BRONZE OR MIXED METAL COINS.—NEW DESIGN.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government has directed the subjoined Proclamation of Her Majesty in Council to be published.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for your information and for publication in the colony under your 11th May, 1895. Government, the accompanying copy of a Proclamation of the Queen in Council, ordaining that the coins of bronze or mixed metal, with the new design therein described, shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

A PROCLAMATION.

Victoria, R.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-third year of Our Reign, intituled *An Act to Consolidate and Amend the Law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint*, it is amongst other things enacted:

That We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, shall from time to time by Proclamation determine the design of any coin:

We have, therefore, thought fit to order that the coins of bronze or mixed metal made at Our Mint, which are mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight specified in that Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:

That every penny should have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription, "Victoria Dei. Gra. Britt. Regina Fid. Def., Ind. Imp.," and for the reverse impression the figure of Britannia seated upon a rock in the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock, while in her left hand she grasps a trident, and the inscription "One Penny," with the date of the year and a plain edge; and that every half-penny should have the same obverse impression and inscription, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated as described for the penny, and the inscription "Halfpenny," with the date of the year and a plain edge; and that every farthing should have the same obverse impression and inscription, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated as described for the penny, and the inscription "Farthing," with the date of the year and a plain edge.

And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there, in pursuance of orders which We have given for that purpose. We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid,

shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this Our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this eleventh day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in the fifty-eighth year of Our reign.

EXPLOSIONS FROM INCRUSTATIONS OF SALT AND ASHES.

The Board of Trade think it advisable to call the attention of persons employed in connexion with marine boilers, in which salt water is used in either large or small quantities, to the danger which may arise from the explosion of incrustations of salt and ashes, when leakage exists in any part of the combustion chamber or chambers. In several cases the Board have ordered formal investigations where loss of life has been caused by explosions of this kind, and, with a view to prevent such casualties in future, they desire to impress upon engineers of steam-ships the necessity of giving strict attention to boilers in which any leak is known to exist, and of promptly removing any accumulation of salt or ashes which may be observed in the combustion chambers. The Board also wish to point out the necessity of taking such steps as will insure the leak being effectually stopped.—(Board of Trade, April, 1895.)

REMOVAL OF MANHOLE-DOORS, ETC., FROM BOILERS.

Having regard to the frequency of casualties resulting from the removal of manhole-doors from boilers, &c., which contain steam having a pressure in excess of that of the external atmosphere, the Board of Trade desire to call special attention to the necessity for adopting such measures as may lead to the prevention of injury or loss of life from this cause in future. The serious risk which must be incurred by any person who attempts to break a joint while steam, having a pressure greater than that of the atmosphere, is contained within the boiler, should be well known to all whose duties require them to manage or assist in the management, working, cleaning, &c., of steam boilers. When outside doors are fitted the danger is greater than with inside doors.

The obvious precautions to be taken while a door, &c., is being taken off are to ascertain, by means of the fittings, that there is no excess of pressure within the boiler, and also to provide for the escape of any steam which may accumulate within the boiler from any cause. This may readily and satisfactorily be done by lifting and allowing to remain open safety-valves or other valves or cocks which permit the escape of steam, &c., but the indications of the pressure gauge should never be solely relied upon to show that all excess of pressure is removed from the boiler while the work is being proceeded with.—(Board of Trade, February, 1895.)

SAFETY OF PERSONS WHILE IN BOILERS OF VESSELS.

The attention of the Board of Trade has been called to the serious risk incurred by their engineer surveyors and by other persons whose duties require them to enter a boiler when it is possible to connect it with another boiler containing steam.

Cases have occurred in which, either through carelessness or the ignorance of some unqualified person, a stop-valve has been opened, and fatal results have followed.

The Board expect their own officers to insist upon the adoption of such precautions to insure their safety from scalding as they may think reasonable, either by requiring the stop-valves or cocks to be secured by lock and key, or by some other satisfactory method, before they enter a boiler under the conditions referred to. At the same time, the Board desire to urge owners, masters, engineers, &c., of vessels to adopt proper precautions during the time that any person is in a boiler under their charge.

The Board have had brought to their notice several methods which would prevent casualties arising from this cause, and it is believed that owners and others will have no difficulty in carrying out the Board's wishes in the matter, and thereby prevent unnecessary injury and loss of life.—(Board of Trade, January, 1895.)

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.—
REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

Regulation No. 194 of Part 2 of the Regulations of the said Commissioners is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is made:—

No coal, whether in bulk or in bags, which shall be discharged or landed on the Coal Wharf, on the south side of the River Yarra, shall be stacked or placed or deposited upon such wharf in stacks or heaps of a greater height than 6 feet.

This Regulation shall be read and construed with and form part of Part 2 of the Regulations of the said Commissioners passed on the 30th day of November, 1891.

SMALL-POX ON BOARD THE STEAM-SHIP "LUSITANIA."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other circumstance of danger to the public health, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *Lusitania* is about to arrive in Victorian waters: And whereas a case of the contagious disease known as small-pox occurred on board the said steam-ship on her voyage from Albany to Adelaide and was on board until the 13th instant: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship, on arrival in Victorian waters, shall be detained and anchored at the outer anchorage, Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, except the passengers by her for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or persons authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in

conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, lastly, that all persons landed from the said steam-ship shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

A By-law of the Shire of Boroondara, made under Part III. of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 14, for amending By-law No. 3, and for repealing portions thereof, and for providing for the registration of persons carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and for fixing the fees to be paid for each such registration.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Boroondara, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, do hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 14 of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1896.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.
3. Clause 4 of By-law No. 3, made by the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Boroondara on the 19th day of May, 1886, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
4. The said By-law No. 3 shall be and the same is hereby amended in the following respects, viz.—The words "Local Board of Health," wherever the same occur, shall be repealed, and the word "Council" shall be substituted therefor and read in lieu thereof.
5. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of January in each and every year, register himself by signing and forwarding to the said council a form of application as set out hereunder.
6. Every such person shall with every such application pay to the said council a fee in accordance with the following scale:—

Any person who at any time during the currency of his registration shall increase the number of cows kept beyond the number set out in his application for registration shall forthwith pay to the council such additional sum as may be required to make his registration fee up to the amount provided in the scale of fees for such increased number of cows, and until such further payment is made he shall be deemed to be unregistered.

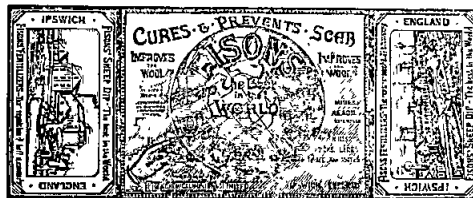

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following By-law, and all By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Combined Rail and Steamer Tickets at times agreed upon during winter season:—

2. Sleeping-car Tickets, Portland line, First Class, 4s. 6d.; Second Class, 2s. 6d. each.
3. Teachers and Governesses may be issued Holiday Excursion Tickets during the Christmas, Easter Midwinter, and Michaelmas School Vacations, on presentation of usual certificate from principal or employer. This also applies to bookings between Victoria and New South Wales stations.
4. Officers and men in the permanent employ of the Naval Forces may obtain Suburban Periodical Tickets at half rates, from their homes in Melbourne or Suburbs to Port Melbourne or Williamstown Piers, on presentation of voucher counter-signed by the Paymaster.
5. A rebate of £2 2s. may be allowed to the Commercial Travellers' Association of Victoria on each First Class All-Lines Annual Ticket taken out by its members during the period 1st January, 1894, to 31st December, 1895.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Rabbits, dead, by Goods trains, to be charged B Class Rate for the first 100 miles, plus A Class Rate for any extra distance.

8. By-law 123, clause 40—Include also Honey for export.
9. Beehives, in truck-loads of 3 tons or under, to be charged 1s. 3d. per mile, minimum 20s. Excess weight to be charged for *pro rata*, whether one or more trucks used. Minimum rate per ton 6s. 8d., minimum charge same as First Class.
10. Iron Rails, railway and tram, in truck-loads of 6 tons or upwards, to be charged B Class Rate.
11. Wattle Bark, from Coleraine line stations to Geelong, to be charged 20s. per ton, and to Melbourne 23s. per ton. Minimum 5 tons per truck.

Consignees of Grain and Flour for shipment must have some one at the ship's side to settle any objections raised as to condition, as, being carried at owner's risk, the Department is not responsible for condition. REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination :—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the

United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visé voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.—
REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Water Act 1890*, and of every other right, title, or power in anywise enabling it in that behalf, the Corporation styled "The Ballarat Water Commissioners" doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say :—

- Visitors will be allowed access to the Gong Gong and Kirk's Reserves only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of each day.
- Public conveyances or vehicles used for hire will be permitted to enter the reserve known as "Kirk's" for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, but must retire to such stand or portion of the reserve as may be set apart for such conveyances, or as may be pointed out by the caretaker or other employes of the Commissioners, and in no case, and under no pretext, will the owners or persons in charge of such vehicles be permitted to ply for hire from any other stand or place within the reserves.
- Private or public vehicles conveying visitors will be permitted to enter or pass through such portions of the water reserves as the Commissioners may from time to time approve, but drivers of such vehicles and visitors will be held personally responsible for the properly closing and fastening of any gate or gates opened or passed through by them.
- No fires shall be lighted in any part of the water reserves except in such places as are specially provided for the purpose, and in the event of injury or damage being done to the works, buildings, fences, plantations, trees, shrubs, timber, grass, or other property of the Commissioners, by or through the lighting of any fire upon any lands belonging to the Commissioners, the person or persons causing the same will be held responsible for the same.
- No person shall wash utensils, cloths, or clothes, or throw any live or dead animal, empty bottles, tins, rubbish, refuse, debris, stones, sticks, or thing of any kind whatsoever, in or into any of the reservoirs, aqueducts, channels, creeks, or other water supply works belonging to or under the control of the Commissioners.
- No person shall commit a nuisance or deposit offensive matter on the reserves, or do any act or thing whereby the water is or may be defiled, polluted, obstructed, or otherwise interfered with.
- No person shall wade or stand in the water in the reservoirs, in the aqueducts, races, channels, or other works in connexion with the water supply.
- No person shall enter or stand upon or within the lines of high water of any of the reservoirs, or shall stand, walk, or run up or down the outer or inner slopes of the dams or reservoir embankments.
- No person shall angle for fish or shoot or snare wild fowl in or upon any of the reserves, reservoirs, or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any fish or wild fowl therefrom.
- All dogs found upon lands reserved for water supply purposes shall be liable to be destroyed.
- No person shall remove any timber, firewood, trees, shrubs, grass, stone, gravel, sand, earth, or other material from the lands vested in or under the control of the Commissioners, or erect any

dwelling, tent, booth, shed, or other structure thereon, or sell any refreshments or other commodities within the reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Commissioners.

12. No person shall enter or remain in any of the reserves or upon any of the lands under the control of the Commissioners who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

13. Each and every person who enters upon the land vested in the Commissioners does so at his or her own risk.

14. The Ballarat Water Commissioners will not hold themselves responsible for accident, arising from any cause whatsoever, that may occur or happen to any visitor to the water reserves and works.

15. If any person commit a breach of any of the above Regulations he shall be liable to fine or to such penalties as the law provides.

METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

Regulations.—Compensation in case of Accident or Death from Accident.

1. For the purpose of providing a fund for the payment of compensation in cases of accidents to members of brigades, or where death ensues therefrom, to their wives and families, the Board may from time to time set aside out of its revenue such sum or sums as it shall think necessary not exceeding Five hundred pounds in any one year, and such fund shall be invested in such manner as the Board may from time to time direct, and the Board may from time to time at its discretion expend any portion of the said fund in payment of such compensation either in one sum or by periodical payments as the Board shall think just.

2. The Board shall mean the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board.

3. The above Regulations shall take effect as from the 1st day of January, 1893.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Thistle Act 1893*, I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare certain plants, named respectively *Rosa Rubiginosa*, commonly known as "Sweet Briar," and *Ulex Europæus*, commonly known as "Furze," to be thistles within the meaning of the *Thistle Act 1890* throughout the Shire of Dandenong.
