No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

FANCY LEATHER GOODS FACTORY OF MR. HERBERT CARTER,
275 FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 7th February instant, upon the following express conditions (that is to say):—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than three females for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours overtime in any one day of twenty-four hours, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

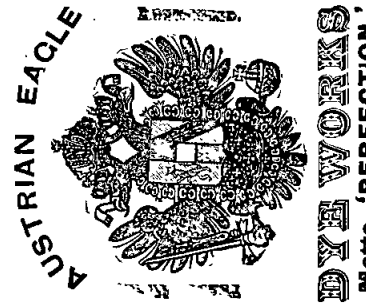

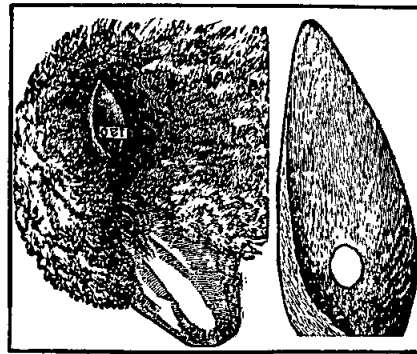
