Sig,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Japan, signed at London on the 16th July, 1894, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Tokiô on the 25th of August last.

I have to call your attention to Article XIX. of the Treaty, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the Colony under your Government should come within the operation of the Treaty, notice to that effect must be given to the Japanese Government within two years from 25th of August, 1894, the date of the exchange of ratifications of the Treaty.

I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND JAPAN.

Signed at London, July 16, 1894. [Ratifications exchanged at Tôkiô, August 25, 1894.]

Hrs Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, being equally desirous of maintaining the relations of good understanding which happily exist between them, by extending and increasing the intercourse between their respective States, and being convinced that this object cannot better be accomplished than by revising the Treaties hitherto existing between the two countries, have resolved to complete such a revision, based upon principles of equity and mutual benefit, and, for that purpose, have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, the Right Honorable John, Earl of Kinberley, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, &c., &c., Her Britannic Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, Viscount Aoki Siuzo, Junii, first class of the Imperial Order of the Sacred Tresaure, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of St. James';

Who, after having communicated to each other their full powers, found to be in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

dominions and possessions of the other Contracting Party, and shall enjoy full and perfect protection for their persons and

They shall have free and easy access to the courts of justice in pursuit and defence of their rights; they shall be at liberty equally with native subjects to choose and employ lawyers, advocates, and representatives to pursue and defend their rights before such courts, and in all other matters connected with the administration of justice they shall enjoy all the rights and privileges enjoyed by native subjects.

privileges enjoyed by native subjects.

In whatever relates to rights of residence and travel; to the possession of goods and effects of any kind; to the succession to personal estate, by will or otherwise, and the disposal of property of any sort in any manner whatsever which they may lawfully acquire, the subjects of each Contracting Party shall enjoy in the dominions and possessions of the other the same privileges, liberties, and rights, and shall be subject to no higher imposts or charges in these respects than native subjects, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation. The subjects of each of the Contracting Parties shall enjoy in the dominions and possessions of the other entire liberty of conscience, and, subject to the laws, ordinances, and regulations, shall enjoy the right of private or public exercise of their worship, and also the right of burying their respective countrymen according to their religious customs, in such suitable and convenient places as may be established and maintained for that purpose. maintained for that purpose.

They shall not be compolled, under any pretext whatsoever, to pay any charges or taxes other or higher than those that are, or may be, paid by native subjects, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE II.

The subjects of either of the Contracting Parties residing in the dominions and possessions of the other shall be exempted from all compulsory military service whatsoever, whether in the army, navy, national guard, or militis; from all contributions imposed in lieu of personal service; and from all forced loans or military exactions or contributions.

ARTICLE III.

There shall be reciprocal freedom of commerce and navigation between the dominions and possessions of the two High Contracting Parties.

The subjects of each of the High Contracting Parties may trade in any part of the dominions and possessions of the other by wholesale or retail in all kinds of produce, manufactures, and merchandise of lawful commerce, either in person or by agents, singly, or in partnerships with foreigners or native subjects; and they may there own or hire and occupy the houses, manufactories, warehouses, shops, and premises which may be necessary for them, and lease land for residential and commercial purposes, conforming themselves to the laws, police and customs regulations of the country like native subjects.

They shall have liberty freely to come with their ships and

regulations of the country like native subjects.

They shall have liberty freely to come with their ships and cargoes to all places, ports, and rivers in the dominions and possessions of the other which are or may be opened to foreign commerce, and shall enjoy, respectively, the same treatment in matters of commerce and navigation as native subjects, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation, without having to pay taxes, imposts, or duties, of whatever nature or under whatever denomination, levied in the name or for the profit of the Government, public functionaries, private individuals, corporations, or establishments of any kind, other or greater than those paid by native subjects, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation, subject always to the laws, ordinances, and regulations of each country.

ARTICLE IV.

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, and shops of the subjects of each of the High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, and all premises appertaining thereto destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be re-

spected.

It shall not be allowable to proceed to make a search of, or a domiciliary visit to, such dwellings and premises, or to examine or inspect books, papers, or accounts, except under the conditions and with the forms prescribed by the laws, ordinances, and regulations for subjects of the country.

ARTICLE V.

No other or higher duties shall be imposed on the importation into the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty of any article, the produce or manufacture of the dominions and possessions of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, from whatever place arriving; and no other or higher duties shall be imposed on the importation into the dominions and possessions of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan of any article, the produce or manufacture of the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, from whatever place arriving, than on the like article produced or manufactured in any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition be maintained or imposed on the importation of any article, the produce or manufacture of the dominions and possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties, into the dominions and possessions of either of the tother, from whatever place arriving, which shall not equally extend to the importation of the like article, being the produce or manufacture of any other country. This last provision is not applicable to the sanitary and other prohibitions occasioned by the necessity of protecting the safety of persons, or of cattle, or of plants useful to agriculture.

ARTICLE VI.

ARTICLE VI.

No other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed in the dominions and possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties on the exportation of any article to the dominions and possessions of the other than such as are, or may be, payable on the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country; nor shall any problibition be imposed on the exportation of any article from the dominions and possessions of either of the two Contracting Parties to the dominions and possessions of the other which shall not equally extend to the exportation of the like article to any other country.

ARTICLE VII.

The subjects of each of the High Contracting Parties shall enjoy in the dominions and possessions of the other exemption from all transit duties, and a perfect equality of treatment with native subjects in all that relates to warehousing, bounties, facilities, and drawbacks.

ARTICLE VIII.

All articles which are or may be legally imported into the ports of the dominions and possessions of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan in Japanese vessels may likewise be imported into those ports in British vessels, without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination than if such articles were imported in Japanese vessels; and reciprocally, all articles which are or may be legally imported into the ports of the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty in British vessels may likewise be imported into those ports in Japanese vessels, without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination than if such articles were imported in British vessels. Such reciprocal equality of treatment shall take effect without distinction, whether such articles come directly from the place of origin or from any other place.

articles come directly from the place of origin or from any other place.

In the same manner there shall be perfect equality of treatment in regard to exportation, so that the same export duties shall be paid and the same bounties and drawbacks allowed in the dominions and possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties on the exportation of any article which is or may be legally exported therefrom, whether such exportation shall take place in Japanese or in British vessels, and whatever may be the place of destination, whether a port of either of the Contracting Parties or of any third Power.

ARTICLE IX.

ARTICLE IX.

No duties of tomage, harbor, pilotage, light-house, quarantine, or other similar or corresponding duties of whatever nature or under whatever denomination, levied in the name or for the profit of the Government, public functionaries, private individuals, corporations, or establishments of any kind, shall be imposed in the ports of the dominions and possessions of either country upon the vessels of the other country which shall not equally and under the same conditions be imposed in the like cases on national vessels in general or vessels of the most favoured nation. Such equality of treatment shall apply reciprocally to the respective vessels, from whatever port or place they may arrive, and whatever may be their place of destination.

ARTICLE X.

In all that regards the stationing, loading, and unloading of vessels in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbors, or rivers of the dominions and possessions of the two countries, no privilege shall be granted to national vessels which shall not be equally granted to vessels of the other country: the intention of the High Contracting Parties being that in this respect also the respective vessels shall be treated on the footing of perfect equality.

ARTICLE XI.

The coasting trade of both the High Contracting Parties is excepted from the provisions of the present Treaty, and shall be

regulated according to the laws, ordinances, and regulations of Japan and Great Britain respectively. It is, however, understood that Japanese subjects in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, and British subjects in the dominions and possessions of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, shall enjoy in this respect the rights which are or may be granted under such laws, ordinances, and regulations to the subjects or citizens of any other country.

citizens of any other country.

A Japanese vessel laden in a foreign country with cargo destined for two or more ports in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, and a British vessel laden in a foreign country with cargo destined for two or more ports in the dominions and possessions of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, may discharge a portion of her cargo at one port, and continue her voyage to the other port or ports of destination where foreign trade is permitted, for the purpose of landing the remainder of her original cargo there, subject always to the laws and custom-house regulations of the two countries.

The Japanese Government, however, agrees to allow British vessels to continue, as heretofore, for the period of the duration of the present Treaty, to carry cargo between the existing open ports of the Empire, excepting to or from the ports of Osaka, Niigata, and Ebisu-minato.

ARTICLE XII.

ARTICLE XII.

Any ship of war or merchant vessel of either of the High Contracting Parties which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by reason of any other distress, to take shelter in a port of the other, shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary supplies, and to put to sea again, without paying any dues other than such as would be payable by national vessels. In case, however, the master of a merchant vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his cargo in order to defray the expenses, he shall be bound to conform to the regulations and tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship of war or merchant ressel of one of the Contracting Parties should run aground or be wrecked upon the coasts of the other, the local authorities shall inform the Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of the district of the occurrence, or if there be no such Consular officer, they shall inform the Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of the nearest district.

Agent of the hearest district.

All proceedings relative to the salvage of Japanese vessels wrecked or cast on shore in the territorial waters of Her Britannic Majesty shall take place in accordance with the laws, ordinances, and regulations of Great Britain, and reciprocally, all measures of salvage relative to British vessels wrecked or cast on shore in the territorial waters of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan shall take place in accordance with the laws, ordinances, and regulations of Japan.

shall take place in accordance with the laws, ordinances, and regulations of Japan.

Such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furnitures and appurtenances belonging thereunto, and all goods and merchandise saved therefrom, including those which nay have been cast into the sea, or the proceeds thereof, if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents, when claimed by them. If such owners or agents are not on the spot, the same shall be delivered to the respective Consuls-General; Consuls, Vice-Consuls, or Consular Agents, upon being claimed by them within the period fixed by the laws of the country, and such Consular officers, owners, or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The goods and merchandise saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all the duties of the Customs unless cleared for consumption, in which case they shall pay the ordinary duties.

When a ship or vessel belonging to the subjects of one of the contracting parties is stranded or wrecked in the territories of the other, the respective Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents shall be authorized, in case the owner or master, or other agent of the owner, is not present, to lend their official assistance in order to afford the necessary assistance to the subjects of the respective States. The same rule shall apply in case the owner, master, or other agent is present, but requires such assistance in order to afford the precessary assistance to the subjects of the respective States.

ARTICLE XIII.

All vessels which, according to Japanese law, are to be deemed Japanese vessels, and all vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be deemed Japanese and British vessels respectively.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of each of the Contracting Parties, residing in the dominions and possessions of the other, shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

It is understood that this stipulation shall not apply to the subjects of the country where the desertion takes place.

ARTICLE XV.

The High Contracting Parties agree that, in all that concerns commerce and navigation, any privilege, favour, or immunity which either Contracting Party has actually granted, or may hereafter grant, to the Government, ships, subjects, or citizens of any other State, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the Government, ships, subjects, or citizens of the other Contracting Party, it being their intention that the trade and navigation of each country shall be placed, in all respects, by the other on the footing of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE XVI.

Each of the High Contracting Parties may appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, and Consular Agents in all the ports, cities, and places of the other, except in those where it may not be convenient to recognise such officers.

This exception, however, shall not be made in regard to one of the Contracting Parties without being made likewise in regard to every other power.

every other power.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, and Consular Agents may exercise all functions, and shall enjoy all privileges, exemptions, and immunities which are, or may hereafter be, granted to Consular officers of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE XVII.

The subjects of each of the High Contracting Parties shall enjoy in the dominions and possessions of the other the same protection as native subjects in regard to patents, trade-marks, and designs, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.

ARTICLE XVIII.

Her Britannic Majesty's Government, so far as they are concerned, give their consent to the following arrangement:—
The several foreign settlements in Japan shall be incorporated with the respective Japanese communes, and shall thenceforth form part of the general municipal system of Japan.
The competent Japanese authorities shall thereupon assume all municipal obligations and duties in respect thereof, and the common funds and property, if any, belonging to such settlements, shall at the same time be transferred to the said Japanese authorities.

ments, shall at the same time be transferred to the said Japanese authorities.

When such incorporation takes place the existing leases in perpetuity under which property is now held in the said settlements shall be confirmed, and no conditions whatsoeverother than those contained in such existing leases shall be imposed in respect of such property. It is, however, understood that the consular authorities mentioned in the same are in all cases to be replaced by the Japanese authorities.

All lands which may previously have been granted by the Japanese Government free of rent for the public purposes of the said settlements shall, subject to the right of eminent domain, be permanently reserved free of all taxes and charges for the public purposes for which they were originally set apart.

ARTICLE XIX.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable, so far as the laws permit, to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say except to. that is to say, except to-

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Treaty shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given to the Japanese Government by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative at Tokio within two years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XX.

The present Treaty shall, from the date it comes into force, be substituted in place of the Conventions respectively of the 23rd day of the 8th month of the 7th year of Kayei, corresponding to the 14th day of October, 1854, and of the 13th day of the 5th month of the 2nd year of Keiou, corresponding to the 25th day of June, 1866, the Treaty of the 18th day of the 7th month of the 5th year of Ansei, corresponding to the 26th day of August, 1858, and all Arrangements and Agreements subsidiary thereto concluded or existing between the High Contracting Parties; and from the same date such Conventions, Treaty, Arrangements, and Agreements shall cease to be binding, and, in consequence, the jurisdiction then exercised by British Courts in Japan, and all the exceptional privileges, exemptions, and immunities them enjoyed by British subjects as a part of or appurtenant to such jurisdiction, shall absolutely and without notice cease and determine, and thereafter all such jurisdiction shall be assumed and exercised by Japanese courts.

ARTICLE XXI.

The present Treaty shall not take effect until at least five years after its signature. It shall come into force one year after His Imperial Japanese Majesty's Government shall have given notice to Her Britannic Majesty's Government of its wish to have the same brought into operation. Such notice may be given at any time after the expiration of four years from the date hereof. The Treaty shall remain in force for the period of twelve years from the date it goes into operation.

Either High Contracting Party shall have the right, at any time after eleven years shall have elapsed from the date this Treaty takes effect, to give notice to the other of its intention to terminate the same, and at the expiration of Twelve months after such notice is given this Treaty shall wholly cease and determine.

ARTICLE XXII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications thereof shall be exchanged at Tokio as soon as possible, and not later than six months from the present date.

Protocol signed at London, July 16, 1894.

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and Empress of India, and the Government of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, deeming it advisable in the interests of both countries to regulate certain special matters of mutual concern, apart from the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation signed this day, have, through their respective Plenipotentiaries, agreed upon the following stipulations:

1. It is agreed by the Contracting Parties that one month after the exchange of the ratifications of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation signed this day, the Import Taviff hereunto ammode shall, subject to the provisions of Articles XXIII. of the Treaty of 1858 at present subsisting between the Contracting Parties, as long as the said Treaty remains in force and thereafter, subject to the provisions of Articles V. and XV. of the Treaty signed this day, be applicable to the articles therein enumerated, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, upon importation into Japan. But nothing contained in this Protocol, or the Tariff hereunto ammoded, shall be held to limit or qualify the right of the Japanese Government to restrict or to prohibit the importation of adulterated drugs, medicines, food, or beverages; indecent or obscene prints, paintings, books, cards, lithographic or other engravings, photographs, or any other indecent or obscene articles; articles in violation of patent, trade-mark, or copyright laws of Japan; or any other article which for sanitary reasons, or in view of public security or morals, might offer any danger.

The ad valorem duties established by the said Tariff shall, so far as may be deemed practicable, he converted into specific duties by a Supplementary Convention, which shall be concluded between the two Governments within six months from the date of this Protocol; the medium prices, as shown by the Japanese Customs returns during the six calendar months proceding the date of the present Protocol, with the addition of the cost of insurance and transportation from the place of purchase, production, or fabrication, to the port of discharge, as well as commission, if any, shall be taken as the basis for such conversion. The Japanese Government, pending the opening of the country to British subjects, agrees to extend the existing passport system in such a manner as to allow British subjects, on the production of a certificate of recommendation from the British representative in Tokiô, or from any of Her Majesty's consuls at the open ports in Japan, to obtain upon application passports available for any part of the country, and for any period not exceeding twelve months, from the Imperial Japanese Foreign Office in Tokiô, or from the chief authorities in the prefecture in which an open port is situated; it being understood that the existing rules and regulations governing British subjects who visit the interior of the empire are to be maintained.

- 3. The Japanese Government undertakes, before the cessation of British consular jurisdiction in Japan, to join the interna-tional conventions for the protection of industrial property and copyright.
- 4. It is understood between the two High Contracting Parties 4. It is understood between the two flight Contracting l'arties that, if Japan think it necessary at any time to levy an additional duty on the production or manufacture of refined sugar in Japan, an increased customs duty equivalent in amount may be levied on British refined sugar when imported into Japan, so long as such additional excise tax or inland duty continues to be

Provided always that British refined sugar shall in this respect be entitled to the treatment accorded to refined sugar being the produce or manufacture of the most favoured nation.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries have agreed that this Protocol shall be submitted to the two High Contracting Parties at the same time as the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation signed this day, and that when the said Treaty is ratified the agreements contained in the Protocol shall also equally be considered as approved, without the necessity of a further formal ratification.
- It is also agreed that this Protocol shall terminate at the same time the said Treaty ceases to be binding.

Rule for Calculating Ad Valorem Duties.



BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, numbered 27, for altering, amending, and repealing section 21, Part'IV., of By-law No. 25 of this shire, and the addition of other matter relating to the public health in the Shire of Heidelberg.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. Repeal of Section 21, Part IV., of By-law No. 25.—That section 21, Part IV. of By-law No. 25 of this shire shall be repealed, and the following shall be substituted in lieu thereof.

- repealed, and the following shall be substituted in their thereof.

 2. Certain closets to be emptied only by licensed nightmen.—No closet, privy, or cesspool within the shire on premises of less than 4 acres in area shall be emptied, or the contents thereof removed, except by a nightman, carter, or other person duly licensed for that purpose by the cannell of the shire, and every person who shall without being so licensed empty any such closet, privy, or cesspool, or remove the contents thereof, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.
- 3. Night-soil not to be deposited near buildings, &c.—Every occupier of premises containing 4 acres in area and upwards, who shall bury, deposit, or use as manure, or cause to be so buried deposited, or used, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter, within 150 feet of any building, or any adjoining premises, or without the same being covered with at least 12 inches of clean dry earth, shall be guilty of au offence against this by-law.
- offence against this by-law.

 4. Time of removal, de., of night-soil.—Every occupier of, and every person having the management or control of premises of 4 acres and upwards in area, shall once at least in each week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cosspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

 5. Penaltics.—Every person found guilty of any offence against this by-law, or of committing any breach thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence or breach, or in case of any continuing breach, to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

Br-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Glenlyon, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 1 of the said shire, that is to say:—

- 1. All former by laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.
 2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Guzette.
 3. This by-law shall come and baye operation in the Shiro
- This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shire of Glenlyon

DEFINITIONS.

4. In the construction, and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms—abattoir or slaughter-house, cesspool, earth-closet, house, inspector, land, street—shall, if not inconsistent with the contents or subject-matter, have the respective meanings assigned to them in the Health Act 1890.

Words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females; and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular; and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

5. Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injusies to be sent as be a nuisance or injurious to health.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM HOUSES.

6. Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, fifth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week. In default, the Council, by their inspector, may remove the same at the expense of such occupier.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM PLACES WHERE ANIMALS ARE KEPT.

7. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards, or once at least every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Council may remove the

POWER TO USE REFUSE AS MANURE.

8. Nothing contained in this by-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM PLACES WHERE NOXIOUS OR OFFENSIVE TRADES ARE CARRIED ON.

OFFENSIVE TRADES ARE CARRIED ON.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every seventy-two hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or full to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Council.

REMOVAL OF BLOOD AND OFFAL FROM PLACES WHERE ANIMALS ARE SLAUGHTERED,

Animals are Slaughtered.

10. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattor, slaughtor-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a pit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deadorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient cocdorizer sufficient to effectually deadorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed, and the offal from such animals shall be effectually deadorized and be removed from the premises within the same period.

Construction of Privirs.

Construction of Phivirs.

11. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of this adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleaning the same.

Every privy attached to any school, hottel, licensed publichouse, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

SUPPLY OF DEODORIZING MATERIAL TO EARTH-CLOSETS.

12. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging theretoe supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil, which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet, to be immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material, sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

EMPTYING RECEPTACLES FOR NIGHT-SOIL.

13. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cespool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

Hours within which Cesspools may be Emptied and Night-soil Removed.

AGHT-SOIL HEMOVED.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any curth-closet, privy, cosspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eight o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be omptied any earth-closet, privy, cosspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied, and so as not to be a nisance or inivirous to health. to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AND OFFENSIVE MATTER.

15. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

NIGHT-SOIL, ETC., REMOVED FROM ANY EARTH-CLOSET, ETC., AND DEPOSITED ANYWHERE TO BE COVERED WITH EARTH.

DEPOSITED ANYMERE TO BE COVERED WITH ELASTIM.

16. Every person placing or depositing, or causing to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of, earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

EARTH-CLOSETS, ETC., NOT TO BE EMPITED INTO DRAINS OR SEWERS.

17. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF WATER.

18. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drunks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

CESSPOOLS NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO WATER USED FOR DRINKING OR DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

- 19. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes; or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man; or used or likely to be used in any dairy; or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.
- 20. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Council or by one of its officers.

KEEPING OF ANIMALS.

- 21. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.
- 22. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

SUPPLY OF WATER TO SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

23. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattdir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

DRAINAGE OF NEW BUILDINGS

24. Every person creeting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there

DRAINAGE OF EXISTING BUILDINGS.

25. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom; and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

DISPOSAL OF DEAD OR DISEASED ANIMALS.

26. No person, being the owner of any dead animal, shall allow such dead animal to remain in any place for a longer period than twelve hours so as to become a nuisance and injurious to health, in default, the Council will cause such animal to be removed and destroyed at the expense of such owner.

PENALTIES.

27. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10, or to a penalty not exceeding \$25 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continue! Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered, may order the whole or part only, not being less than Five (5) shillings of such penalty to be paid.

And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that

the Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CRESWICK PUBLIC GEMETERY.

- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeterics Act 1890, the Trustees of the Creswick Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—
- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to creet and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or opitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- 6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
- 7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
- 10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, comented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- 12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- 13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
- 14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.
- 15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
- 16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery, excepting at a military burial.
- 17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.


