

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNMENT OF PILOTS.\*

WHEREAS section 60 of the Marine Act 1890 provides among other things that the Marine Board of Victoria may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the management and government of pilots, and for the order in which they shall perform their services, and generally for all matters relative to the efficient discharge of their duties: And whereas the said Marine Board did, on the 10th day of August, 1894; And whereas it is desirable to add to the same: Now therefore the said Marine Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, do hereby make the following additional regulation, that is to say:—

ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations to the contrary the Board may, whenever they deem fit, direct any sea pilot to perform the duties of a harbor and river pilot, provided that the Board, prior to directing any pilot to undertake such duties, shall satisfy themselves that such pilot is fully qualified to perform them and shall certify accordingly.

This regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage" and be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect on and after the 19th day of March, 1895. ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names, or letters, or figures on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones, or use slings or catapults in any of the reserves.
- 5. No person shall put into any of the reserves any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or geese.
- 6. No person shall bring into any of the reserves any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing of the council.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in any of the reserves nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.
- 8. No person shall ride or drive any horse in any of the reserves without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the council.
- 9. No person, unless authorized by the council, shall enter any plots in any of the reserves which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1830, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any baillif of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein, except with the permission (in writing) of the Council.
- 4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle without the consent (in writing) of the Council. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works
- 5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority (in writing) of the Council.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent (in writing) of the Council first obtained.
- No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
