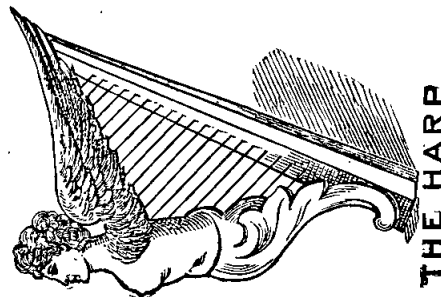

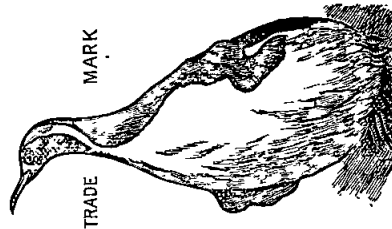

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *civd roce* or other examination in those subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

The births of 1,131 children, viz., 568 boys and 563 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. Since August, 1891, the births have fallen off considerably—more especially in August, 1894 and 1895, when the numbers were one-third fewer than in 1891. The births in the month under review, however, were absolutely the lowest recorded for the corresponding month in any previous year since 1885; and they were 262 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 285 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 618, viz., 336 of males and 282 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 513, or 83 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in July by 3, and below the average of August during the previous ten years by 35. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 46.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 30.34, and of deaths registered 16.58 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.9°, on the 24th, and the lowest was 34.9°, on the 8th. The mean temperature of the month (53.0°) was 2.1° above the average, and the highest for that month on record, the next highest being 52.6° in August, 1880. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.0°) took place on the 8th, and the least range (4.6°) on the 5th; the mean daily range was 14.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.245 inches, on the 9th, and the lowest was 29.261 inches, on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.865 inches) was about one-tenth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 17 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.81 inches. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1.66 inches, or nearly one-tenth of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed only 23 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in August, 1894; 42 per cent. in August, 1893; 29 per cent. in August, 1892; 41 per cent. in August, 1891; 41 per cent. in August, 1890; and 36 per cent. in August, 1889. The extremely low relative mortality of children in the current year, as compared with previous ones, is very striking; but is in accord with the marked falling off in the births already alluded to, which results in a reduction of the proportion of the juveniles to the whole population, more especially at the youngest ages at which the death rate is highest.

Fifty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 73, died of syncope; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; an army pensioner, a farmer, and a female, each aged 75, of bronchitis; a seaman and a female, each aged 75, of pneumonia; a shipwright, aged 76, of phthisis; a bootmaker and a female, each aged 76, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 76, of syncope; a journalist, aged 76, of heart disease; a butcher, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of fracture of the thigh; a gardener, aged 77, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of hemiplegia;

a laundress and a female, each aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a male of occupation unknown and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; a male of unstated occupation, aged 78, of apoplexy; a male of occupation unknown, aged 78, of insanity; a tinsmith, aged 78, of disease of the prostate; an organ builder, aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 80, of cancer; two gentlemen, each aged 80, of heart disease and congestion of the lungs respectively; and one, aged 82, of bronchitis; a sawyer, aged 82, of disease of the prostate; a carpenter, aged 83, of softening of the brain; a jeweller, aged 84, of apoplexy; a female, aged 84, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 85, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 85, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 85, of nephritis; a miner, aged 86, of insanity; a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a female, aged 89, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 91, of pleurisy; a female, aged 92, of Bright's disease; a stockman, aged 97, of leucocythæmia; a fisherman, aged 76, a clerk and two females, each aged 77, a female, aged 78, a surveyor, aged 79, a shipwright, a labourer, and a female, each aged 80, a labourer, aged 81, a contractor and a female, each aged 82, a gardener, aged 84, a female, aged 87, a butcher and a shepherd, each aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-seven deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 18 were ascribed to accident, 6 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jockey, aged 28, and a gentleman, aged 32, died of injuries consequent on falls from horses—the former whilst riding in a steeplechase, the latter whilst hunting; a labourer, aged 46, and a baker, aged 50, of fracture of the skull—the result of falls; a boy, aged 12, of nematic tetanus; a female, aged 76, of fracture of the thigh; a male child, aged 3, of scalds; two females, aged 3 and 69 respectively, of burns; a boy, aged 6, was drowned in a water-hole, and a female servant, aged 24, in a bath; a man, of occupation unknown, aged 35, and two labourers, aged 52 and 65 respectively, were found drowned in the River Yarra; three new-born female infants were accidentally suffocated during birth; and a saleswoman, aged 23, during a fit. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and three new-born female infants, who were suffocated; a female infant, aged 2 weeks, who was strangled; and a male child, aged 2, who was drowned—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a baker, aged 40, and a labourer, aged 45, who shot themselves; and a surveyor, aged 52, who hanged himself.

One hundred and fifty-one deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—63 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 3 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 18 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, and 6 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 142, of which 77, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 65, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 101 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 476. Of these, 259, or 54 per cent., were males, and 217, or 46 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 43 were between thirty and thirty-five, 40 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 43 were between sixty and sixty-five, 50 were between sixty-five and seventy, 45 were between seventy and seventy-five, 31 were between seventy-five and eighty, 15 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 4 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 was 97 years of age.

The mortality from zymotic diseases as a whole shows little change in the month under review as compared with the previous one; and although an increase of 13 deaths took place under the head of "Constitutional Diseases," and of 6 under the head of "Local Diseases," such increase was counterbalanced by a decrease of 13 under the head of "Developmental Diseases," and of 7 under "Ill-defined Causes." Cancer and phthisis chiefly account for the increase in the constitutional class—deaths from the former having risen from 33 in July to 37 in August, and the latter from 68 to 74. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system rose from 63 to 72, of the urinary system from 29 to 38, of parturition from 3 to 11 (an exceptionally high number), of the

locomotive system from 2 to 5; but those from diseases of the respiratory system fell from 125 to 112, and of the digestive system from 49 to 34. The lower mortality in the developmental and ill-defined classes was chiefly confined to infants and young children—deaths from premature birth having fallen from 26 to 16, and from atrophy and debility from 18 to 12. Child-birth and puerperal fever together caused 12 deaths in the month under review, as compared with 10 in April last—the highest previously recorded during the current year. During the last eight months no fewer than 58 deaths were set down to these causes, being in the proportion of 1 death of a mother to every 154 births registered in the same period, as compared with a general average in the district of 1 to every 182.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1890 to 1894, and the first eight months of 1895. It will be noticed that the mortality from both causes continues low:—

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st day of September, 1895.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10) and under, the annual minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10) the annual sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons; the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be that which, at One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps One Shilling per 1,000 gallons or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, water wheels, turbines, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

MACORNA NORTH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—GRADUATED RATE.

REGULATION No. 2.

REGULATION for the making of a graduated rate under Part III. of the *Water Act 1890* on all property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate is hereby made for the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust—

In the No. 1 Division, of Ninepence in the pound sterling,
In the No. 2 Division, of Eightpence in the pound sterling,

respectively, on the annual value of all rateable property within the said divisions of the said district of the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated.

2. Such rate is made for the year 1895, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895.

3. Such rate is made payable on the 12th day of October, 1895.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing Rating Regulation, numbered 2, was made by the Commissioners of the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, this 9th day of September, 1895.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

Tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Writing Paper," and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The supplies are to be equal in every respect to the contract sample or specification, and are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

8. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

10. The packages, cases, &c., will become the property of the Government without extra charge.

11. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item has actually been paid.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Friday, 27th September, 1895.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 1st October, 1895, to 30th June, 1896, and fee of Five shillings for Licence, must accompany each Tender.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
