PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revoke in part the Proclamation bearing date the 24th day of February, 1896, so far only as the same relates to the appointment of Wednesday, the 4th day of March, 1896, to be observed as a Public Half-holiday throughout the Town of Ballarat East; and in pursuance of the provisions contained in the said Act and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I do hereby appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:

WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Town of Ballarat East and the Shire of East Loddon;

FRIDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Alexandra;

MONDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Malvern;

TUESDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Bank Holiday at Lancefield;

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Town of Northcote, the Shire of Violet Town*, and the North Riding of the Shire of Euroa, and as a Bank Holiday at Daylesford, Geelong, Mooroopna, Violet Town, and Wunghnu;

TUESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Bendigo, the Boroughs of Inglewood and Port Fairy, the Shires of Avoca, Borung, Castle Donnington,* Charlton, Morwell, and South Gippsland, the South Riding of the Shire of Korong, and the East Riding of the Shire of Melton; and as a Bank Holiday at Bacchus Marsh, Bridgewater, Casterton, Euroa, Inglewood, Kilmore, Kyneton, Nagambie, Nhill, Numurkah, and Swan Hill;

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Bank Holiday at Omeo;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale and the Shire of Gisborne;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH, AND FRIDAY, THE 20TH, DAYS OF MARCH INSTANT,
as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Bright;

SATURDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Bank Holiday at Bright;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
as a Bank Holiday at Echuca and Portarlington;

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath ;
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the
Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act relating to Disease affecting Vegetation."

"An Act to regulate the Weights to be carried on certain Vehicles and for other purposes."

"An Act to amend the *Theatres Act 1890*."
