ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to amend the *Aliens Act 1890*."
- "An Act to amend the *Game Act 1890*."
- "An Act to further continue in force Part III. of the *Employers and Employés Act 1890*."
- "An Act to refer certain matters to the Federal Council of Australasia for the exercise of Legislative Authority thereon."
- "An Act to authorize the Raising of Money for the Redemption of Victorian Government Stock and other purposes."
- "An Act to sanction the issue and application of certain sums of money as Loans for Water Supply and Irrigation Works in the Country Districts and for other purposes."
- "An Act to sanction the Expenditure of Moneys available under Loan Acts for Railways."
- "An Act to amend the *Poisons Act 1890*."
- "An Act to declare the Rates of Duties of Income Tax for the Year ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven and to amend the *Income Tax Act 1895*."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

FAREWELL SPIT LIGHT-HOUSE, WESTERN ENTRANCE TO COOK STRAIT.

Marine Department,
Wellington, N.Z., 4th December, 1896.

NOTICE is hereby given that a new tower for the light at Farewell Spit has been erected 176 feet eastward of the present tower, and that, in consequence of the removal of the apparatus from the old to the new tower, no light will be exhibited on the nights of the 17th and 18th January, 1897.

On and after the night of the 19th January, 1897, the light will be exhibited from the new tower, which is in lat. 40° 33' S. and long. 173° 2' E. as measured from the Admiralty chart.

The light (which is a revolving white light of the second order dioptric, attaining its greatest brilliancy once a minute) will show all round, except on the outer side of the western portion of the Spit from the light-house, where it is shut in by sand-hills.

Over the Spit end the light will be red, in order to warn mariners of their approach to that danger.

The light will be elevated 97 feet above the sea level, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye, it will be visible 15½ nautical miles in clear weather.

The tower is an open-framed iron structure, painted in alternate bands of red and white; and is 88 feet in height from the ground to the top of the lantern. The old tower will be taken down as soon as possible after the exhibition of the light from the new tower.

It is anticipated that the various magnetic bearings of the light in the new tower will correspond with those already published in regard to the old tower—that is, over the Spit end (that is, between the bearings of N.W. ¼ N. to W. by ¼ N.) the light will be red, in order to caution mariners of their approach to that danger; but should it be found that there is any alteration, due notice will be given as soon as the exact bearings have been ascertained.

From soundings recently taken by Captain Allman, of this Department, it has been found that the water has shoaled 2 fathoms in the vicinity of the Spit end as compared with the soundings shown on the Admiralty chart. These changes in the soundings extend from the Spit end in a S.E. by E. direction, nearly 2 miles.

Caution.—Vessels should not enter the sector of red light within a distance of 6 miles from the light-house.

All bearings are magnetic.

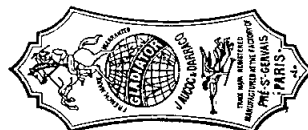

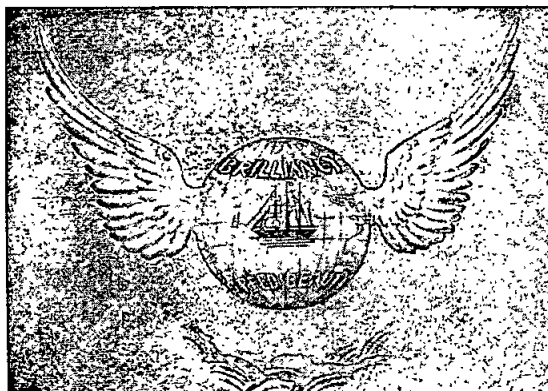

THE SHIRE OF ARAPILES, AND THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 373 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of, a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Arapiles is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire, that is to say, a sum of Five hundred and eleven pounds

seven shillings sterling (£511 7s.) for the purpose of paying interest on moneys borrowed by and liabilities transferred to the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: His Excellency the Governor in Council has therefore consented to the Municipal Council of the said Shire of Arapiles applying the said sum of Five hundred and eleven pounds seven shillings sterling (£511 7s.) from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which shall be paid in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

2. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(1) If for domestic purposes and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

4. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house-walls or carriages, or watering horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

7. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

8. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first fixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

9. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

10. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that no more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

11. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

13. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

14. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyabram Waterworks Trust."

15. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

16. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap, or in any way interfere with, any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be £1.

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under,

a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Five shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, Fifteen shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound sterling for any parcel of land within the boundary of the Urban Trust.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st of July, 1897.

For all tenements in the said Urban District, situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, One-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, One-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuations.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st of January, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1897, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st of January, and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz:—

REGULATION No. 17.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five per cent. per annum upon the municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to Four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.

7. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 12,000 gallons.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement, for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

10. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water motors, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract thereupon, the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

13. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

15. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive, according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1897 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of One shilling and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate, at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons, shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1897.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 2, 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, repeal the following Regulations heretofore made by them, viz.:—

Regulation No. 2, 1891, passed on the 24th day of November, 1890, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of December, 1890; Regulation No. 2, 1893, passed on the 3rd day of October, 1892, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of November, 1892; and Regulation No. 2, 1896, passed on the 19th day of November, 1895, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 2nd day of December, 1895; and do hereby, in further pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. No person receiving water from the Trust at or upon any premises shall allow any person to carry or take away any water from such premises, and no such person shall sell any water to any other person.

2. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust unto the premises of consumers shall be of the best galvanized quality, and all cocks shall be of high-pressure pattern, and all such service-pipes and cocks shall not be laid or connected with the pipes of the Trust until approved of, in writing, by the Trust's officer or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter; for the supply of water for all other than domestic purposes by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize, in writing, in each case.

3. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, and is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of any such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

4. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing an efficient self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

5. No overflow pipes to private baths shall be connected or affixed.

6. No water-closets shall be supplied direct from any main of the Trust, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

7. No extension or alteration of any service whatever will be permitted without the written permission of the Trust, and such extension or alteration shall be under the supervision of the Trust's officer or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, and no meter shall be affixed unless the same shall have been submitted to and approved of by the Trust or the Trust's officer or by such other person as may be authorized by the Trust in that behalf; and no meter shall be removed by any person without he shall give six clear days' previous notice, in writing, to the Trust of his intention so to do.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise as may be deemed expedient, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause or complaint remains or is not remedied.

9. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through the pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

10. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

11. Any person infringing these Regulations, or any of them, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Tatura Waterworks Trust.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable the one moiety on the 1st January and the other on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1897, and the 1st day of July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes, by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements of any one ratepayer of an annual municipal value of £25 and upwards in the aggregate shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity to lands and tenements of the aforesaid annual municipal value and upwards shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes, by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), to lands or tenements of any one ratepayer of an annual municipal value of less than Twenty-five pounds, Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be charged,

provided that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall in each case be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the 1st day of January, 1897, and one moiety on the 1st day of July, 1897.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

7. Clauses one and two of Regulation No. 1, made by the Commissioners of the Trust on the 6th day of December, 1890, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of December, 1890, are hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1897 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.—REGULATION No. 20.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

UNITED ECHUCA AND WARANGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Chairman and Commissioners of the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

REGULATION No. 15.

The Regulation made by the Trust on the 10th day of November, 1891, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 22nd day of December, 1891, and numbered seven (7), is hereby repealed.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for filling tanks or dams, or for irrigating, shall be paid for by measure unless where otherwise provided for in this Regulation. All measurements will be made by the officers appointed by the Trust.

2. No person shall make any outlet from the works of the Trust without its written authority or otherwise than under the supervision of and to the satisfaction of its authorized officer. Any person who shall make any outlet without the authority of the Trust or in any other manner than that authorized by its officers shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for every such breach.

3. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times and in such manner as the Trust or its duly authorized officers shall direct, priority being given in all cases to applications for stock and domestic supply over those for irrigation. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates on which it will be delivered to him, and the delivery shall continue at night and on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

4. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authority of the Trust or of its engineer or any person acting under his instructions. Any person not being duly authorized as in the last preceding clause who shall open any outlet or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for every such breach.

5. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust through each outlet for the purpose of filling dams or tanks shall be Five shillings for any quantity not exceeding 5,000 cubic feet, and Sixpence for each additional 1,000 cubic feet or fraction thereof.

6. The rate or price to be paid for water supplied from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Two shillings per acre for one watering, with a minimum charge of One pound (£1) for one watering, except in the following cases, viz.:—

For gardens and orchards of two acres and under in extent, One pound (£1) for the season (not exceeding four waterings).

For grass lands (surplus water only), One shilling per acre for each acre for one watering, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings for one watering.

A watering shall be taken to mean the supply from the Trust's channels of twelve thousand (12,000) cubic feet per acre, being an estimated depth of three (3) inches above the surface or any less quantity. Any excess in quantity per acre over twelve thousand (12,000) cubic feet will be charged *pro rata*.

7. The charges for water supplied shall become due and payable on demand immediately after such water has been received.

8. All persons before agreeing to take water from the Trust's channels are to construct proper drains or channels to convey it to their tanks or dams or to the area which they propose to irrigate, and in the event of any waste of water occurring on the route of such drains or channels the same shall be charged to and paid by such persons the same as if they had received it. The Trust may in any case refuse to supply water to any person until a proper drain or channel is made to take it.

9. No person shall interfere with any sluice-check, outlet, or other arrangement for regulating the supply of water in or from the Trust's channels or works, or shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein under a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for any such breach of this Regulation.

This Regulation shall take effect on and after the 1st day of January, 1897.

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or

brickwork and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon; and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons; the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the 1st day of January, 1897, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

That the said sum of £312 5s. be paid to the council in one instalment of £312 5s.

That the said sum of £312 5s. be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £312 5s. be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £312 5s. to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of £312 5s. be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Treasurer of Victoria for the time being within ten years, by annual instalments of not less than £31 4s. 6d. each. in a notice in writing to the lessee his executors administrators or transferees by the Governor for the time being acting with the advice of the Executive Council such notice to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns being delivered to or sent through the post office addressed to the occupier of the land for the time being And further excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth and stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under the said demised premises together with liberty for Her Majesty her heirs and successors and her or their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times during the continuance of this demise to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein or thereon for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to remove therefrom any gold silver auriferous and argentiferous earth and stone copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining Provided that the said land is and shall be subject to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals or minerals or of a mining or mineral lease to enter thereon and to mine and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those which persons so qualified had at the time of the passing of the *Land Act 1890* to mine in and upon Crown lands Provided that compensation shall be paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns by any such person for surface damage to be done to such land by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by law and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry Yielding and paying therefor in advance on the first day of _____ in every year clear of all deductions the rent calculated at the rate of _____ per annum until the first day of December One thousand nine hundred and three and for the period of ten years from the first day of December One

thousand nine hundred and three and for every successive period of ten years thereafter calculated at such amount per annum as shall from time to time be fixed by the Board of Land and Works. And the lessee doth hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns covenant and agree with Her Majesty her heirs and successors and with the Board that he the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will observe and perform and be bound by the several covenants conditions provisos agreements acts matters and things hereinafter contained (that is to say):—

1. That he or they will pay the rent for the time being payable hereunder at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. That if any rent payable under this demise be in arrear for one year he or they will pay interest thereon at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum and if such rent be in arrear for two years he or they will pay interest thereon at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum and if such rent be in arrear for three years he or they will pay interest thereon at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum and if such rent shall be in arrear for four years from the time when the same became due then these presents shall be absolutely void and of no effect. 8. That he or they will protect or cause to be protected from fire or other destruction to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works all belts or clumps of pine box or redgum trees growing upon the land hereby demised.

9. That he or they will within six years from the issue of this lease if not sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1890* enclose the land described herein with a fence and keep the same in repair.

10. That he or they will permit any person appointed in that behalf by the Board of Land and Works at any time to enter upon the premises hereby demised to ascertain if the conditions and covenants of this lease are being performed by the lessee.

11. That every holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals or minerals or of a gold-mining lease or of a mineral lease shall have the right and that the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will at all times allow every such person to enter upon the area hereby demised and every part thereof and search for gold silver and any other metal or mineral whatsoever as the case may be and to mine thereon and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery upon making compensation to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for surface damage to be done to such land by reason of mining thereon.

12. That he or they shall and will observe perform fulfil and be bound by the stipulations conditions covenants and provisos contained in the Schedule hereto or which may be made pursuant to the *Land Acts* from time to time by the Governor in Council.

And further that in the event of such resumption the lessee his executors administrators and assigns or any mortgagee or licensee will remove any improvements from off the land so resumed Her Majesty agreeing to pay the actual cost of removing such improvements or the amount of loss sustained in consequence of the relinquishment of any improvements not removable such cost or amount to be fixed by the Board of Land and Works and to be payable to such person or persons as it determines. Provided that no compensation for severance or for any person's interest in the unexpired term of the lease shall be given or allowed.

15. That he or they will pay to Her Majesty by half-yearly instalments of £ s. d. each the sum of £ s. d. being the amount determined by the Board as the value of improvements paid or payable by Her Majesty the Governor in Council or the Board to the previous tenant of the land hereby demised for improvements of a permanent character on such land and for such tenant's interest in the land hereby

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demised together with interest on any unpaid portion of such amount at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum payable half-yearly from the date of these presents until the payment of the last half-yearly instalment of such amount the payment of the first of such instalments and of interest to be made on the day of next and subsequent payments on the day of day of and the day of in each year until the whole amount be paid. That these presents are upon this further condition that if and whenever any part of the said rent or any interest or other payment of whatsoever kind covenanted to be paid hereunder shall be in arrear for thirty days whether the same shall have been legally demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants and agreements positive or negative by the lessee hereinbefore contained and this lease be avoided either by operation of law or by a determination of the Governor in Council hereinbefore provided then these presents and the term hereby created shall be void and of no effect and immediately upon these presents and the term hereby created becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiff of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors administrators and assigns and all persons claiming from under or through him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law. And that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceeding taken for or on account of the same by any person whomsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and licence in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming from under or through him or them to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceedings.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order repeal Chapter VI. (*Limiting the total Number of Hours in the Week during which certain Persons may be employed, and for providing a Weekly half-holiday for all Persons in certain Shops*) of the Regulations made on the 21st day of September, 1896; and doth

make the following Regulation instead thereof (that is to say):—

REGULATION.

CHAPTER VI.—LIMITING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF HOURS IN THE WEEK DURING WHICH CERTAIN PERSONS MAY BE EMPLOYED, AND FOR PROVIDING A WEEKLY HALF-HOLIDAY FOR ALL PERSONS IN CERTAIN SHOPS, AND FOR WAITRESSES.

1. Except as hereinafter provided, no person under the age of sixteen years, and no woman or girl shall be employed in any shop of any of the classes included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, for more than sixty hours, excluding meal times, in any one week, and no waitress in a restaurant, coffee palace, hotel, eating-house, or fish and oyster shop, shall be employed in any such place for more than sixty hours, excluding meal times, in any one week.

2. Any such person under the age of sixteen years or woman or girl or waitress may, with the written consent of the Chief Inspector, be employed in any shop or place mentioned in the next preceding clause, for any time not exceeding seventy hours in any one week, provided that the total number of weeks in any one year in which in any such shop or place, any such person, woman, girl, or waitress is so employed shall not exceed six.

3. Every occupier of a shop of any of the classes included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall permit each and every person whomsoever employed for hire or reward in any such shop, or at any work in connexion with such shop, to have and take a half-holiday from the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon on some Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday in each and every week.

4. The occupier of a chemist's shop shall not be deemed to have committed a contravention of the next preceding clause of this Regulation if he permit each and every person employed in his shop to have a holiday from Two o'clock to Six o'clock in the afternoon on Saturday in each week, and after Six o'clock in the evening of some other day (not being Sunday) in the same week.

5. Every keeper, proprietor, or occupier of a restaurant, coffee palace, hotel, eating-house, or fish and oyster shop shall permit each and every waitress employed on the premises of which he is such keeper, proprietor, or occupier to have and take a half-holiday from the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon on some Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday in each and every week.

 DISTRICTS.**

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council upon receiving a petition certified by the municipal clerk of any municipal district as having been signed by a majority of the bakers or butchers or vendors of milk respectively, having shops in such district, may make regulations prohibiting the delivery of bread or meat or milk (as the case may be) from a cart or in the street, or at any house or premises on any one specified day in each month, or on any specified afternoon in each week after One o'clock: And whereas petitions have been received so certified as having been signed in each case by a majority of the bakers having shops in the several municipal districts specified in the regulations hereunder praying in each case that a regulation be made prohibiting the delivery within the municipal district to which such petition relates of bread from a cart, or in the street, or at any house or premises on the day in each month or after One o'clock on the afternoon in each week (as the case may be) specified in the regulation following relating to such municipal district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

DELIVERY OF BREAD WITHIN THE CITY OF RICHMOND.

1. No person shall within the municipal district of the City of Richmond deliver, or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread from any cart, or in the street, or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each calendar month in the year.
2. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

DELIVERY OF BREAD WITHIN THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

1. No person shall within the municipal district of the Town of Brighton deliver, or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread from any cart, or in the street, or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each calendar month in the year.
2. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

DELIVERY OF BREAD WITHIN THE TOWN OF NORTH MELBOURNE.

1. No person shall within the municipal district of the Town of North Melbourne deliver, or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread from any cart, or in the street, or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each calendar month in the year.
2. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

DELIVERY OF BREAD WITHIN THE TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

1. No person shall within the municipal district of the Town of Port Melbourne deliver, or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread from any cart, or in the street, or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each calendar month in the year.
2. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

**DELIVERY OF BREAD WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF FLEMINGTON
 AND KENSINGTON.**

2. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

**ELECTION OF SPECIAL BOARD FOR FIXING THE
 LOWEST PRICE OR RATE OF PAYMENT FOR
 MEN'S AND BOYS' CLOTHING.**

UNDER the Regulations made pursuant to the Factories and Shops Acts, the Under-Secretary is the returning officer at elections of Special Boards; and "every candidate as a representative of employers on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by ten electors, and every candidate as a

representative of employes on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by twenty-five electors; and every nomination shall contain the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and the particular branch of the trade (if any) such candidate has a special knowledge of, and shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer so as to reach him before Four o'clock on the day of nomination."

As in the case of the Special Board for determining the lowest price or rate of payment to be paid for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing articles of men's and boys' clothing, the number of electors working outside a factory or work-room is not greater than one-fifth of the whole number of electors who are employes, electors working outside a factory or work-room will be entitled to vote for the full number of persons to be elected as representatives of employes, but will not be entitled to elect a special representative for out-workers only.

In the event of the number of persons nominated either as representatives of employers or as representatives of employes exceeding five (the number to be elected), the day for taking the poll (by voting-papers) will be Monday, the 18th day of January, 1897.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney; coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
