APPLICATION OF THE COINAGE ACT 1870, 33 VICT. CAP. 10, TO VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by virtue of an Act of the Imperial Parliament, 33 Vict. Cap. 10, being *The Coinage Act 1870*, Her Majesty the Queen, by the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation might lawfully direct that the whole or any part of that Act should apply to and be in force in any British possession with or without any modifications contained in the proclamation: And whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of an order made at the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, on the 1st day of August, 1896, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Her Majesty in that behalf, was pleased by proclamation dated the 1st day of August, 1896, which said proclamation is appended in the Schedule hereto, to proclaim, direct, and order, among other things, that those parts of *The Coinage Act 1870*, as amended by Section 2, and the Schedule of *The Coinage Act 1891*, which are set out in the said proclamation, should, as therein modified, apply to and be in force in (among other places) the Colony of Victoria, and that the said enactments, as modified, set out in such proclamation, should come into force in (among other places) Victoria at the date of the promulgation of the said proclamation in that colony: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my proclamation promulgate and proclaim in force in Victoria the proclamation of Her Majesty the Queen aforesaid and in the Schedule hereunder written.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

SCHEDULE. BY THE QUEEN.—A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WE do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

(1) Those parts of *The Coinage Act 1870*, as amended by Section 2 and the Schedule of the *Coinage Act 1891*, which are set out in this proclamation, shall, as herein modified, apply to and be in force in each of Our Colonies of New South Wales, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria, New Zealand, Queensland, and Western Australia.

(2) The said enactments, as modified, set out herein, shall come into force in each of the said Colonies at the date of the promulgation of the proclamation in that colony.

(3) The said enactments, as so modified, are the following:—

Section 1.—This Act may be cited as *The Coinage Act 1870*.

Section 2.—In this Act—

The term "Treasury" means the Lord High Treasurer for the time being, or the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any two of them;

The term "the Mint" means, except as expressly provided, Her Majesty's Royal Mint in England;

The term "British possession" means any colony, plantation, island, territory, or settlement within Her Majesty's dominions and not within the United Kingdom; and

The term "person" includes a body corporate.

Section 3.—All coins made at the Mint of the denominations mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act shall be of the weight and fineness specified in that schedule, and the standard trial plates shall be made accordingly.

If any coin of gold, silver, or bronze, but of any other denomination than that of the coins mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act, is hereafter coined at the Mint, such coin shall be of a weight and fineness bearing the same proportion to the weight and fineness specified in that schedule as the denomination of such coin bears to the denominations mentioned in that schedule.

Provided that in the making of coins a remedy (or variation from the standard weight and fineness specified in the said First Schedule) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the amount specified in that schedule.

Section 4.—A tender of payment of money, if made in coins which have been issued by the Mint in accordance with the provisions of this Act, and have not been called in by any proclamation made in pursuance of this Act, and have not become diminished in weight, by wear or otherwise, so as to be of less weight than the current weight, that is to say, than the weight (if any) specified as the least current weight in the First Schedule to this Act, or less than such weight as may be declared by any proclamation made in pursuance of this Act, shall be a legal tender—

In the case of gold coins for a payment of any amount:

In the case of silver coins for a payment of an amount not exceeding Forty shillings, but for no greater amount:

In the case of bronze coins for a payment of an amount not exceeding One shilling, but for no greater amount.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent any paper currency which under any Act or otherwise is a legal tender from being a legal tender.

Section 5.—No piece of gold, silver, copper, or bronze, or of any metal or mixed metal, of any value whatever, shall be made or issued, except by the Mint, as a coin or a token for money, or as purporting that the holder thereof is entitled to demand any value denoted thereon. Every person who acts in contravention of this section shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Section 6.—Every contract, sale, payment, bill, note, instrument, and security for money, and every transaction, dealing, matter, and thing whatever relating to money, or involving the payment of or the liability to pay any money, which is made, executed, or entered into, done, or had, shall be made, executed, entered into, done, and had, according to the coins which are current and legal tender in pursuance of this Act, and not otherwise, unless the same be made, executed, entered into, done, or had according to the currency of some British possession or some foreign State.

Section 7.—Where any gold coin of the realm is below the current weight as provided by this Act, or where any coin is called in by any proclamation, every person may by himself or others, cut, break, or deface any such coin tendered to him in payment, and the person tendering the same shall bear the loss.

If any coin cut, broken, or defaced in pursuance of this section is not below the current weight, or has not been called in by any proclamation, the person cutting, breaking, or defacing the same shall receive the same in payment according to its denomination. Any dispute which may arise under this section may be determined by a summary proceeding.

Section 11.—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to do all or any of the following things, namely:—

- (1) To determine the dimension of and design for any coin:
 - (2) To determine the denominations of coins to be coined at the Mint:
 - (3) To diminish the amount of remedy allowed by the First Schedule to this Act in the case of any coin:
 - (4) To determine the weight (not being less than the weight (if any) specified in the First Schedule to this Act) below which a coin, whether diminished in weight by wear or otherwise, is not to be a current or a legal tender:
 - (5) To call in coins of any date or denomination, or any coins coined before the date in the proclamation mentioned:
 - (6) To direct that any coins, other than gold, silver, or bronze, shall be current and be a legal tender for the payment of any amount not exceeding the amount specified in the proclamation, and not exceeding Five shillings:
 - (7) To direct that coins coined in any foreign country shall be current, and be a legal tender, at such rates, up to such amounts, and in such portion of Her Majesty's dominions as may be specified in the proclamation; due regard being had in fixing those rates to the weight and fineness of such coins, as compared with the current coins of this realm:
 - (10) To regulate any matters relative to the coinage and the Mint within the present prerogative of the Crown which are not provided for by this Act:
 - (11) To revoke or alter any proclamation previously made.
- Every such proclamation shall come into operation on the date therein in that behalf mentioned, and shall have effect as if it were enacted in this Act.

LEGAL PROCEEDINGS.

Section 18.—Any summary proceeding under this Act may be taken, and any penalty under this Act may be recovered—

In any British possession, in the courts, and before such justices or magistrates, and in the manner in which the like proceedings and penalties may be taken and recovered by the law of such possession, or as near thereto as circumstances admit, or in such other courts, or before such other justices or magistrates, or in such other manner as any Act or Ordinance having the force of law in such possession may from time to time provide.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Section 20.—The Acts mentioned in the first part of the Second Schedule to this Act are hereby repealed to the extent in the third column of such schedule mentioned, and those mentioned in the second part of the same schedule are hereby repealed entirely.

Provided that—

- (1) This repeal shall not affect anything already done or suffered, or any right already acquired or accrued.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF SWALLOW AND ARIELL LIMITED, BISCUIT MANUFACTURERS, OF PORT MELBOURNE,

for a period of six weeks from the 10th November, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than seventy females or more than seventy boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said seventy females and seventy boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 2nd December, 1895, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from Monday, the 23rd November, to Tuesday, the 1st December, both inclusive (Sunday excepted).

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the proscribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing twice over before the right is issued; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on the new list of ratepaying electors (now being prepared) for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners, who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so.

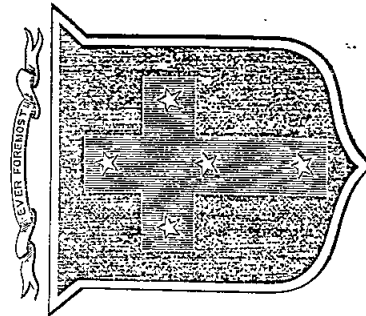

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.
2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.
3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.
4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.
5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.
6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.
7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.
8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.
9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

AVOCA WATER TRUST.—URBAN DISTRICT.—REGU-
LATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Avoca Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on a loan of £15,630, granted by the Governor in Council to such Water Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf. given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 10th March, 1885, a portion of the said Water Trust District was proclaimed an Urban District within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 20th day of October, 1896, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban District should be made for the year 1897, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 20th October, 1896, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban District for the year 1897, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual shire valuation of the said Urban District.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban District.
3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.
4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 23rd day of October, 1896.

PORTION.—REGULATION FOR 1897 BY THE BOARD
OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans. And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of October, 1896, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1897, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 20th day of October, 1896, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1897, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1897 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.
2. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

The rate to be payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 23rd day of October, 1896.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF THE SUM OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND POUNDS GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT TO PROMOTE THE AGRICULTURAL, DAIRY, FRUIT, AND WINE INDUSTRIES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of November, 1896.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Taverner

Mr. Foster.

WHEREAS by the *Treasury Bonds Act* 1896 (No. 1451), it is among other things provided that the sum of £35,000 to be raised by the issue of Treasury-bonds under the authority of the said Act may be applied for the giving of bonuses for dairy produce; fruits and honey of best quality and in best order exported to markets other than Australasian; for the construction of wineries in vine-growing districts and viticultural education generally; for the sowing and planting and cultivation of seeds or plants to be used for the manufacture of fibre, oil, &c.; also for the manufacture of the same; and for the manufacture of raisins, currants, and figs, to be expended under regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following regulations, that is to say:—

INTERPRETATION.

1. "Minister" in these regulations means Minister for Agriculture, or the Minister for the time being administering the Agricultural Department of Victoria.

BONUSES FOR EXPORT OF GREEN FRUIT.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act* 1896 a sum of £3,500 is hereby set apart to provide bonuses on green fruit exported from Victoria to markets other than Australasian.

2. Out of the sum of £3,500 so set apart a sum not exceeding £1,426 may be applied by the Minister in payment of bonuses at the rate not exceeding 2s. per case on green fruit exported with his approval from Victoria to markets other than Australasian prior to the 24th July, 1896, provided that in no case shall the Minister pay in respect of any fruit so exported a bonus at a rate exceeding £25 per cent. of the amount realized on the sale of such fruit in the country to which the same was exported.

3. Out of the balance of the said sum of £3,500 the Minister may pay to the person or persons beneficially interested in the exportation of the same a bonus at a rate not exceeding 1s. per case (such case to be of a size and construction to be approved by the Minister) of all or any kind of green fruit exported from Victoria to any market other than Australian subsequent to the date of these regulations, provided that in no case shall the Minister pay in respect of any fruit so exported a bonus at a rate exceeding £12 10s. per centum of the amount realized on the sale of such fruit in the country to which the same was exported.

4. Any person or persons qualified to receive a bonus hereunder desiring to participate in the bonus in respect of any shipment of fruit shall apply, in writing, to the Minister not more than one calendar month and not less than fourteen days before the date appointed for the departure of the vessel in which he or they propose to ship the same (unless the Minister shall dispense with the necessity for supplying all or any of such particulars), giving so far as he or they reasonably can particulars of the kind or kinds of fruit, number of cases, place to which the same are to be exported, name of vessel in which it is proposed to ship such fruit, and some place at the port of export, and a time not less than 24 hours before the shipping, when the same may be inspected by the person appointed by the Minister in that behalf.

5. Upon the receipt of an application hereunder the officer receiving the same shall note the date and hour of such receipt, and every application shall be considered in the order of its receipt. Receipt for the purposes of this clause shall be taken to mean the time when the application first reaches the hands of the proper officer in ordinary course.

6. If the Minister is satisfied upon the report of the officer appointed in that behalf after inspection by such officer that the fruit in respect of which the application for a bonus is made is of a marketable quality, and is in good order and condition and properly graded and packed for export, he may, having regard to other applications and the amount then available for paying bonuses, decide provisionally as to what bonus (if any) should be paid in respect of such application not exceeding the sum hereinbefore limited.

7. When the Minister has provisionally decided to pay any bonus he shall cause such decision to be notified to the applicant, who, if within six calendar months from the date of the receipt of the original application hereinbefore provided for, produces to the Minister proof of the export and the account sales of the fruit exported, obtained from the country to which the same has been exported, verified to the satisfaction of the Minister in such manner as he may require, the applicant shall be entitled to the payment of the bonus provisionally decided upon by the Minister, or if the sum so decided upon shall be at a rate exceeding £12 10s. per cent. of the amount realized on the sale of the shipment of fruit in respect of which the application was made in the country to which the same was exported, a bonus at the rate of £12 10s. per cent. of the sum so realized, whichever sum shall be the less.

8. In these regulations "fruit" and "green fruit" shall mean and include any fruit, not being a nut, the produce of any fruit tree or vine in Victoria in its natural state, and which fruit has not been subjected to any process of drying, preserving, or manufacture so as to alter its character.

BONUSES ON THE EXPORT OF HONEY.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act* 1896 a sum of £225 is hereby set apart, which may be applied by the Minister in payment to the person or persons beneficially interested in the exportation of the same of a bonus at the rate not exceeding 1d. per lb. on honey produced in Victoria of the best quality and in the best order exported with his approval from Victoria to some market other than Australasian prior to the 9th day of November, 1895.

BONUSES FOR RAISIN, CURRANT, AND FIG FACTORIES, £2,205.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* a sum of £2,205 is hereby set apart, which may be applied by the Minister in payment to any company, association, or individual of a bonus at a rate not exceeding £5 per ton for each ton of raisins, dried currants, or dried figs manufactured or produced by it, them, or him during the season 1895 from fruit grown within Victoria.

2. No bonus shall be payable in respect of any of the fruits aforesaid to any company, association, or person for any quantity less than half-a-ton (save and except in such cases where bonus has already been paid on half-a-ton under Act 53 Vict. No. 1046, when the Minister may pay for any quantity less than half-a-ton at a rate not exceeding £5 per ton), but the said Minister may, if he think fit, pay a sum at a rate not exceeding £5 per ton for any quantity of any such kinds of fruit, between half-a-ton and 1 ton, manufactured or produced by any company, association, or person during the season aforesaid, whether such quantity is the balance of a larger quantity in respect of which he has consented to allow a bonus or not.

3. The amount which the said Minister may pay to any one company, individual, or association in respect of any bonus hereunder shall not, together with any bonus or payment heretofore made to any such company, individual, or person under the provisions of Act No. 1046 exceed in the whole the sum of £100 for all classes of dried fruits.

4. No bonus shall be paid to any company, association, or individual in respect of any fruit for which the bonus hereunder has been paid to any other person, association, or company.

VEGETABLE OIL FACTORIES, £1,500.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* a sum of £1,500 is hereby set apart, which may be applied by the Minister in payment to any company, association, or individual (hereinafter referred to as the "manufacturer") producing or manufacturing vegetable oil of a quality approved by the Minister, the produce of plants or trees growing in Victoria, of a bonus at a rate not exceeding 1s. per gallon.

2. Any manufacturer desiring to receive a bonus hereunder for any vegetable oil shall apply, in writing, to the Minister, and unless the Minister shall dispense with the necessity for supplying all or any of such particulars, shall give particulars of the quantity and kind of oil and of the factory where the oil was manufactured, with particulars and capacity of the machinery or appliances in use, and of the number of persons employed therein, and of some place where the same may be inspected, the quantity measured, and samples taken.

3. Upon receipt of an application hereunder, the officer receiving the same shall note the date and hour of such receipt.

4. If the Minister is satisfied that the manufacturer has made out a *prima facie* case for consideration, he may direct some officer to inspect, measure, examine, and, if necessary, analyze such oil, and report upon the application.

5. If the Minister is satisfied, upon the report of the officer appointed in that behalf, that the manufacturer has made out a good claim for a bonus, and that such oil is of a good marketable quality and in a merchantable condition, and that the same has been manufactured at the manufacturer's factory, and is the produce of plants or trees growing in Victoria, he may, if he think fit, allow the payment of a bonus, and shall fix the amount of the same, having regard to other applications and of the amount then available for paying bonuses, but at a rate and for a sum not exceeding that in these regulations limited.

6. No application by any manufacturer for a bonus in respect of any quantity of oil less than 100 gallons shall be entertained.

7. In no case shall the amount of any bonus to be paid hereunder to any one manufacturer be more than £500 in the whole, provided further that where any individual, association, or company is an applicant for a bonus hereunder, any money paid as bonus hereunder to any other company, association, or individual in which the applicant, company, association, or individual is beneficially interested shall be taken into account in arriving at the sum of £500 herein limited as the amount payable to any one manufacturer hereunder, as if such payment had been actually made to such manufacturers, unless the Minister shall, in any particular case, otherwise expressly direct.

8. "Oil" and "vegetable oil" in these regulations shall mean oils of the following kinds, viz.:—Almond, castor, colza, earthenut, linseed, olive, sesame, brassica, and sunflower.

FLAX AND HEMP FACTORIES, £1,000.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* a sum of £1,000 is hereby set apart and appropriated, which may be applied by the Minister in payment to any company, association, or individual (hereinafter referred to as the manufacturer) manufacturing fibre of good quality and in a merchantable condition, the produce of flax or hemp grown in Victoria, of a bonus at a rate not exceeding £5 per ton.

2. Any manufacturer desiring to receive a bonus hereunder for fibre shall apply, in writing, to the Minister, and, unless the Minister shall dispense with the necessity for supplying all or any of such particulars, shall give particulars of the quantity and kind of fibre, and of the factory where the fibre was manufactured, with particulars and capacity of the machinery or appliances in use, and of the number of persons employed therein, and of some place where the same may be inspected, and the quantity weighed, and samples taken.

3. Upon the receipt of an application hereunder the officer receiving the same shall note the date and hour of such receipt.

4. If the Minister is satisfied that the manufacturer has made out a *prima facie* case for consideration, he may direct some officer to inspect, weigh, examine, and take samples of such fibre, and report upon the application.

5. If the Minister is satisfied upon the report of the officer appointed in that behalf that the manufacturer has made out a good claim for a bonus, and that such fibre is of good marketable quality and in a merchantable condition, and that such fibre has been manufactured by the manufacturer at his factory, and is the produce of flax or hemp grown in Victoria, he may, if he think fit, allow the payment of a bonus, and shall fix the amount of the same, having regard to other applications and the amount then available for paying bonuses, but at a rate and for a sum not exceeding that in these regulations limited.

6. No application by any manufacturer for a bonus in respect of any quantity of fibre less than 1 ton shall be entertained.

7. In no case shall the amount of any bonus to be paid hereunder to any one manufacturer, together with any sum heretofore paid to any such manufacturer under the provisions of Act No. 1046, exceed in the whole the sum of £500, provided further that when any individual, association, or company is an applicant for a bonus hereunder, any money paid as bonus, whether under these regulations or under any regulations heretofore in force to any other company, association, or individual, in which the applicant, company, association, or individual is or was beneficially interested shall be taken into account in arriving at the sum of £500, herein limited as the amount payable to any one manufacturer as if such payment had been actually made to such manufacturer hereunder unless the Minister shall in any particular case otherwise expressly direct.

GENERAL VEGETABLE PRODUCTS, £10,000.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896*, a sum of £10,000 is hereby set apart, which may be applied by the Minister in payment to the grower of the same of a bonus at the rate not exceeding £2 per acre of any of the following classes of plants sown in Victoria during the year 1895, or (in the case of a person who, during the year 1895, sowed any land with any such plants in anticipation of being allowed to apply to participate in a bonus the crop from which land failed for any reason) sown during the year 1896, that is to say:—Fibre plants—Cannabis (hemp), or Linum (flax) oil plants; Brassica (mustard and rape); Helianthus (sunflower), or Linum (linseed).

2. No bonus shall be paid under this regulation in respect of any area of less than half-an-acre.

3. The Minister shall not pay any bonus hereunder unless the seed was sown and the crop harvested to the satisfaction of the Minister.

4. No applicant for a bonus hereunder shall have his application allowed unless the produce of any sowing in respect of which a bonus is applied for has been converted into fibre or oil (as the case may be) of a marketable quality; or if such product has not been so converted, is of a marketable quality, and has been delivered at some mill or store to be approved by the Minister for the purpose of being converted into fibre or oil, as the case may be.

5. Upon the receipt of an application hereunder, the officer receiving the same shall note the date and hour of such receipt.

6. If the Minister is satisfied that the manufacturer has made out a *prima facie* case for consideration, he may direct some officer to inspect from time to time such crop, and take samples of the same, and of any fibre or oil made from such crop, and to report from time to time in respect of such application.

7. Any person desiring to receive a bonus hereunder for any plants, the subject of a bonus, shall apply, in writing, to the said Minister, and unless the Minister shall dispense with the necessity for supplying all or any of such particulars, giving particulars of the kind of plants and the area sown or to be sown, with the locality where the same is sown.

8. If upon the final report of any officer appointed in that behalf, the Minister is satisfied that the applicant has fulfilled all the conditions entitling such applicant to a bonus, and upon the applicant satisfying the Minister by such proof as the Minister may think sufficient, the Minister may, if he think fit, allow the payment of a bonus, and shall fix the amount of same, having regard to other applications and of the amount then available for paying bonuses, but at a rate and for a sum not exceeding that in these regulations limited.

9. In no case shall the amount of any bonus to be paid hereunder to any one individual, association, or company be more than £100 in the whole, provided that where any individual, association, or company is an applicant for a bonus hereunder any money paid as bonus hereunder to any other company, association, or individual in which the applicant, company, association, or individual is beneficially interested shall be taken into account in arriving at the sum of £100 herein limited as the amount payable to any such applicant, individual, association, or company as if such payment had been actually made to such applicant, individual, association, or company unless the Minister shall in any particular case otherwise expressly direct.

WINERIES, £8,000.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896*, a sum of £8,000 is hereby set apart, which may be applied by the Minister for the purpose of making advances to any company registered under the *Companies Act 1890*, having for its object, or one of its objects, the establishment of wineries in any of the vine-growing districts of Victoria, such company being one having a paid-up capital of not less than £2,000, to assist such company in building wine cellars, fermenting-houses, and appurtenances, and in purchasing and erecting vats, casks, stills, machinery, and appliances for the manufacture of wine and spirits from the juice of grapes grown in Victoria.

2. No greater sum than £2,000 in the whole shall be advanced to any one company.

3. No advance shall be made to any company until such company shall produce such proof as the Minister may consider satisfactory that it has expended £2,000 at least in constructing cellars, fermenting-houses, and appurtenances connected therewith.

4. Any company desirous of obtaining an advance shall forward to the Secretary for Agriculture an application in writing, with a plan of the company's buildings, a copy of the prospectus (if any), and of the articles of association; a list of the directors and shareholders, and such other particulars as the Minister may from time to time require.

5. No advance shall be made to any company in respect of any buildings, machinery, appliances, or utensils erected, constructed, or used elsewhere than on land, the fee-simple whereof free from encumbrances is vested in such company, nor until such company has executed a first mortgage or bill of sale (as the case may require) over its property, or over so much thereof as the Minister may deem sufficient to secure the repayment of the amount advanced, should the company not become entitled to the same absolutely.

6. The sum advanced to any such company under these regulations shall be by way of loan only in the first instance, but the same shall be subject to become the absolute property of the company at the expiration of three years from the date of the advance if the company shall satisfy the Minister by such proof as he may require that it has produced at least 20,000 gallons of marketable wine during each of the three years next subsequent to the date of the advance or an aggregate of 60,000 gallons of marketable wine during the three years next subsequent to the date of such advance, and that the company during the period of three years next subsequent to such advance was and still is *bonâ fide* engaged in the object for which it was established.

VITICULTURAL EDUCATION, £8,000.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896*, a sum of £8,000 is hereby set apart, which may be applied by the Minister for the purpose of viticultural education generally, and more especially for paying the salaries or fees of persons appointed, engaged, or employed as teachers of subjects appertaining to viticulture, and for defraying the cost of erecting buildings in connexion with viticultural education and for fencing land for vineyard purposes and the expenses generally connected with the maintenance of viticultural schools, and the furnishing and equipment of such schools.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3.
