MANUKAU HARBOR ENTRANCE.

THE Harbor-master at Manukau reports that the Emma Spit at the entrance to that harbor has extended to the north-north-east, and touches the line of the North Head beacons. Notice is hereby given that the wreck of the barque Thurso, the hull of which is submerged, now lies inside the entrance to the Grey River, 400 feet from the end of the North Breakwater. The stern of the wreck is in a line with the beacons for crossing the bar, and the bow about 50 feet from the North Breakwater, leaving a clear passage in river of 270 feet between the wreck and the South Breakwater.

The leading lights for crossing the bar at night will be shown on the south side of the river, near the Cattle Wharf. They lead midway between the wreck and South Breakwater, bearing W.N.W. magnetic. A bright light will be shown abreast of the wreck on the South Breakwater. The wharf beacons have been removed to the lower wharf now being constructed, and lead clear of the wreck on a bearing of W. by N. ½ N. magnetic.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VIOTORIA.

Candidates must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the proliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having compiled with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying—Connexion and reduction of beer

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of vira vece or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.





REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM.

RECREATION IN THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Horsham (thereinafter called the Borough Council), and their successors in respect of the Reserve for a Race-course and for other purposes of Public Recreation in the Borough of Horsham, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used for a Race-course and for other purposes of Public Recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Borough Council and the Board of Land and Works or their successors. And whereas by section 137 of the Land Act 1830 it is provided that, where any such land has been vested in Trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Borough of Horsham do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve for a Race-course and for other purposes of Public Recreation in the Borough of Horsham.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements; on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (is.) may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve, and a further sum not exceeding

ROYAL VICTORIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND.

INCORPORATED 1892.

THE following are the revised by-laws of the Reyal Victorian Institute for the Blind, adopted at a meeting of its subscribers, held at the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 31st July, 1895, as required by the provisions of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890, and those hitherto in force are hereby annulled.

BY-LAWS.

1. The institution shall be called The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

tute for the Blind.

Objects.

The institution shall be conducted on general Protestant principles, and its objects be to impart an education of a religious, general, and industrial character to the youthful blind of the colony of Victoria, with a view of making them good and self-supporting citizens. It, however, must be understood that it is not an asylum for the homeless, or for those unfitted to become self-supporting from either mental or physical cause, nor an hospital for the sick or infirm, and no responsibility can be undertaken by the board of management for the care of those or of such as during their course of training may become so.

3. The board of management shall determine any doubt as to the meaning or application of the by-laws or subsidiary rules should any arise.

(e) Any person who has conferred some signal benefit on the institution irrespective of contribution may be appointed by the board of management an honorary life governor, and shall be entitled to all the privileges of life governorship.

7. Every member or life governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings or special meetings of members.

8. Every yearly subscription shall be payable in advance, and every yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of the first payment, but no first payment shall entitle any member or life governor to a vote at any meeting held within one month from the date of such payment.

9. Except as hereinafter provided, all members and governors shall be eligible as members of the board of management.

#### Nominations.

16. Life governors or members willing to serve on the board of management, or gentlemen willing to perform the duties of hon. medical or other officers and auditors, shall intimate the same, in writing, to the superintendent and secretary not less than three days previous to the annual meeting of members.

17. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned in or participate in anywise in any contract with the board of management or in the profit thereof, or in work to be done under the authority of the same shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such board, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the board shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter under the consideration of the board of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds; appoint and dismiss all paid officers, frame regulations for the management of the institution, the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws; present a report to the annual meeting of members, and manage the institution generally.

19. The board of management shall meet for the transaction

The president, vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer shall be ex officio members of all committees.

#### House Committee.

21. The house committee shall, under the direction of the board of management, deal with matters of detail or urgency, and shall meet from time to time as necessity may accur. Two members shall form a quorum.

#### Finance Committee.

22. The finance committee shall consist of the treasurer for the time being, and two other members of the board; they shall meet before the monthly board meeting to examine all accounts, and recommend their payment if correct.

#### Boarding-out Committee.

Honorary Treasurer.

24. He shall have the entire management of the scholastic and domestic arrangements, and the immediate superintendence and general centrol of the entire establishment. 31. He shall arrange for the inmates to attend divine service, either at the institution or at some neighbouring church or churches, every Sunday, weather permitting.

Matron.

32. The matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave it without the consent of the superintendent, and shall attend to his directions; she shall have the superintendence of the female domestics and inmates, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part; she shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed; daily inspect all beds, and see that they are properly made and kept clean; and also superintend the proper cooking of the food.

## Assistant Secretary,

33. The assistant secretary shall in all matters act under the direction of the superintendent, and take charge of the institution in his absence. He shall keep all books and accounts, and have charge of all moneys received at the institution, which he shall bank daily to its credit.

### Liability of Officers.

34. The superintendent, and other paid officers receiving moneys, shall be required to give a policy of a guarantee society or company as security for rendering a just and true account of all moneys received by them on behalf of the institution.
