Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the factories specified in the schedule hereunder for the periods respectively set out in the said schedule, upon the following express conditions (that is to say) :-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in such factories respectively more than the number of females, or more than the number of males under the age of sixteen (as the case may be), specified opposite the name of each such factory for more than the number of hours specified in each case in any one week, nor for more than three hours' overtime in any one day of twenty-four hours, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female, and each male under the age of sixteen, so employed shall be paid for the extra work she or he is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter in each case notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females, nor of such males under the age of sixteen, shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each such factory for the information of all concerned.

## SHIRES OF EUROA AND BENALLA.

## PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREAS AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the ratepayers in the respective portions of the Shires of Euroa and Benalla which are described in their petition, and they desire that the areas so described may be severed from the Shires of Euroa and Benalla respectively, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Violet Town."

Area described in petition:—All that portion of the municipal area of the Shire of Euroa, being the subdivisions or parts of them of Wills, Caniambo, Gowangardie, Tamleugh, Shadford, Marraweeney, Strathbogio, Linna, Boho, and part of the subdivision of Balmattam: Commencing at Nalinga, on the Broken River, at the boundary line between the Shires of Euroa and Benalla, and bounded on the north by Broken River, running westerly to north-west corner of allotment 25, subdivision of Caniambo, which is part of Mr. Thomas Graham's land; thence south following the boundary between Caniambo and Kialla and the boundary between Tamleugh and Karramonus as far as the main road between Violet Town and Miepoll; thence easterly along the said main road to the north-east corner of A. Godden's land; thence south following the road through the land of Mr. Charles Koyan and Charles Ewart and that of Mr. A. Fullerton and Henry Jstall to a point where the roads join on the north-western boundary of Mr. W. W. Casement's land; thence south-westerly along the said W. W. Casement's land to the south-west corner; thence south-easterly following the road in a straight line across the railway to a point where the roads join on the eastern boundary of allotment 96c, Balmattam, of Mr. J. Gall's land; thence south-westerly along the boundary of the said allotment, and following the road through Mr. Collier Gall's land, then along the southern boundary of Miss Jessie Gall's land, and to a point on the southern boundary of Mr. Thos. Gall's land; thence south-westerly to the north-west corner of Mr. James Willis' land; thence south-easterly along the southern boundary of Mr. Thomas Deane's land and Mr. William Deane's land; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Elizabeth A. Trimbel's land and between the land of Mr. George McCombe and that of Mr. J. McCombe; thence further south between the land of E. P. Farris and that of Mr. H. Robinson, and following the road through the land of Mary Farris; thence east along the southern boundary of Mr. Henry Robinson's, Mr. James Wicklife's, and Mr. James Mackrell's land to the south-east corner of Mr. James Mackrell's land; thence south-westerly to the north-east corner of Mr. R. Jeffers' land; thence east through Mr. W. Steen's land, along the southern boundary of the lands of Messrs. J. Whitfield, P. H. L. Jackson, W. Gerrard, H. H. Jackson, James Walker, and through Mr. W. Nagel's land to a point on the western boundary; thence south-easterly along the eastern border of Mr. Wm. Walker's land to the north-eastern corner of Mr. Charles Parker's land; thence northerly following the boundary line between the Shires of Euroa and Benalla back to the commencing point at

Nalinga. And also all that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Benalla, being the subdivision of Upotipotpon and part of the subdivision of Warrenbayne: Commencing at Nalinga, at the north-western corner of the Benalla Shire, and bounded on the north by the Broken River, running east as far as the north-east corner of the said subdivision of Upotipotpon; thence south along the eastern boundary of the said division of Upotipotpon to the south-east corner of the said subdivision; thence east at right angles to the last line to the north-east corner of allotment 46a, in the said subdivision of Warrenbayne; thence south along the road at right angles to the last line to the south-east corner of G. Chesterfield's land; thence east at right angles to the last line as far as the junction of the roads on the southern boundary (near the south-west corner) of Mr. M. Henry's land; thence south-easterly along the road to the west corner of the Warrenbayne pre-emptive right; thence south to the southern boundary of Mr. S. J. Boucher's land on the boundary line between the Shires of Benalla and Euroa; thence west and north following the boundary line between the Euroa and Benalla Shires to the commencing point at Nalinga.

Petitioners state that Violet Town, which is becoming a place of considerable importance, is twelve and a half miles from Euroa, the head-quarters of the Euroa Shire, and they find that the town cannot get such an amount of attention and supervision as such a town and its neighbourhood require. That the same difficulty occurs with regard to the area proposed to be severed within the Benalla Shire, principally owing to the impracticable nature of the country preventing any direct road to Benalla being made; that they consider they do not obtain a proportionate expenditure for the rates they pay, nor do they receive a fair share of the services of the shire officers, &c.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said areas and constitute them a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Violet Town," such municipality to be subdivided into three ridings.

## SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

BY-LAW NO. 11 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Chiltern, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. *Double-pan service.*—Every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, the council providing the pans, and such pans shall be fitted with air-tight lids, and the pans shall be removed for cleansing at least once a week.

2. *Removal of night-soil.*—No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the said council, and such pans shall be removed and emptied alternately as the said council shall direct.

3. *Use of deodorant.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

4. *Charges for removal.*—The council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for such service, and from time to time, as it may see fit, to increase or reduce such charge.

The charges for the removal of night-soil, subject to any increase or reduction which the council may hereafter make, will be as follows, viz.:—For a once-a-week service for every pan used, One pound per annum, and Two pounds per annum for a twice-a-week service; and such sum or sums shall be paid quarterly in advance respectively, and in default of payment the same to be recoverable in any court of petty sessions.

5. *Extent of application of by-law.*—This by-law, numbered 11, shall apply to and have application in that portion of the Chiltern Riding, of the Shire of Chiltern, included within the boundaries described hereunder, that is to say:—Commencing at the crossing of the North-Eastern Railway in Ferrier-street; thence by the railway line to the crossing at Epsom-road; thence by a direct line to the south-east corner of allotment 1 of section 11A, township of Chiltern; thence east and north by the boundary of allotment 8 of section 11A to Albert-road; thence by that road to Gaunt-street; thence by that street to the north-west angle of allotment 4 of section 5, township of Chiltern East; thence by the north-west boundary of the said allotment and allotments 5, 6, 7, and 8 to the north boundary of the township; thence eastward by that boundary to the north-west corner of allotment 3 of section 6 of the said township of Chiltern East; thence south and east to the north-east corner of allotment 13 of section 6; thence south and east to the eastern boundary of the said township at the south-east angle of allotment 7 of section 7; and thence by the said boundary to the starting point.

6. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and a further penalty of not more than One pound or less than Five shillings for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.**

**REGULATION No. 15.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

**Regulation No. 15.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners' or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Four per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value or upwards, an amount equal to Four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.
7. For every water-trough, One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 20,000 gallons.
8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens), and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement, for the purpose of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, hotel, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds, used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or ninepence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

10. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of:—

For 3/4-inch ...	Ten shillings,
For 1/2-inch ...	Ten shillings,
For 3/8-inch ...	Fifteen shillings,
For 1-inch ...	One pound,



which ren shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 133,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

13. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

15. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1895, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

#### KOROIT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Trust district shall pay for the year 1895:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling or under, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the Borough of Koroit, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling, the sum of One shilling and sixpence on each pound of such value.

3. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

#### TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST. REGULATION No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure and supplied through a meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the same shall have been submitted to and approved by the Trust, or by such officer as may be appointed for that purpose, and that no meter shall be removed without giving six days' notice to the Trust.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

13. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap, or in any way interfere with, any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be £1.

14. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Tatura Waterworks Trust.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-  
COURSE AND FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE  
TOWNSHIP OF WINTON.

WE, Robert Warnock, James Brennan, William Lynch, John Hernan, and Thomas Hernan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and for Public Recreation in the township of Winton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit

the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No persons shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosure or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers and other persons authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.
10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every adult, One shilling.  
For the admission of every saddle horse (exclusive of rider),  
(One shilling).  
For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle  
drawn by one horse, Two shillings.  
For the admission of every additional horse attached to  
carriage, cart, or other vehicle, Sixpence.

12. The net proceeds of all sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

13. No person shall, after the 1st day of February, 1895, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

- 1st. That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the committee of management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Winton Racing Club, or by those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of One pound (£1.)
- 2nd. That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the committee of management of the reserve, or the stewards or committee of the Winton Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and any person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
