REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO RACE TELEGRAMS.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has been pleased to approve that from the 21st October, 1895, inclusive, the Regulations with regard to Race Telegrams in Victoria be as follows:—

Persons desirous of receiving information as to the first, second, and third horses in any race run on the Flemington or Caulfield Race-courses may have such information supplied them by telegram from any Telegraph Office in Victoria that may, on the day that such races are run, be open during the ordinary office hours for the receipt and delivery of telegrams.

Provided that not later than Ten a.m. on the day upon which the meeting is held notice of request to obtain such telegram be given to the Manager or Postmaster of, or other officer in, the office from which such telegram is to be issued, and at the same time the sum of Ninepence for each telegram ordered to be paid, together with any amount necessary to cover cost of portage to places outside the limits of free delivery. At offices where no messengers are employed, such telegrams must be called for by the addressees or their authorized agents.

The above arrangement only to be observed on occasions when the Postmaster-General may direct it to be carried out.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the shire as desired.

THE memorial of the undersigned, in number more than 25, and each a contributor of The Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital, and in the matter of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, Part I., humbly sheweth:—

That The Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital of Ballarat, in the colony of Victoria, was established in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and now exists.

That the said institution is established and exists to relieve the aged, infirm, disabled, and destitute, and to minister to their necessities according to the ability of the institution.

That the said institution is supported in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than £1 per annum or £20 in one donation.

That your petitioners are each of them contributors to and have paid not less than £1 per annum or £20 in one donation to the funds of the said institution.

Carriage of Liquid Ammonia on board Ship.

THE Board of Trade are advised that both the aqueous solution of ammonia and ammoniacal gas compressed into liquid form should be classed as dangerous goods, not only on account of the danger of explosion involved when they are contained in vessels not sufficiently strong to withstand the pressure which may be produced by a rise in temperature, but also on account of the highly dangerous nature of the gas.

The following precautions should be adopted when either of those liquids is carried on board ship:—

It should only be packed in iron vessels which have been carefully tested up to a pressure of 675 lbs. per square inch, and should be stored in a part of the ship beyond the influence of any heat from boilers or furnaces, and remote from the living quarters.

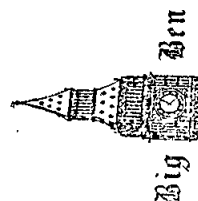

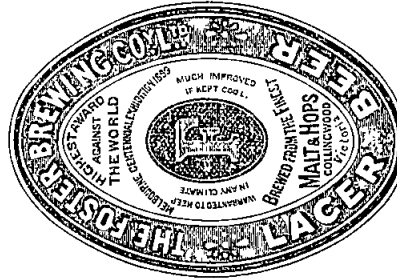

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1896, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1896.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1896.

8. Such person as the Trust may appoint for the purpose is hereby authorized to collect and recover the rate and charges made under this Regulation.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 20th January, 1891.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1895.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1896, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1896, and shall be payable the first moiety on the 1st day of January, and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1896 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds annual municipal value and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.

3. For every house or tenement above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.

10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1896, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be payable in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

REGULATION MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{8}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{3}{4}$ acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons, after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

(f) All properties through which the race runs situated above the reservoir shall be charged at the rate of three and three-quarters per centum on the amount of municipal valuation.

MADDINGLY PUBLIC CEMETERY.
RULES AND SCALE OF FEES.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Maddingly Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th June, 1859, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave, or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the Cemeteries Act, shall apply to the trustees therefor; if approved, the trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, or add to or amend a vault or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply, in writing, to the trustees for permission to do so, and, at the same time, submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars for approval; such permission shall be subject to clauses 21 and 26 of the *Cemeteries Act 1850*; and no label is to be removed from any grave without written permission of the sexton or manager.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule D, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the trustees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That any person having obtained the permission of the trustees to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall pay to the trustees 2½ per cent. on cost of such construction.
8. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased thereon.
9. That every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the order.
11. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided in the preceding rule.
12. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a registrar of deaths or a coroner; such certificate shall be delivered at the lodge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
13. That the hours fixed for burials shall be between the hours of Eight a.m. and Five p.m.
14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be punctually observed.
15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of procession after passing the entrance gate is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than a walking pace within the cemetery.
16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner. Should the owner's residence not be known, or he be out of the colony, the trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.
17. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, without the permission of the trustees, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the *Cemeteries Act* for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
18. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No bath, caen, amaru, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work, unless previously submitted to

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the inspection of the trustees, and their consent obtained. All stones, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of any tablet or other exposed stone-work.

19. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 3 inches wide shall be permitted to enter.

20. That no wooden erection shall be allowed unless approved by the trustees, who will not be responsible for any damage by fire or otherwise that may occur to wooden fences at present erected.

21. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment, either in said or any other cemetery.

22. That before any such exceptional case shall be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and in the event of the said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained; if found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

23. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision of the sexton, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

24. That unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.

25. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

26. That no smoking shall be allowed in the cemetery during funerals.

27. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

28. That no person be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

29. That the sexton shall exercise a general supervision and control under the trustees over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

30. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

31. Any person committing any breach of these rules and regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees or sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

32. Licences to grave dressers or decorators may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule C, such licences to be £5 per annum.

33. To encourage as much as possible the decorating and maintenance of graves, the trustees will undertake the responsibility of doing same with their own sexton, at moderate charges.

34. Owners of private graves may decorate their own graves either personally or by any person exclusively in their employment.

35. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept by the secretary.

36. The manager referred to in these rules means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as the sexton of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, carry out and enforce these rules, subject to the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act*; the direction of such person shall in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

And it is hereby declared that the said _____ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone according to the terms of this permission to and for the sole and separate use of the said _____ and heirs and near relations for ever. Provided always and it is hereby declared that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz.:—First—That the said piece of ground

shall be kept and used by the said and h heirs and near relations solely as a burying place, and no other use shall be made thereof. Second—That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be erected or placed on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees and their authority given for the erection thereof. Third—That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be maintained and kept up by the said and heirs and near relations in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the trustees. Fourth—That the said and heirs and near relations shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees may from time to time make, and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.

Fifth—That upon any breach of the said conditions this licence shall be liable to be forfeited and the licensee liable to the penalties provided for in the Act 54 Victoria, No. 1072.

BARNAWARTHA CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY AT BARNAWARTHA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Barnawartha Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after the publication of the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
3. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. on the previous day.
4. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.
5. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
7. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certificated copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. By the 19th section of the Act "Any person making a vault or grave, or erecting a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, grave, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, or his and their heirs or near relations for ever." Application for such permission to be made to the secretary at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for it, on payment of the charges in the schedules.
12. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug to the depth of 6 feet, but when a private or brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed at the cost of the applicant under the direction of the trustees or by some one duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in a private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
13. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
14. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair will be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owners.
15. In the construction of brick or stone graves or vaults, all materials used must be laid in cement and afterwards lined with cement and made watertight, before the coffin is deposited therein. All spaces around the coffin must be filled in with powdered charcoal, dry earth or sand, and covered by a slab of granite, slate, or iron securely cemented.

16. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, or fence, and a plan of every monument, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

17. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in the schedule.

18. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

19. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, or other erection, railing, fence, shrub, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to punishment as prescribed by the 39th section of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, 54 Vict., No. 1072.

20. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

21. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and Regulations.

THE following alterations and amendments of the By-Laws of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum, as made by the contributors thereof at the annual meeting, held on the 26th day of July, 1895, and confirmed at a special meeting of contributors, held on the 9th day of October, 1895:-

By-law No. 33.—Leave out lines 2, 3, and 4, and add:—"All bequests or contributions specially given for the purpose of endowment, or any bequests or contributions which, in the interests of the institution, it may consider should be temporarily or otherwise capitalized in or upon the following securities, or any one or more of them, viz.:—Victorian Government Debentures or Stock, the debentures of any municipality in the colony of Victoria, the debentures of the Metropolitan Board of Land and Works of the said colony, upon deposit with any banking company in the said colony at the time of deposit paying dividends on ordinary shares, upon mortgage of freehold property in the colony of Victoria showing a margin of 100 per centum over the amount to be lent, based upon a valuation made by a valuer of repute." 2830

ROYAL VICTORIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND.

INCORPORATED 1892.

THE following are the revised by-laws of the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind, adopted at a meeting of its subscribers, held at the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 31st July, 1895, as required by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, and those hitherto in force are hereby annulled.

BY-LAWS.

Title.

1. The institution shall be called The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

Objects.

2. The institution shall be conducted on general Protestant principles, and its objects be to impart an education of a religious, general, and industrial character to the youthful blind of the colony of Victoria, with a view of making them good and self-supporting citizens. It, however, must be understood that it is not an asylum for the homeless, or for those unfitted to become self-supporting from either mental or physical cause, nor an hospital for the sick or infirm, and no responsibility can be undertaken by the board of management for the care of those or of such as during their course of training may become so.

Interpretation of By-laws, &c.

3. The board of management shall determine any doubt as to the meaning or application of the by-laws or subsidiary rules should any arise.

Members and their privileges.

4. Members shall consist of annual subscribers and life governors.

5. Every subscriber of £1 or upwards yearly shall, in the year for which such subscription is paid, be a member.

6. The following shall be entitled to life governorship, viz.:—

- (a) Donors of £20 or upwards in one sum.
- (b) Honorary treasurers of any concert or entertainment given in aid of the funds of the institution, when the net profits of such concert or entertainment shall amount to £20 or upwards.
- (c) One executor or executrix of any will by which £20 or upwards is bequeathed to the funds of the institution.
- (d) The council of any city, town, borough, or shire, or any company, club, or other association contributing £20 or upwards may nominate one of its members for life governorship.
- (e) Any person who has conferred some signal benefit on the institution irrespective of contribution may be appointed by the board of management an honorary life governor, and shall be entitled to all the privileges of life governorship.

7. Every member or life governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings or special meetings of members.

8. Every yearly subscription shall be payable in advance, and every yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of the first payment, but no first payment shall entitle any member or life governor to a vote at any meeting held within one month from the date of such payment.

9. Except as hereinafter provided, all members and governors shall be eligible as members of the board of management.

Meeting of Members.

10. An annual meeting of the members of the institution shall be held in Melbourne in the month of July, of which and of its objects not less than seven days' notice shall be given in the public press. At such meeting a report of the proceedings of the previous year shall be presented, together with audited balance-sheets showing the financial condition of every department of the institution's work, and at which the board of management, honorary medical, and other officers and auditors for the ensuing year shall be elected. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the board of management, or on a requisition being made to them by not less than twenty members.

11. At annual or special meetings of members ten shall form a quorum.

Board of Management.

12. The board of management shall consist of a president two vice-presidents, an honorary treasurer, and eight members, who shall be elected from the members at the annual general meeting.

13. The honorary officers as above specified shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election. And should vacancies occur during the year the board of management shall fill such vacancies for the remainder of that year.

14. On the second Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the board of management shall go out of office (but may, nevertheless, be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. If any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand or addressed to the chairman of the board of management, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent from four consecutive meetings of the board of management, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the board of management, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, are required to go out of office.

15. The honorary oculists, medical officers, and dentists, the number of whom shall be fixed by the board of management, shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the appointment of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election. Should vacancies occur during the year, the board of management shall fill such vacancies for the remainder of the year.

Nominations.

16. Life governors or members willing to serve on the board of management, or gentlemen willing to perform the duties of honorary medical or other officers and auditors, shall intimate the same, in writing, to the superintendent and secretary not less than three days previous to the annual meeting of members.

17. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned in or participate in any way in any contract with the board of management or in the profit thereof, or in work to be done under the authority of the same shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such board, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the board shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter under the consideration of the board in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

18. The board of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds; appoint and dismiss all paid officers, frame regulations for the management of the institution, the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws; present a report to the annual meeting of members, and manage the institution generally.

19. The board of management shall meet for the transaction of business monthly. Four members of committee shall form a quorum. The meeting shall be held on the second Thursday of each month at Three o'clock p.m.

20. The board of management shall, at their first meeting after every annual meeting of the members, elect from amongst themselves a house committee of three, a finance committee of three, and a boarding-out committee of three. The president, vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all committees.

House Committee.

21. The house committee shall, under the direction of the board of management, deal with matters of detail or urgency, and shall meet from time to time as necessity may occur. Two members shall form a quorum.

Finance Committee.

22. The finance committee shall consist of the treasurer for the time being, and two other members of the board; they shall meet before the monthly board meeting to examine all accounts, and recommend their payment if correct.

Boarding-out Committee.

23. The boarding-out committee shall decide on the places of residence of the non-resident pupils or workers, and see that they are located in suitable homes and subject to good influences, visiting them and reporting to the board of management from time to time.

Honorary Treasurer.

24. The honorary treasurer shall supervise the finances of the institution, and shall cause its moneys to be deposited in such bank as the board of management may direct to the credit of the

institution. He shall pay all accounts passed by the board by cheque on the bank, which must be countersigned by the secretary. He shall also check the vouchers of such payments from time to time.

Auditors.

25. At the annual meeting in July two gentlemen, not being members of the board of management, shall be elected as auditors for the ensuing year.

26. The auditors shall make a quarterly examination of the books of the institution, and shall, at the close of the year, examine the annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual meeting of members.

Tenders for Supplies.

27. As far as possible all articles required for the use of the institution shall be supplied by contract. Tenders for supplies shall be invited at stated periods, particulars of which shall be duly recorded in the minute-book.

Superintendent and Secretary.

28. The superintendent, who shall also perform the duties of secretary, shall live in the institution, and shall not be absent except on necessary occasions. He shall have the entire management of the scholastic and domestic arrangements, and the immediate superintendence and general control of the entire establishment. He shall engage and dismiss all servants, direct and control all paid officers and teachers, and shall have power, in case of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any officer pending the decision of the board of management, and, if necessary, to employ temporary substitutes for officers thus suspended.

29. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies from the tradesmen, and shall see that they are of proper quality and quantity, and shall not permit any waste. He shall see that the buildings and grounds of the institution are kept in a state of cleanliness and order, shall have all minor repairs attended to at once, and shall inspect the food of the inmates, and see that it is properly prepared, and of good quality. He shall also superintend the industrial department, and shall keep an inventory of the property of the institution, and be held responsible for the whole.

30. He shall conduct the correspondence, clerical and financial business of the institution, and shall cause proper and detailed accounts of its business to be kept, together with such accounts and books as shall show the state of the various industrial departments, and all details relating thereto, and such other books and forms as may be from time to time required by the board of management or the development of the institution.

31. He shall arrange for the inmates to attend divine service, either at the institution or at some neighbouring church or churches, every Sunday, weather permitting.

Matron.

32. The matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave it without the consent of the superintendent, and shall attend to his directions; she shall have the superintendence of the female domestics and inmates, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part; she shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed; daily inspect all beds, and see that they are properly made and kept clean; and also superintend the proper cooking of the food.

Assistant Secretary.

33. The assistant secretary shall in all matters act under the direction of the superintendent, and take charge of the institution in his absence. He shall keep all books and accounts, and have charge of all moneys received at the institution, which he shall bank daily to its credit.

Liability of Officers.

34. The superintendent, and other paid officers receiving moneys, shall be required to give a policy of a guarantee society or company as security for rendering a just and true account of all moneys received by them on behalf of the institution. The premium of such policy to be paid by the institution.

35. No officer shall be responsible for any moneys not actually received by him, or be in any way answerable for the accounts, receipts, neglects, or defaults of any other officer.

Common Seal.

36. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the office of the superintendent, and shall be guarded by two different locks, the key of one to be kept by the honorary treasurer and the other by the superintendent, and must only be opened when both are present. It shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the board of management at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present, and shall be attested by the signature of the honorary treasurer, and countersigned by the superintendent and secretary or one of the members present, as may be directed by the board of management.

Paid Officers, Teachers, and other Employés.

37. The paid officers, teachers, &c., shall carry out such duties as may from time to time be specified in the Regulations, a copy of which shall be signed by each officer on his or her appointment, and shall obey the orders of the superintendent and report to him all cases of irregularity on the part of the inmates, and generally assist him in maintaining order and discipline in the institution.

Pupils.

38. The pupils shall consist of three classes, viz., free, assisted, and paying.

39. Applications for reception of pupils must be made on forms supplied by the institution, and no pupil may be admitted unless the said forms have been filled up to the satisfaction of the board of management and the honorary medical officers.

40. Pupils can be received only for the current year ending 31st December next after admission. In the preceding month of November in each year renewed application must be made by their parents or guardians, when they may be re-admitted for one year if approved by the board of management. Failing such application it shall be deemed that they decline the further aid of the institution.

41. No pupil shall be admitted to reside in the institution under the age of seven or over fifteen years, nor continue in residence after passing the age of seventeen years. Pupils who have been received under the age of fifteen years on leaving at seventeen years may be paid wages or boarded out, as specified in By-law No. 54, according to the length of time they have been engaged in the workshops.

42. Any pupil over the age of seventeen engaged as a teacher or employed in any capacity other than in the industrial department shall be placed on the staff of the institution, and be paid such wages as the board of management may decide.

43. Only such pupils as display special aptitude shall be trained for the purpose of entering the musical or tuning professions, and after passing the age of seventeen years they shall be boarded out at the expense of the parents or guardians; but in cases where these may be unable to defray such cost the board of management may contribute, at their discretion, for a period to be specified.

44. An approved guarantee must be given by the parents or guardians of pupils, before admission, that they will resume charge of them whenever required to do so, which guarantee must be renewed yearly on application for re-admission.

45. While in the institution pupils are to be under the absolute control of the board of management, and of their responsible officers, and be amenable to such discipline and punishment as may be considered necessary by them.

46. Pupils shall be retained only during good behaviour. Disorderly, disobedient, and unmanageable pupils, as well as those who are or may become mentally or physically deficient, must make way for those likely to be benefited by the educational course.

47. In the case of all free pupils, the parents or guardians shall make a statutory declaration to the effect that owing to the poverty of their circumstances they are quite unable to contribute anything towards their support; and that such declaration shall be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

48. In all cases of assisted inmates, the parents or guardians shall sign a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay more than the amount specified in the application papers, such declaration to be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

49. In all cases of paying pupils, parents or guardians shall give a guarantee for the quarterly payment, in advance, of the necessary fees.

50. Parents or guardians shall in all cases defray the cost of clothing pupils while resident in the institution. The board of management shall, however, purchase such clothing at a fixed charge, which must be paid each year on the admission or re-admission of pupils.

51. Any of the inmates disobeying the orders of the superintendent, matron, or other officers, or otherwise transgressing the regulations of the institution, shall be subject to punishment, to be administered by the superintendent, or under his direction, with a light cane in cases of boys under sixteen, or by seclusion for a period not to exceed eight hours in any one day in the cases of female pupils. Pupils over sixteen shall be dealt with as may be approved by the board of management, and in the event of continued misconduct—intemperance, &c.—the offender shall be dismissed.

Manufacturing Department.

52. Non-resident pupils may be received for training in the workshops between the ages of fifteen and thirty years; under exceptional circumstances, however, the board of management may receive pupils over the latter age.

53. The trades at which pupils are to be employed shall be decided by the board of management.

54. The period of training shall be five years, during which time non-resident pupils may receive an allowance at the discretion of the board of management, to partially or wholly defray the cost of board and residence, should their homes be too far away to admit of their residence there, or their parents or guardians be proved unable to defray the expense of lodgings. Such allowance shall not exceed the following amounts, viz., during the first year, 10s. per week; second year, 12s. 6d. per week; third year, 15s. per week; fourth year, piece wages and 50 per cent. bonus; fifth year, piece wages and 25 per cent. bonus.

55. After five years, workers shall be assumed to have learnt their trades, and to be able to earn a living, and may be required to leave the institution to make room for new applicants. The board of management may, however, retain them as employees at piece wages provided the demand for the institution's manufactures warrants such a course.

56. The retention of pupils or workers shall be conditional on good behaviour. Those guilty of intemperance, insubordination, failing to display sufficient energy in their work, or other misconduct, may be punished by dismissal.

57. If at any time it shall appear obvious that pupils are unsuitable for the work and incapable of acquiring a trade from whatever cause, the board of management may require them to leave the institution.

58. Any learner, journeyman, or woman engaged in the industrial department, who is able to sing or play any instrument shall, if required to, join the choir or band of the institution and attend the necessary rehearsals.

59. The places of residence of pupils or workers are to be chosen, subject to the approval of the boarding-out committee of the institution, and any projected changes of address are to be intimated to the superintendent and secretary.
