SIR,

With reference to Lord Knutsford's Circular Despatch of the 29th February, 1888, I have the honour to inform you that since that date the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, the Principalities of Monaco and Montenegro, and the Kingdom of Norway have acceded to the International Copyright Convention of the 9th September, 1886, and that Orders in Council were issued on the dates noted in the accompanying schedule extending to these countries, from the dates of the respective Orders, the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th November, 1887.

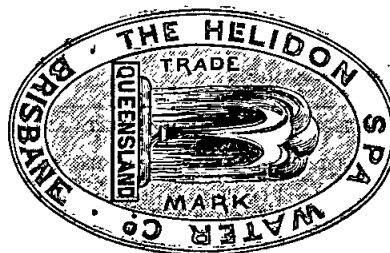

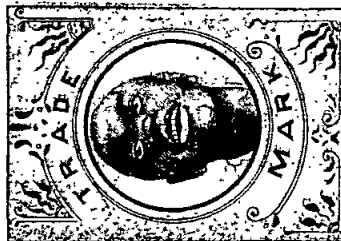

## REGULATIONS

FOR THE

LICENSING OF BOATS AND BOATMEN AND  
THE EQUIPMENT OF BOATS PLYING FOR  
HIRE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the *Marine Act* 1896 it is enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may licence boats plying for hire in any port, and also licence watermen, boatmen, or persons having charge of such boats whilst plying within any port: And whereas it is provided by the said Act, and by the *Marine Act* 1890, that the said Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, may from time to time make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire in any port, and for the licensing of watermen, boatmen, or persons having charge of such boats plying within any port, and for affixing penalties to any breach of any Regulations made by the said Board under the authority of the said Acts: And whereas it is expedient to make Regulations to provide that boats, other than boats propelled by oars only, shall be licensed, and also be safe and fit for the carriage of passengers, and restricted as to the number of passengers to be carried therein, and further to provide that every boatman, waterman, or other person having charge of any boat, other than a boat propelled by oars only, shall be required to hold a licence from the Board: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

These Regulations may be cited as "The Regulations for the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen and the Equipment of Boats," and shall come into force on the 15th day of December, 1896.

## GENERAL.

1. *Licence Fee.*—A fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Board by the applicant and forwarded with the application for the issue of any licence to be granted under these Regulations; provided that in any case where a similar amount has been previously paid to the Board purporting to be the fee for the issue of a licence it shall not be necessary to pay a fee for a licence to be obtained under these Regulations.

2. *Refusal of Licence.*—The Board may refuse to issue a licence under these Regulations without assigning any cause for such refusal.

3. *Cancellation of Licence.*—The Board may at any time cancel any licence issued under these Regulations without assigning any cause for such cancellation.

4. *Licence lost or destroyed.*—When any licence issued by the Board has been lost or destroyed through no fault of the owner, and satisfactory proof of such loss or destruction has been furnished, a duplicate may be issued on payment of a fee of One shilling. A declaration as to such loss or destruction must be made by the applicant and forwarded to the secretary to the Marine Board.

5. *Penalty.*—Any breach of these Regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

6. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of these Regulations the words following shall have the meanings set opposite to each:—

"Boatman" shall mean any person who may be engaged in the navigation or management of any boat as hereinafter described.

"Boat" shall mean any craft or vessel of any kind whatsoever which may be used for or engaged in the carriage of any passenger or passengers for hire or reward of any kind, but shall not include any boat which for the time being is propelled by oars only.

## BOATS.

7. *Boat to be Licensed.*—No boat shall ply for hire for the carriage of passengers, or shall be let out on hire within any port in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne, as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, unless such boat be duly licensed by the Board in the form prescribed in Schedule III. hereto, and in accordance with these Regulations.

8. *Application for Licence.*—Any person desiring to obtain a licence under these Regulations for any boat shall make application to the Secretary to the Board on the form set out in Schedule I. hereto.

9. *Inspection of Boat before Issue of Licence.*—Before any boat can be licensed the same must be inspected by such officer or person as the Board may appoint for the purpose, and such officer or person shall, if he considers any boat suitable for the purpose of carrying passengers, and properly equipped therefor, give his certificate accordingly in the form provided in Schedule II. to these Regulations.

10. *Inspection of Boat from time to time.*—Any officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose may, from time to time, inspect any boat licensed under these Regulations, and shall be afforded every facility by the owner or person in charge to make such inspection.

11. *Number of Passengers—How determined.*—Before being licensed, every boat shall be measured by an officer of the Board or person appointed for the purpose, and the number of adults which the said boat may carry shall be in the proportion of one to each 18 inches of sitting room, provided that such sitting room shall be clear of all interference with the proper working of the boat. For the purposes of this Regulation two (2) children under twelve years of age shall be reckoned as equal to one adult.

12. *Particulars to be painted on Boat.*—Each boat licensed under these Regulations shall be assigned a number by the Secretary, which number the owner of such boat shall cause to be painted upon the bows thereof in figures of not less than 4 inches in height; each boat shall also have the name thereof painted plainly on the outside of the stern, and on the inside thereof there shall be painted in letters or figures of not less than 2 inches in height the maximum number of passengers such boat is licensed to carry.

13. *Particulars—How to be painted.*—All such letters or figures shall be painted in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground.

14. *Certificate of Officer.*—No licence shall be issued until a certificate, as prescribed in Schedule II. hereto, has been forwarded to the Board by the proper officer that the requirements of these Regulations have been fully complied with.

15. *Crew.*—If any owner or person having charge of any boat shall permit such boat to be used in the conveyance of any passengers for hire or reward of any kind, without being in charge of a crew of duly licensed boatman, of the number specified in the licence granted to such boat, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations, and punishable accordingly, and the licence for such boat may be cancelled.

16. *Exemption.*—The Regulation next preceding (No. 15) shall not apply in cases where a boat is specially engaged by one or more persons who is or are willing to undertake the whole charge and responsibility of the same; provided that no owner or other person in charge shall let any boat out for hire unless he is satisfied that the applicant or applicants is or are capable of navigating the said boat under sail. A book is also to be kept in which is to be recorded the name and address of the hieer.

17. *Buoyancy, Equipment, &c.*—Every licensed boat, while plying for hire in the carriage of passengers, shall be fitted in such a manner that she shall have on board such material as will create an internal buoyancy sufficient to prevent the boat and passengers therein from sinking should any accident occur; and such buoyant material shall be in the proportion of not less than one-half cubic foot for each passenger such boat is licensed to carry; and such boat shall be properly equipped with a full complement of masts, sails, seats, and all other gear necessary to the safe navigation of the boat; and any owner, or person in charge of any boat, who allows her to be used without being provided or

equipped as required by these Regulations, shall be deemed guilty of a breach thereof, and punishable accordingly; provided that in any case in which in the opinion of the Board it may not be practicable for any such boat to be fitted with material to create internal buoyancy sufficient to prevent such boat and passengers therein from sinking should any accident occur, then every such boat in lieu thereof shall be equipped with an approved life-belt for every person licensed to be carried.

18. *Boat and Gear to be maintained in Good Order.*—Every licensed boat shall, while she continues to be licensed, be kept in good order and repair, both as regards hull and working gear, by the owner or person in charge thereof; and, if at any time the officer appointed by the Board to make an inspection of such boat shall report to the Board that this Regulation has not been complied with, the licence shall be immediately withdrawn and cancelled.

19. *Boat to be Ballasted.*—Every boat, when employed in the carriage of passengers for hire or reward, shall be ballasted to the satisfaction of the officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose, and such ballast shall be properly secured to prevent the same from shifting.

20. *Property of Passengers left in Boat.*—All goods and property left in any licensed boat shall be handed over by the person in charge thereof to the nearest officer of police as soon as practicable after such has been found.

21. *Care of Boats let out on Hire.*—The person or persons to whom a sailing boat is let on hire shall be held responsible for such boat, and also for the observance of these Regulations until such boat is taken back and returned to the owner or other person from whom hired.

22. *Change of Ownership.*—In all cases change of ownership of any boat licensed under these Regulations shall be immediately reported in writing to the Secretary to the Marine Board.

#### BOATMEN.

23. *Boatmen to be Licensed.*—No person shall ply for hire or reward of any kind as a boatman within the limits of any Victorian port outside of the port of Melbourne as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* unless he be the holder of a licence issued by the Marine Board in the form prescribed in Schedule VI. hereto, which shall be produced on demand to any officer of Customs, of police, or of the Board, or to any passenger who may desire to see same.

24. *Application for Licence.*—Application for a licence to ply as a boatman must be made to the Secretary on the form prescribed in Schedule IV. hereto; and the applicant shall forward, with his application, written evidence, showing that he is a person of good character, and that he is competent to have charge of or be engaged on board any boat employed in the carriage of passengers. Should such evidence not be deemed by the Board satisfactory in these points the application will be refused.

25. *Competency of Applicant.*—Every applicant for a licence as boatman must, prior to the issue of a licence, be required to satisfy the officer of the Board or other person appointed by them for the purpose that he is competent to have charge of and navigate a boat used in the conveyance of passengers; and such officer shall give his certificate to the Board as to the efficiency of such applicant in the form prescribed in Schedule V. hereto; and, should such applicant fail to satisfy such officer, his application will be rejected.

26. *Boatman to furnish Regulations on Demand.*—Every licensed boatman shall carry a copy of these Regulations, or any additions to or amendments thereof, which will be furnished to such boatman by the Secretary on application, or on being supplied with the address of such boatman; and he shall produce the same when required to do so to any person hiring his boat.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this 16th day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

## RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement about Ten pounds annual municipal value and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.
6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
9. For every water-tough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.
10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1859*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of October, 1896, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year

1897, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 20th day of October, 1896, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1897, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1897 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

2. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

The rate to be payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 23rd day of October, 1896.

**PORT PHILLIP.**

The port of Port Phillip shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters not included in the ports of Melbourne and Geelong respectively, north of and within a line bearing south 80° east from Point Lonsdale to Point Nepean.

**WESTERN PORT.**

The port of Western Port shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters north of and within a line bearing south 71° east from West Head to Grant Point, and also north of a line bearing north 45° east from Cape Woolamal to the opposite shore.

**ANDERSON'S INLET.**

The port of Anderson's Inlet shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters northward of and within a line bearing north 74° east from the Petril Rock to the opposite shore.

**SNOWY RIVER.**

The port of Snowy River shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters northward of and within a line bearing north 78° east and south 78° west, south of the entrance to the Snowy River in 12 feet of water.

**MALLAGOOTA.**

The port of Mallagoota Inlet shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters northward of and within a line bearing north 45° east from Bastion Point to the opposite shore.

**LORNE.**

The port of Lorne, Loutitt Bay, shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters west of and within a line bearing south 39° east from the eastern side of Erskine River until abreast of the jetty.

**APOLLO BAY.**

The port of Apollo Bay shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters west of and within a line bearing north 29° east from the eastern end of Hayley Reef to mouth of Wild Dog Creek.

## NITRO COMPOUNDS.

## Division I.

*Hercules Powder No. 1.*—Consisting of not more than 75 parts by weight of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, uniformly mixed or absorbed by 16 parts by weight of well-washed magnesia alba (prepared hydro-carbonate of magnesia), and 6 parts by weight of thoroughly purified wood-pulp. Such nitro-glycerine wood-pulp and magnesia alba being further mixed with 3 parts by weight of sodium nitrate.

The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality, when mixed in the above proportions, to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine.

## POLLING, ETC.

13. *Contested Election.—Second Schedule.*—Notice and time and place of poll.—If at the expiration of the time aforesaid the number of candidates shall exceed the number of members to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith transmit the names of such candidates to the Department, and the Department will cause ballot-papers to be printed with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form in the Second Schedule. The names of the persons so nominated, and notice that a poll will be taken for the election of such members on the day appointed for holding the election under the provisions thereof, and named in such notice, at the polling place or polling places, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at eight o'clock in the forenoon and close at five o'clock in the afternoon: provided that in the case of school districts situated within the metropolitan area as comprised within the City of Melbourne and the several other municipal districts specified in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890*, except the Borough of Brighton and the shires of Bororoondara and Caulfield, and in the case of such other school districts, outside of the metropolitan area, as may obtain the sanction of the Minister for the extension of time, the hour of closing the poll shall be seven o'clock in the afternoon.

#### REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE JAMIESON GOLD-FIELD COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd July, 1893, the managers of the Jamieson Gold-field Common having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of 5 miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable annually, in advance, on the 1st day of October in every year:—

For every steer or heifer, not over the age of eighteen months, One shilling and fourpence per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum.

For every sheep or goat, One shilling and fourpence per annum.

Progeny (not over the age of six months) of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free.

4. No entire animal shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the written consent of the managers.

5. All goats illegally depasturing on the common shall be liable to be destroyed.

6. No stock shall be removed from the common without first notifying the herdsman.

7. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for fourteen days shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

8. The managers and the herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock legally depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
