Health Act 1890.

ISOLATION OF PREMISES INFECTED WITH SMALL-POX.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Public Health may, upon such proof as it thinks sufficient that any house or building contains any person suffering from small-pox, order that such house be effectually isolated until such order be revoked or until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 127 of the said Act: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall whenever he deems fit be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health of the colony of Victoria, being satisfied with the proof furnished to me of the existence of small-pox in the end ward of the building known as the Refractory Block at the Melbourne Hospital, together with a bedroom adjoining such ward, also in the house numbered 48 in Walsh-street, West Melbourne, do hereby order and direct that the said premises be effectually isolated until this order be revoked or until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of £10,000 for giving Bonuses for Dairy Produce, Fruits, and Honey, of best quality and in best order, exported to Foreign Markets; also for the Development of the Wine Industry, as also in connexion with the shipment of Poultry and Meat, and to include expenses in connexion with any of the items named herein.

EXPORT OF HONEY.

A bonus of One penny per pound may be paid for honey of approved quality made in Victoria and exported to such port outside the Australasian Colonies as may be sanctioned by the Minister of Agriculture.

No honey for which it is intended to claim bonus under these regulations shall be exported until it has been examined and approved by some person or persons appointed for that purpose by the Minister.

The maximum quantity of honey, for export for bonus, from any one firm or apiary shall not exceed 1 ton weight, and such honey must be the produce of the apiary owned by the exporter.

All honey for export shall be put up in new stout tin cases, each case to contain 56 lbs. net, and be packed in new wooden boxes, two cases in a box, branded "Victorian Honey."

Account sales of the honey so exported shall be obtained from the country to which the same has been exported, and be forwarded for the inspection of the Minister not later than the 20th August, 1895.

Account sales shall be verified to the satisfaction of the Minister in such manner as he may think fit to require.

No bonus shall be paid for honey which has not arrived at the port of consignment in a good and marketable condition.

**SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NO. 18.

1. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined in a certain Order in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban District shall pay in respect of the year 1894 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

4. Such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st day of January, 1894, and the 1st day of July, 1894.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expenses of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the cost of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- (b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal district of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a waterworks district;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application by the Councillors for the South Riding of the Shire of St. Arnaud, for a loan to carry out certain works for supplying water to the Township of Donald; and doth hereby order and appoint as follow:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) The Councillors for the South Riding of the Shire of St. Arnaud and three other persons to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Seven thousand one hundred and sixty-six pounds three shillings and tenpence sterling (£7,166 3s. 10d.), for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the lands within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the eastern angle of allotment 4, section 10, township of Donald; thence northerly in a straight line across a Government road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 12, section 9, in the said township; thence by the western boundary of a three-chain road forming the eastern boundary of the said township to the northern angle of allotment 1, section 15, in the said township; thence by the production of the last-named line to its intersection with the production easterly of the southern side of a Government road forming the northern boundary of the said township; thence westerly by the production of the last-named line and by the line itself to the Avon River; thence southerly by the said river to the Government road forming the southern boundary of allotment 4, section 10, in the said township; thence
