DENUNCIATION OF TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.

COMMERCIAL RELATIONS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.

Foreign Office, 19th August, 1896.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Dominican Republic, a note, dated the 14th ult., denouncing the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation, signed between Great Britain and Dominica on the 6th of March, 1850. This notice of denunciation, which is in conformity with the provisions of Article X. of that Treaty, as supplemented by the terms of the subsequent declaration of the 7th of September, 1850, has been accepted by Her Majesty's Government, and the stipulations of the Treaty, except those relating to peace and friendship between the two countries and their subjects and citizens, will cease and determine accordingly on the 14th of July, 1897.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 2nd December, 1895, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from Monday, the 23rd November, to Tuesday, the 1st December, both inclusive (Sunday excepted).

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing twice over before the right is issued: therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on the new list of ratepaying electors (now being prepared) for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners, who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so.

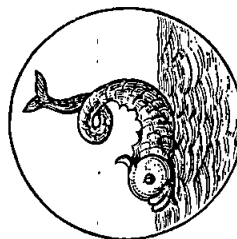

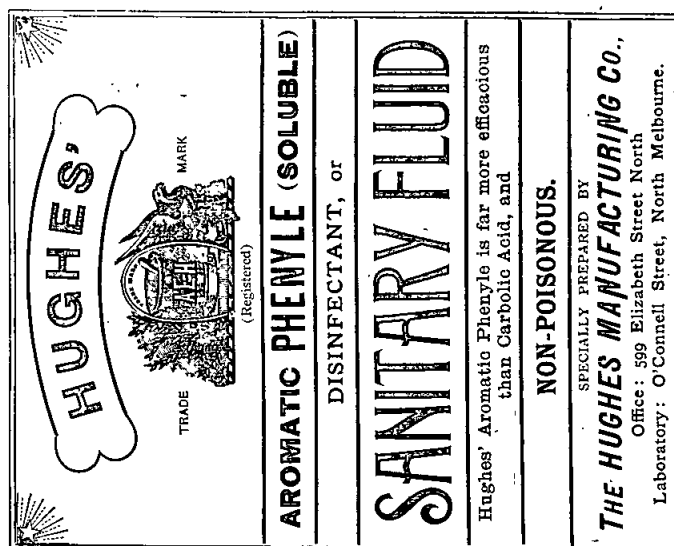

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS, 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement about Ten pounds annual municipal value and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.

10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

4. Tenements exceeding one quarter, but not exceeding half of a mile, distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities of the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges herein specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds sterling or under according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

(3) For each vacant allotment, Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation thereof.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be Twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the event of there being no such contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, or plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one half of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile, but not exceeding one-half of a mile from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.
