## RECOGNITION IN THE UNITED KINGDOM OF PASSENGER CERTIFICATES GRANTED IN VICTORIA.

THE subjoined Order of Her Majesty in Council is published  
for general information.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* it is enacted that, where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers, and the Board of Trade report to Her Majesty the Queen that they are satisfied that the certificates are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under this Act, Her Majesty by Order in Council may:—

- (1) Declare that the certificates granted in the said British Possession shall be of the same force as if granted under this Act; and
- (2) Declare that all or any of the provisions of this part of this Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, either without modification or with such modifications as to Her Majesty may seem necessary, apply to the certificates granted in the said British Possession; and
- (3) Impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the certificates, and to the use, delivery, and cancellation thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and impose fines not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regulations.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the Legislature of the British Possession of Victoria has provided for the survey of and grant of certificates for passenger steamers.

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that such certificates are, as regards foreign-going passenger steamers, to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the said Act.

Now therefore Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in her by the said recited Act, is hereby pleased to declare as follows, viz.:—

1. That the certificates granted under the said provision by the Legislature of the British Possession of Victoria for foreign-going passenger steamers shall be of the same force as if they had been granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.
2. That all the provisions of the third part of the said Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, without modification, except as hereinafter mentioned, apply to the certificates for foreign-going passenger steamers granted in the said British Possession of Victoria.

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3. That it shall not be lawful for a passenger steamer to which this Order relates to proceed to sea with passengers on board from any port or place in the United Kingdom, on any voyage other than to the said Possession of Victoria, or to any intermediate place or places situate on such voyage.

4. That if any such passenger steamer goes or attempts to go to sea from any port or place in the United Kingdom with any passengers on board upon any other voyage than a voyage to the said Possession of Victoria, or any intermediate place or places as aforesaid, the owner and master thereof shall, for each such offence, incur a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner, and such fine is hereby imposed accordingly.

*Factories and Shops Act 1890.*

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OF THE ALBION WOOLLEN MILLS COMPANY, OF  
LATROBE-TERRACE, GEELONG,

for a period of six weeks from the 20th May, 1895, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than thirty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, or shall employ any males under the age of sixteen for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females, all being piece workers, shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the rate of pay being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

OYSTER DREDGING IN WESTERNPORT BAY.

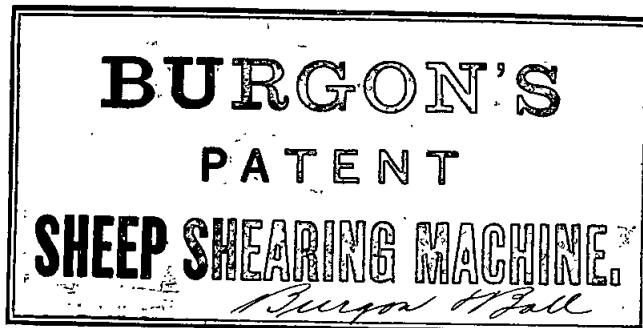

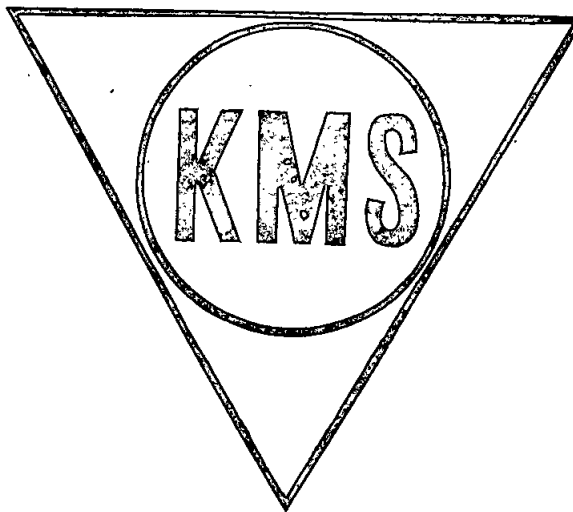

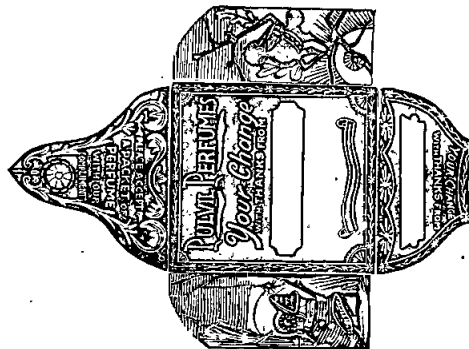

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF FRANKSTON.

THE Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Frankston, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges, for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, or remove sand or soil therefrom.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No dogs shall be allowed into the reserve on such days as fees for admission thereto are charged as hereinafter provided.
7. No person shall camp in the reserve or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the same.
10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to removal from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
11. All net proceeds of sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.



12. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
