 641, New Zealand and South Seas of 192, and South Australia of 13. The loss to the United Kingdom was 244 greater, but that to Western Australia 267 less, than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The exodus to Western Australia has amounted, since the beginning of the current year to 3,785 persons; during the year 1894 the total was 10,145.

According to official estimates, the population of New South Wales was 1,288,150, and that of Queensland 454,234, on the 30th June, 1895. In the former colony the increase of population during the last six months was estimated at 16,700, and in the latter at 9,079.

 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC
RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF RUTHERGLEN.

WE, George Scott, David Hamilton, James Gill, Thomas Looney, sen., and Thomas Drenen, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Town of Rutherglen, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein; and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is composed of the two divisions mentioned hereunder, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided :—1st division, the playing ground; 2nd division, the remainder of the reserve.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the second (2nd) division of the reserve free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding fifty (50) days in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket or football matches or for sports, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the second division of the reserve. Provided always that the committee of management shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division of the reserve except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

4. Every person paying for admission to the second division of the reserve or any part thereof shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding £20, which the committee of management may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the committee of management may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting and hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, buildings, stands, enclosures, or erections for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any grass or rubbish, nor roll or throw any stones therein.

9. No person shall place in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein, which may be inclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto or to any part thereof :—

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- (d) Being found in any part of the first or second division of the reserve, and not producing on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized a ticket for the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the first or second division of the reserve, when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF TRUGANINA.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of Charles Frederick Orr, Robert Alexander Wright, Abraham Fredman, Samuel Rowley Peel, Thomas Edward Seal, John Henry Barber, Michael Wall, Henry William Bryant, George Bevis, Thomas Mason, George Thomas Chirnside, Angus McNaughton, George Missen, John Robinson, Edward McRobert, Henry Hick, Frederick Woods, and William Henry Truganowan (thereinafter designated the said trustees), and to their heirs in respect of the reserve for racing and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Truganina, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times maintained and used for racing and other purposes of public recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by a majority of the trustees, as provided in the said Crown grant: And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time, to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section. Now, therefore, the said Charles Frederick Orr, Robert Alexander Wright, Abraham Fredman, Samuel Rowley Peel, Thomas Edward Seal, John Henry Barber, Michael Wall, Henry William Bryant, George Bevis, Thomas Mason, George Thomas Chirnside, Angus

McNaughton, George Missen, John Robinsen, Edward McRobert, Henry Hick, Frederick Woods, and Henry Booker do hereby make the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve for racing and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Truganina.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, and the divisions into which the reserve with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon is parcelled out and known, are as follows:—

- (1) The lawn, the grand stands, the saddling paddock, the members' stand and carriage paddock and approaches.

Subject to the provisions of the seventh regulation, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the seventh of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders as the trustees, or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, may from time to time give as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

3. No person, except the judge and timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room except the stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club or such persons as they may invite.

4. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto, except the trustees or the stewards and committee of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, stewards, or committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

5. No person shall enter the committee stand, the committee room, or the several approaches thereto, except the trustees or the committee and stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club or their respective officers, and such other persons as the trustees and committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards may invite to do so.

6. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these regulations, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof, unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

7. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the trustees or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of such trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards to be a defaulter shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof.

8. Every member of the Williamstown Racing Club and every person paying for admission to the first, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce or (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the trustees, or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards to demand the production or surrender of the same.

9. No person shall remain upon the reserve, or any division or part thereof, except the seventh division, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

10. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stands, or any portion thereof respectively, or any booth upon the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the trustees or committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, in reference to the reserve, and the buildings and other erections thereon.

11. No person shall take any dog into the reserve, or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon.

12. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, or climb, jump over, remove, or destroy the fences or gates, or roll or throw stones or glass upon the reserve, or discharge firearms therein; nor shall fires be lighted within a hundred yards of the race-course, as defined by fences, posts, or buildings.

13.
