During the first quarter of 1895 there was, as shown in the table, a net loss to the population of 74 persons, resulting from a loss of 764 males, less a gain of 690 females. This is a marked improvement on the corresponding quarter of the previous year, when there was a net loss of 1,862 persons.

The registered births during the quarter numbered 8,252, and the deaths 3,989; thus the former exceeded the latter by 107 per cent. The births were more numerous by 88, but the deaths fewer by 407 than in the first quarter of 1894.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 25,056, but the recorded and estimated unrecorded departures numbered 29,393, resulting in a loss, by excess of departures over arrivals, of 4,337. This loss was lower than in the first quarter of 1894 by 1,293.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 26,459, viz., 20,557 of males and 5,902 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of March would have been 1,205,488, viz., 627,053 males and 578,435 females.

The only check on the periodical estimates of population, but unfortunately an unreliable one, is afforded by the annual returns of population furnished by municipalities. Such returns, with an allowance to bring them on to the 31st December, and for extra municipal districts, give a total population for 1894 of about 1,135,500, or as many as 43,600 below even the reduced ordinary estimate at the same date. It cannot, however, be for a moment believed that an emigration of such magnitude could have eluded the notice of the Immigration Agent by leaving the shores of the colony unobserved, in addition to 26,459 already allowed for; nor could it be accounted for by overland emigration, of which no account is taken, for any efflux of population that may have taken place into New South Wales would probably be more than counterbalanced by South Australian farmers and others entering the colony to settle in the mallee wheat-growing districts. The difference most probably arises from internal migrations from the urban to the rural districts being duly noted, and the estimates reduced accordingly, by the urban municipal authorities, whose returns have been found generally reliable; whereas the rural municipal officers may not at first realize, and therefore may not account for, the full extent of an influx of population into their respective districts. This contention is, moreover, supported by the fact that the difference referred to has become reduced from 54,500 in 1893 to 43,600 in 1894.

During the quarter the recorded arrivals from were more numerous than the recorded departures for New South Wales by 843, South Australia by 594, and Tasmania by 578. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from Western Australia by 1,621, the United Kingdom by 1,226, New Zealand by 491, Queensland by 403, Foreign Ports by 179, and South Seas by 107. The unusual occurrence of a stream of emigrants to the United Kingdom still continues.

The persons leaving Victoria for South Australia and Western Australia (the ultimate destination of most of whom was probably the latter) exceeded the persons arriving from those colonies by 1,422 in 1890, 100 in 1891, 6,259 in 1892, 2027 in 1893, 9,064 in 1894, and 1,027 in the first quarter of 1895, or by 20,499 in the last 5½ years.

The births of 1,121 children, viz., 585 boys and 536 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. In the month of April 1,096 births were registered, or 25 less than in the month under review. The births were 250 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 272 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 537, viz., 287 of males and 250 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 584, or 109 per cent. The deaths were only 2 more than in the preceding month, and exactly the same as in the corresponding month of 1894; but they were fewer by 108 than the average of May during the previous ten years, and fewer by 118, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 30.07, and of deaths registered to 14.40 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.3°, on the 3rd, and the lowest was 31.3°, on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (53.1°) was nearly 1 degree below the average, and the lowest recorded for May since 1886 and 1887. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.0°) took place on the 26th, and the least range (4.9°) on the 21st; the mean daily range was 14.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.487 inches, on the 21st, and the lowest was 29.723 inches, on the 28th. The mean pressure (30.103 inches) was a twenty-sixth of an inch above the average, and higher than in any of the previous ten years, except 1890 and 1891.

Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being .965 of an inch. The average rainfall in May during the previous ten years was 2.05 inches, or more than twice as much as in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 25 per cent. to that mortality, as against 28 per cent. in May, 1894; 33 per cent. in May, 1893; 30 per cent. in May, 1892; 32 per cent. in May, 1891; 31 per cent. in May, 1890; and 33 per cent. in May, 1889. It will be noticed that the proportion has been rapidly falling since 1893.

Fifty-one deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a housekeeper, aged 75, died of valvular heart disease; a labourer, aged 75, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 75, of jaundice; a gentleman and an inspector of works, each aged 75, of cystitis; a female, aged 76, of dysentery; an accountant, aged 76, of cerebral affusion; two gentlemen, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of pleurisy; a sailor, aged 76, of cystitis; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a cardmaker, aged 77, of paraplegia; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; another, aged 77, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of burns; a gardener, aged 78, of senile gangrene; a tinsmith and a female, each aged 79, of cancer; a carpenter and a female, each aged 79, of apoplexy; a carpenter, aged 79, of thrombosis; a male, of unstated occupation, and a female, each aged 79, of heart disease; a marblemason, aged 79, of bronchitis; a tailor, aged 79, of nephritis; a printer, aged 79, of cystitis; two females, each aged 80, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 81, of aneurism; a carpenter and a nurseryman, each aged 83, of heart disease; four labourers, each aged 84, of gout, cancer, bronchitis, and pneumonia respectively; a female, aged 84, of disease of the liver; a female, aged 87, of senile gangrene; a labourer, aged 90, of asthma; two females, each aged 78, a carter, a gardener, and a female, each aged 79, and six females, aged 80, 81, 82, 85, 93, and 94 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-nine deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 5 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A shunter, aged 30, and a clerk, aged 38, were passed over by railway trains; a labourer, aged 26, was killed through becoming entangled in machinery; a carrier, aged 35, and a cab proprietor, aged 38, died of injuries consequent on being thrown from vehicles; a pawnbroker, aged 60, of fracture of the thigh, and a gardener, aged 72, of fracture of the skull caused by falls; a male child, aged 1, of scalds; a male child, aged 1, and a gentleman, aged 77, of burns; two labourers, aged 20 and 31, two miners, aged 27 and 39, a carpenter, aged 32, and a civil engineer, aged 43, were drowned by the inburst of water into the air-lock of a tunnel under the River Yarra in connexion with the sewerage system; a warehouseman, aged 59, was found drowned in the Saltwater River; two female children, aged 1 month and 3 months respectively, were overlain; and a miner, aged 39, was suffocated by a fall of sand in a drive in connexion with a tunnel for sewerage purposes. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant, who was found dead and is supposed to have been murdered, the immediate cause of death being hæmorrhage on the brain; and four others, who were wilfully murdered, viz., three females, aged 27, 29, and 61 respectively, whose throats were cut, and a labourer, aged 60, whose skull was fractured. The suicidal deaths were those of an estate agent, aged 70, who shot himself; a labourer, aged 29, who poisoned himself; an engineer, aged 59, and a dealer, aged 72, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and twenty-four deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 5 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 136, of which 78, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 58, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 99 were under one year of age, 16 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 401. Of these, 209, or 52 per cent., were males, and 192, or 48 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 40 were between twenty-five and thirty, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 15 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 43 were between sixty and sixty-five, 28 were between sixty-five and seventy, 40 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 2 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

Although there was a difference of only 2 in the total number of deaths in the last two months, there were several variations in the fatality of different causes in the month under review, as compared with the previous one. Thus, under the head of zymotic diseases, the deaths from scarlet fever rose from *nil* to 4, from influenza from 1 to 3, from syphilis from 3 to 6, and from septic diseases from 2 to 8; but those from typhoid fever, &c., fell from 20 to 13, and from diarrhoeal diseases from 17 to 8; the net decrease in that class being 2. In the constitutional class, deaths from cancer increased from 25 to 30, but those from phthisis diminished from 79 to 73, whilst there was a net increase in the class as a whole of 7. In the local class, the mortality from heart diseases increased from 42 to 56, from diseases of the respiratory system from 49 to 61, and from liver disease, gallstone, &c., from 10 to 18; but those from enteritis declined from 34 to 18, and from childbirth (exclusive of puerperal fever) from 9 (an exceptionally high number) to 2. The mortality under infantile complaints, referred to in the last report, continues to decline, notwithstanding, on the present occasion, an increase in the number of births; thus, besides the falling off of 16 deaths from enteritis as just shown, deaths from atrophy and debility also fell from 34 to 14, or a decrease of 36 under both heads, which closely corresponds to the decrease of 33 in the deaths from all causes under two years of age. Suicides, also alluded to in the two preceding reports, continue to be more numerous than in 1894, 27 having occurred since the beginning of the current year, as compared with 23 in the corresponding period of the previous one.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1890 to 1894, and the first five months of 1895. It will be noticed that in the last three months the mortality from the former was about the same as in the corresponding months of 1893, but considerably lower than in any of the other years shown:—
