SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 2nd December, 1895, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

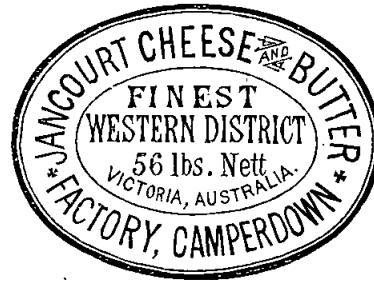

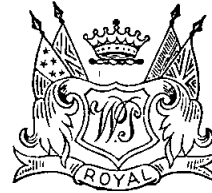

The births of 1,195 children, viz., 623 boys and 572 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was, it will be observed, 88 higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year, but fewer than in any other previous years shown in the above statement, except 1886 and 1894, and about a fourth less than the maximum recorded, viz., in 1890. It was, moreover, 155 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 187 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 476, viz., 256 of males and 220 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 719, or 151 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, fewer by 73 than in the corresponding month of the previous year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years. They were, moreover, 136 below the average of September during the previous ten years, and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 150.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 32.24, and of deaths registered 12.84 per annum; as compared with averages for the same month during the last ten years of 37.20 and 16.84 respectively, and averages for the whole year of 35.20 and 18.88.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 75.8° on the 11th, and the lowest was 36.8° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (52.6°) was four-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.0°) took place on the 11th, and the least range (7.3°) on the 16th. The mean daily range was 17.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.395 inches on the 26th, and the lowest was 29.627 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.027 inches) was about one-ninth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.93 inches, or one-sixteenth of an inch above that in September, 1895, but about one-ninth of an inch below the average of the month during the previous ten years. During the first nine months of the current year the rainfall amounted to 22.51 inches, or 8.48 inches higher than in the corresponding period of 1895, and 5.58 inches above the average of the period during the last ten years.

Males contributed 54 per cent, and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. to that mortality, as against 22 per cent. in September, 1895; 30 per cent. in September, 1894; 29 per cent. in September, 1893; 29 per cent. in September, 1892; 33 per cent. in September, 1891; and 35 per cent. in September, 1890. The low mortality of children is consequent on the fall in the birth rate.

In contrast to the diminished proportion of deaths of children under 5 years, there has been a marked increase in that of adults at dependent or non-supporting ages—i.e., of 65 and upwards—during the last four years. Thus it has increased from an average of 14.7 per cent. in September of the years 1886 to 1890, to 24 per cent. in September, 1895 and 1896. This circumstance may fairly be taken as an indication that the proportion of aged persons in the population has also increased, partly in consequence of the decrease in the proportion of children, and partly of the emigration of adults at the supporting ages, 15 to 65.* The following are the proportions for September in each of the last eleven years:—

Fifty-five deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of congestion of the brain; a fellmonger, aged 75, of pericarditis; a groom, aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a gentleman, aged 76, of apoplexy; a clergyman, aged 76, of syncope; a bushman, a cook, and a maltster, each aged 76, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 76, of enteritis and Bright's disease respectively; a female, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a bootmaker, aged 77, of senile gangrene; a gentleman, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a male, of no occupation, aged 79, of phthisis; a female, aged 79, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 79, of nephritis; a farmer, aged 80, and a female, aged 81, of paralysis; two clergymen and a female, each aged 81, of heart disease; two females, each aged 81, of bronchitis and pneumonia respectively; a joiner, aged 82, of rheumatism; a female, aged 82, of syncope; a housekeeper, aged 82, and a female, aged 83, of heart disease; two females, each aged 83, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 84, of hypertrophy of the heart and bronchitis respectively; a saddler, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 84, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 84, of burns; two females, each aged 85, of cancer, and fracture of the thigh caused by a fall, respectively; a mariner, aged 86, of softening of the brain; a bill-poster, aged 86, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a farmer, aged 88, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 88, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 95, of syncope; a female, aged 99, of hernia; a dressmaker and a female, each aged 75, a female, aged 76, a labourer, aged 77, a labourer and a female, each aged 81, a female, aged 83, two females, each aged 85, and a labourer, aged 89, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 19 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths—A boy, aged 11, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a horse falling on him; a foreman, aged 45, of fracture of the leg, caused by an accident with a steam plough; a female, aged 85, of fracture of the thigh, the result of a fall; a boy, aged 7, and three females, aged 20, 53, and 84 respectively, of burns; a boy, aged 8, was accidentally drowned in a water-hole; and a Custom's watchman, aged 52, in the River Yarra; a female, aged 20, a seaman, aged 25, a miner, aged 48, a male, of unknown occupation, aged 55, and a painter, aged 30, were found drowned—the four first in the River Yarra, and the last in the Albert Park Lagoon; a male infant, aged 3 months, was suffocated by food; three female infants, aged 4 days, 2 weeks, and 3 months respectively, were overlain; and a male infant, aged 10 months, died of puncture of the heart by a needle, believed to have been accidental. The homicidal death was that of a boy, aged 8, who died of fracture of the ribs and injury to the lungs, through having been run over by a cart negligently driven; a verdict of manslaughter having been returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 25, and a hairdresser, aged 54, who shot themselves; a labourer, aged 64, who cut his throat; a labourer, aged 25, and an accountant, aged 39, who poisoned themselves; and a miner, aged 60, who drowned himself.

One hundred and twenty-three deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne, 13 in the Alfred, 1 in St. Vincent's, 2 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 6 in the Homeopathic, and 5 in the Austin Hospitals; 6 in the Metropolitan and 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 20 in the Benevolent, and 1 in the Infant Asylums; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Deaf and Dumb Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 96, of which 54, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 42, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 71 were under one year of age, 11 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 380. Of these, 202, or 53 per cent., were males, and 178, or 47 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 33 were between thirty and thirty-five, 17 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 38 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 25 were between seventy and seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and eighty, 21 were between eighty and eighty-five, 10 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety-five and a hundred.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding period of the previous year, a diminished mortality occurred under all classes of disease; thus there was a decrease of 22 under zymotic diseases, of 19 under constitutional, of 10 under developmental, of 5 under local, of 3 under parasitic diseases, and of 7 each under the heads of violence and ill-defined causes. Under the zymotic class, deaths from diphtheria rose from 1 to 10; but those from influenza, fell from 26 to 3, from syphilis from 4 to 1, and those from other zymotic diseases from 11 to 6. In the developmental class, deaths from cancer rose from 27 to 40, but those from phthisis fell from 84 to 58, whilst there was also a decrease of 6 under meningitis, scrofula, &c. The decrease of 5 under local diseases resulted from a falling-off of 6 each under diseases of the nervous and respiratory systems, of 3 under diseases of the urinary system, of 4 under those of parturition, and of 4 under diseases of special sense and of generation; less an increase of 7 under diseases of the circulatory, and 11 under those of the digestive system. Under the head of developmental diseases, deaths from congenital malformations fell off from 6 to 3, and those from "old age" (not otherwise classed), from 19 to 13.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first nine months of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November; also that the mortality from diphtheria was higher in September, 1896, than in the corresponding month of any previous year since 1891.

GALATEA CHANNEL, KAIPARA HARBOR.

THE Harbormaster at Kaipara reports that the following changes have taken place in the depth of water at the entrance of Kaipara Harbor:—

At a distance of from 3 miles and a-half to 4 miles from the North Spit end seaward, and in a line with the leading beacons, the depth of water has shoaled to 4½ fathoms at low tide; and about one cable's length to the westward of this position the depth of water has shoaled to 2½ fathoms at low tide, and the sea breaks on it in ordinary rough weather.

Owing to these changes, masters of vessels are recommended to keep the beacons open to the southward when crossing the bar, and to pay particular attention to the semaphore signals.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS, 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement about Ten pounds annual municipal value and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.

10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities of the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges herein specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July—

- (1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds sterling or under according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.
- (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.
- (3) For each vacant allotment, Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation thereof.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be Twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the event of there being no such contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, or plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile, but not exceeding one-half of a mile from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed by the Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust this 21st day of September, 1896, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
- (4) Any person who may or shall obtain water or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.
- (3) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing from the 1st January, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on 1st July, 1897.
- (4) All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on 1st January, 1897, and 1st July, 1897.
- (5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE, HORSES, SHEEP, AND
DOGS INTO VICTORIA FROM QUEENSLAND BY
SEA.—PROHIBITION EXTENDED FOR A FURTHER
TERM OF THREE MONTHS.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay,

straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act, and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: And whereas by an Order made on the 14th day of July, 1896, the introduction of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs into Victoria from Queensland by sea was prohibited for a term of three months from the said 14th day of July, 1896: And whereas it is expedient to continue such prohibition for a further term: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, doth by this present Order continue such prohibition for a further term of three months from the 14th day of October, 1896.

FOORD'S PRIVATE CEMETERY, at Wahgunyah, be wholly discontinued on and after the expiration of three months from the date hereof.

WILLOW GROVE CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Willow Grove Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form, Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person, having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4 and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
