ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to amend and continue an Act intituled 'An Act to authorize the construction of the Cape Patterson and Kilcunda Junction Railway and for other purposes."
- "An Act to amend the 'Printers and Newspapers Act 1890."
- "An Act to provide for the Sale of certain Land set apart as a Site for a Mechanics' Institute at Ararat."
- "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and twenty-one thousand six hundred and seventy-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five and ninety-six."
- "An Act to constitute Irrigation Trusts within the Irrigation Colony of Mildura and to invest such Trusts with certain powers and for other purposes."
- "An Act to declare the Rates of Duties of Income Tax for the Year ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six."

SHIRE OF TAMBO.—BOUNDARIES OF SUB-DIVISIONS ADJUSTED AND RE-DEFINED.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1890 (54 Vict. No 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purpose of adjusting the conterminous boundaries of the subdivisions of the Shire of Tambo, doth hereby cancel all previously defined boundaries of

the said subdivisions respectively, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said subdivisions thereof in manner following, that

BRUTHEN RIDING.

Commencing where the main road from Bairnsdale to Bruthen crosses the Nicholson River at Sarsfield; thence northerly, easterly, and again northerly by the shire boundary to the intersection of same (the 148th meridian) with the Timbarra-road (from Ensay to Bruthen); thence south-easterly by the Timbarra-road to its intersection with the head waters of Boggy Creek, down Boggy Creek to the shire boundary at the south-west angle of the parish of Nowa Nowa South; thence south-westerly by the shire boundary to the road from Bruthen to Cunninghame; thence north-westerly by that road to its intersection with the road from Tambo Upper; thence south-westerly by the last-named road to the Tambo Kiver; thence southevely by that river to the ferry opposite Biggs' selection; thence crossing the said ferry to the road between the selections of Whelan and Wilson; thence westerly by that road to the commencing point. mencing point.

RUMBERRAH RIDING.

Commencing at a point where the shire boundary crosses Boggy Creek at the south-west corner of the parish of Nowa Nowa South; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the Bruthen Riding to the west boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary northerly, easterly, southerly, and westerly to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road will be taken to be the boundary line. MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.-RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of five per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of four per cent, on the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound

6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value or upwards, an amount equal to four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.

7. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 12,000 gallons.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the lat day of January and the lat day of July, 1896, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.
