NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the above-named Act and the Regulations made thereunder, every person and company (other than a company under section 10 of the said Act) liable to make any return under the said Act or Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 29th day of February, 1896. And every company liable to make a return under section 10 of the said Act or Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of March, 1896.

And further notice is hereby given that every such return shall be addressed to the Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the Income Tax Office at Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Act liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Act the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

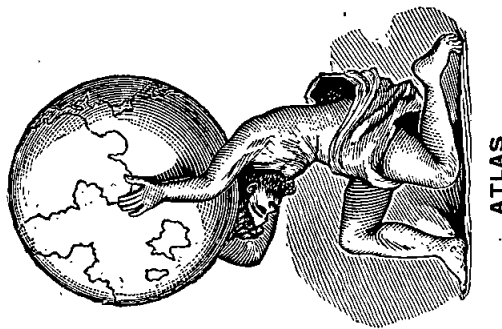

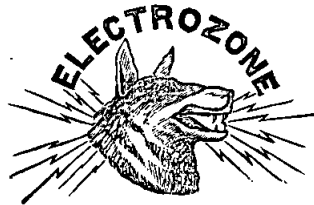

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE MANUFACTURE AND SALE OF TOBACCO, CIGARS, CIGARETTES, AND SNUFF.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of January, 1896.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1082) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind such regulations as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. All regulations previously made under Division 2 of Part II. of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* are hereby rescinded.

2. Premises will be appointed by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs factories for the manufacture of tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, and snuff, subject to the following regulations, and the Commissioner of Trade and Customs shall have power to revoke the appointment of any such factories whenever he shall think fit.

3. Every manufacturer of tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes shall apply in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the approval and appointment of premises as a tobacco factory; and such manufacturer shall furnish a ground plan and full description of his premises.

4. The following annual fees shall be paid quarterly in advance:—

- (a) For a manufacturer making tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, and snuff in quantities together exceeding 50,000 lbs. weight per annum, £150.
- (b) For a manufacturer making tobacco in quantities not exceeding 50,000 lbs. weight per annum, £5.
- (c) For a manufacturer making cigars and cigarettes in quantities exceeding 2,500 cigars or 10,000 cigarettes per week, £50.
- (d) For a manufacturer making cigars and cigarettes in quantities not exceeding 2,500 cigars or 10,000 cigarettes per week, £5.

5. A manufacturer (a) desiring to make tobacco, cigars, or snuff in quantities together exceeding 50,000 lbs. weight annually shall enter into a bond himself, together with two or more approved joint and several sureties, for a sum equal to double the duty-paid value of the maximum quantity intended to be stored in his factory at any one time, but no bond shall be for a less sum than £500; and such manufacturer shall not store at any one time in his factory a quantity of tobacco of which the duty-paid value is more than half the sum of such bond.

6. A manufacturer (b) desiring to make tobacco in quantities not exceeding 50,000 lbs. weight annually shall enter into a bond in the sum of £500 with several approved sureties not exceeding five in number.

7. A manufacturer (c) desiring to make cigars or cigarettes in quantities exceeding 2,500 cigars or 10,000 cigarettes per week shall enter into a bond in a sum of not less than £250 with several approved sureties not exceeding five in number.

8. A manufacturer (d) desiring to make cigars or cigarettes in quantities not exceeding 2,500 cigars or 10,000 cigarettes per week shall enter into a bond in the sum of £100 with several approved sureties not exceeding four in number.

9. The bonds required under section 5 of these regulations shall be in the form of the First Schedule and those required under sections 6, 7, and 8 shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto; and the conditions shall be as described in the said schedules respectively.

10. All unmanufactured tobacco transferred from a bond or from a ship to a factory shall be weighed by a Custom-house or Excise officer, and the duty payable thereon shall be paid prior to the tobacco being used for manufacture.

11. No manufactured tobacco, snuff, cigars, or cigarettes shall be removed from any factory until such shall have been weighed by a Custom-house or Excise officer, nor until the excise duty payable thereon shall have been paid according to law.

12. The minimum quantities deliverable at any one time from a factory, except from a factory the proprietor of which makes cigars and cigarettes in quantities not exceeding respectively 2,500 and 10,000 in number, shall be as follows:—

Tobacco—20 lbs. for home consumption or exportation.

Cigars and cigarettes—20 lbs. for home consumption and 10 lbs. for exportation.

13. No person shall take or remove any tobacco out of the premises of any tobacco manufacturer except between the hours of eight in the forenoon and six in the afternoon, and then only if he shall have a permit or locker's order to take or remove the same out of the said premises signed by the warehouse-keeper or other proper officer of Customs or Excise.

14. No tobacco, snuff, cigars, or cigarettes shall be delivered from a factory unless branded or labelled in accordance with the *Trade Marks Act 1890*.

15. Books of accounts shall be kept by each manufacturer showing the weight in pounds of leaf tobacco weighed into his factory, and the weight in pounds of manufactured tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes delivered therefrom, and the name and address of the person or firm to whom each delivery is made, and such books shall be open to inspection by any Customs or Excise officer when required.

16. Any warehouse approved and appointed by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs under these regulations may be entered at any time by day or night by any officer of Customs or Excise generally authorized for the purpose by the Secretary for Trade and Customs.

17. The duty may be remitted on stalks, refuse, clippings, or waste which may accumulate in any factory, provided that the same be weighed by a Customs or Excise officer and removed from the factory in his presence and completely destroyed to his satisfaction. The expense of all weighing and supervision necessary under this section shall be borne by the manufacturer.

18. A manufacturer of cigars and cigarettes liable to a fee of £5 (*d*) shall be allowed to manufacture on his own premises only and by his own labour a quantity of cigars not exceeding 1,500 per week, or of cigarettes not exceeding 6,000 per week, or he may employ one journeyman, with the assistance of whom he may manufacture a quantity not exceeding 3,000 cigars or 10,000 cigarettes per week.

19. A manufacturer of cigars and cigarettes, manufacturing under the last preceding clause, shall not work in any factory other than his own unless he ceases to work entirely on his own account during the full period he is employed in such factory, nor may any journeyman employed as above work in any other factory during the full period of his employment.

20. Any person employing a journeyman as above shall pay him the current rate of wages recognised in the trade, at the time any work is performed, as the ruling price for the particular class of work on which such journeyman may be employed.

21. Every manufacturer paying an annual fee of £5 shall forward to the Chief Inspector of Excise at the end of each quarter a return of the quantity of cigars and cigarettes made by him during the quarter.

22. The certificate to be given under section 184 of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* to registered dealers in tobacco, cigars, and snuff shall be in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto.

23. Every dealer in leaf tobacco shall keep a correct account of all leaf tobacco received into or delivered from his premises with the name and address of the person to whom each delivery is made and the quantity delivered to him, and such account shall be open to the inspection of any duly authorized officer of Customs or Excise when required.

24. No dealer in leaf tobacco shall knowingly sell or deliver any leaf tobacco to any manufacturer whose premises are not appointed a factory under the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*.

25. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs may by order approve and license persons to cut on their premises manufactured tobacco upon which full duty has been paid. The licensee will be required to enter into a bond with two sufficient sureties in the form in the Third Schedule hereto in the sum of £250.

annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be abso-
lutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose
tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and
contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days
of being notified that the documents are ready for execution.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful ten-

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway

decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-

of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner
increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent

mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to
absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have
full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be can-
celled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor,
or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway
station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation
of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have
become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter
had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 11th day of February, 1896, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. _____" indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

BY-LAW No. 40.

A By-law of the Borough of Maryborough, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and numbered 40, for the Regulation and Government of Drivers of Bicycles and other Velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough, order as follows:-

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall also constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle or any horse or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall whilst riding, driving, or impelling a machine proceed across any of the street crossings within the borough at a greater speed than 4 miles an hour.

8. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by Part VI., division 1, and Part V, division 1 of the *Water Act 1890* (amongst other things) make from the date hereof the By-law following:-

1. The by-law heretofore made relating thereto shall be and the same is hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates or charges due and payable thereunder.

2. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose, and the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall in all cases be by measure.

3. The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes is hereby determined as follows, that is to say:-

(a) For lands and tenements of the annual value of £20, the annual sum of £1.

(b) For lands and tenements above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(c) Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the annual sum of £2 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied at stand-pipes, 6d. per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) That water supplied by meter shall be charged at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate, and 1s. per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic the minimum charge will be for 10,000 gallons per annum.

(g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. All persons using or requiring a supply of water for other than domestic purposes shall consume the same by meter, and shall provide such meter of approved gauge at their own expense, and keep and maintain the same in good working order to the satisfaction of the officer of the council appointed for that purpose.

5. The keys of all meters in use within the water supply district shall be in the custody of the council, or such officer or servant of the council as the council may appoint for that purpose.

6. No overflow pipe to any private bath will be allowed. Any person permitting or allowing an overflow pipe to be attached to such private bath shall be guilty of an offence, and shall forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding £5, and for every day such person permits or allows any such offence to continue, shall forfeit and pay a further penalty of £1 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

7. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the council for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever unless where a meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure, and any person offending against this clause of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

8. Any person receiving water from the council, who, without the written permission of the council, shall take or carry away from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

9. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, cock, or fitting, connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

11. Before any such licence shall be granted by the council the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and shall furnish an approved security to the council, in the sum of £30 sterling, to provide for any damage he may do, cause, or allow to be done to the property of the council, and the council shall have power to cancel such licence at any time.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

13. No person but an officer or servant of the council, duly authorized in that behalf, shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main pipes of the council when required for the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto. Any person offending against this clause of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

14. For the construction of this by-law the word council shall mean the Borough Council of Wangaratta.
