OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1896.

- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

MANUFACTURE OF VICTORIAN PERFUMERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1895*, I hereby make the following regulations for the manufacture of perfumery from Victorian spirits:—

Persons desirous of using Victorian spirits free of duty for the purpose of manufacturing perfumery will be required to conform to the following conditions:—

1. Application for a general authority to manufacture must be made in writing, addressed to the head of the Department, giving the following particulars, viz., name of the manufacturer, his occupation, residence, and the premises (being a bond), in which he proposes to conduct his operations, and the nature of such operations.

2. Upon approval of such application the applicant shall give a bond in the sum of £500 with two sufficient sureties that he will conduct his operations in accordance with these regulations and strictly comply therewith.

3. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs may, without cause assigned, refuse to approve of any application made under these regulations.

4. The perfumery manufactured under these regulations must be solely and entirely of Victorian origin.

5. All such operations shall be under the control and supervision of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and the Warehouse-keeper.

6. A manufacturer (having complied with regulations Nos. 1 and 2) desiring to have spirits delivered free of duty for making perfumery shall apply in the first instance to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, stating the quantity he requires (not being less than 25 gallons), the purpose to which the manufactured article is to be applied and the origin of the oil and perfume he proposes to use in the manufacture.

7. The manufacturer shall further supply the Chief Inspector of Distilleries with any further information the latter may require and should such Chief Inspector not be satisfied on any point he may refuse to give the certificate referred to in the next clause.

8. Upon being satisfied as to the *bona fide* intentions of the manufacturer, the Chief Inspector of Distilleries shall give a certificate to that effect, and the spirit applied for may be delivered.

9. All spirit which has been mixed with perfumes and scents shall remain in the bond not less than sixty hours after the operation of mixing has been completed, and it shall during that period be subjected to frequent agitation.

10. The Chief Inspector of Distilleries shall have power to take reasonable samples of the ingredients used or the finished product for the purpose of inspection.

11. No perfumery shall be delivered except in vessels of a capacity not exceeding one quart, labelled and prepared for retail sale, unless the person taking delivery shall enter into a bond for at least twice the sum of the duty involved, the condition of which shall be that the perfume shall be bottled and prepared for the retail trade under the supervision of a Customs officer or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

12. In any matter relating to the above regulations the manufacturer may be required by the proper officer to verify any statement made in connexion therewith by statutory declaration.

GUIDES TO THE ANCHORAGES, POVERTY BAY.

THE Gisborne Harbor Board has notified that two leading-beacons have been erected to mark the approach to the anchorages at that port, and that the said beacons are situated 1 mile N. 61° 52' W. from the entrance of the Turanganui River.

The front or eastern beacon is 25 feet high, and has an altitude of 40 feet above high-water mark. This beacon has a triangular top. The whole of the triangle and part of the rectangle, also the lamp-house (at the base of the beacon), is painted black, and the middle portion of the beacon is painted white.

The back or western beacon is 30 feet high, and has an altitude of 50 feet above high-water mark. This beacon has a rectangular top, and is painted white; the lamp-house (at the base of the beacon) is also painted white.

These beacons, when in a line, will bear N. 30° 56' W., and S. 30° 56' E., magnetic.

By night two red lights will be exhibited—one from the summit of each of the above-mentioned beacons—and the said lights will be visible all round seaward as far as the land will allow.

On and after the herein-mentioned date the two original red lights will be discontinued, and two green lights will be used instead, and, when in a line with each other, will bear N. 19° 41' E., and S. 19° 41' W., magnetic.

There will also be exhibited from the end of the breakwater, on the same night, two vertical bright lights 7 feet apart, the top light having an altitude of 20 feet above high-water mark. These lights are for guides for vessels entering the river at night, and are also for the purpose of marking the extreme south-west end of the breakwater.

Sailing Directions.

Vessels approaching the inner anchorage by day should keep the two leading-beacons in a line N. 30° 56' W. until the flagstaff and the beacon on the breakwater are in a line, and bear from each other N. 19° 41' E., and then anchor in from 6½ to 7 fathoms of water.

Vessels approaching the inner anchorage by night should keep the two red leading-lights in a line N. 30° 56' W. until the two green lights are in a line, and bear from each other N. 19° 41' E., and then anchor in from 6½ to 7 fathoms of water.

Vessels wishing to anchor at the outer anchorage by day should get the flagstaff to bear N. 2° 48' W., and anchor in about 10 fathoms of water, 1 cable's length to the south-west of the line of leading-beacons.

Vessels wishing to anchor at the outer anchorage by night should get the high green light on the flagstaff to bear N. 2° 48' W., and anchor in about 10 fathoms of water, 1 cable's length to the south-west of the line of red lights.

All bearings are magnetic.

On and after the 31st day of December, 1895, the new leading-lights will be exhibited, and the alteration in the other lights will be made as herein described.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1896.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District, the water rate for 1896 shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1895-6, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Thirteen pounds, except such are entitled to the provisions of section 120, *Water Act 1890*.

2. All rates and charges on lands and tenements having no water meters, shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance,

that is to say, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1896. And all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed, payments shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1896. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1896.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement shall be made.

6. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where a charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load, *pro rata*, upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, by special arrangement with the Trust, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings, and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum, shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornaments, garden, or other purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

FIRST DIVISION.—292 SERVICES.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. *Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.*

3. *The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

12.
