Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in vriting under the provisions of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1991), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

Broom Factory of Messrs. L. Feldmann and Company, at 37 and 39 Capel-street, North Melbourne, for a period of two weeks from the 18th March, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than five boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for nore than eleven hours in any one day, nor after fifteen minutes past Six o'clock in the evening on any day, in oreparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week, and in addition shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half.

3. That none of such boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their contents. consent.

4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

BY-LAW NO. 11, UNDER THE Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Mansfield, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

- 1. All closets shall be furnished with two night-pans of pattern and quality to be approved of by the Council of the Shire of Mansfield, or such officer as they may appoint, and the cost of same must be defrayed by each householder or occupier.
- 2. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed, by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf appointed from time to time by the said council; and such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied as the council may direct, and the contents deposited in such manner and place as authorized by such council.
- 3. Every householder shall use and cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable and effectual disinfectant or deodorant.
- 4. For the removal of night-soil every householder or occupier shall pay to the said council, for the removal of same, such sum per annum per pan as shall be from time to time fixed by the said council, and such sum shall be paid annually in advance to such person or persons as the said council shall authorize to receive the same.
- receive the same.

 5. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in that part of the shire within the following boundaries:—

 Commencing at a point being the intersection of the east side of Rowe-street with the northern bank of Ford's Greek; thence southerly by the east boundary of Rowe-street to its intersection with the south side of Malcolm-street; thence westerly along the south boundary of Malcolm-street to the north-east corner of allotment 70, parish of Mansfield; thence northerly along eastern boundaries (across Main-road) of allotments 67 and 59, parish of Mansfield; thence easterly along northern boundaries of allotments 58 and 36, parish of Mansfield, to their intersection with the north bank of Ford's Creek; thence north by the bank of Ford's Creek to the point of commencement.

 6. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of
- 6. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

ALTERATIONS IN DEPTHS, FITZROY RIVER.

NOTICE is hereby given of the following alterations in depths in the waterway, Fitzroy River, due to the recent severe flood,

FREMANTLE.—ROTTNEST ISLAND LIGHT.

EFERRING to Notice to Mariners published on the 17th September last, it is now notified by the Hon, the Premier of Western Australia that the temporary light therein referred to will be discontinued on the 17th March instant, and in lieu thereof will be exhibited the new permanent revolving light, which is of first order, showing single flash of white light of about three seconds' duration every twenty seconds, and eclipse of about seventeen seconds. of about seventeen seconds.

The new light is elevated about 264 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather at a distance of about 23 miles. Position of light—latitude, 32 degrees 18 seconds south; longitude—115 degrees 30 minutes 15 seconds east. Tower circular, built of sandstone, and of a neutral grey colour.

The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. On tickets issued as Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations and at the Central Booking Office, Flinders-street, bearing dates from 30th March till 8th April inclusive, the journey may be commenced on any day during that period, and the tickets will be available for return till 17th May inclusive.

Adelaide and Brisbane excursion tickets will be available by the express and ordinary trains, and the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the scats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half an hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and have the address so secured that it will not come off.

Horses and Vehicles.—From 1st till 8th April (both dates inclusive), the department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 1st till Sth April (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from roadside stations by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 6th, 7th, and 8th April, parcels must be at the Parcels Office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the

ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 3rd and 6th April will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. On 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 6th April, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Bendice, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid, and consignments must be at the stations 30 minutes before the starting time of trains. Consignors of fruit and other perishable goods from Melbourne are requested to consult the Goods Superintendent concerning the despatch of their consignments.

Sea-side Excursions.—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised. (See posters at stations.)

Extra Trains Available for Excursion and Ordinary Passengers.

PASSENCERS.

Northern System.—From 2nd till 8th April inclusive, extra trains preceding the ordinary trains will leave Melbourne for Bendigo, and Bendigo for Melbourne, as required. These trains will only stop at certain stations, notice of which will be given at Melbourne and Bendigo respectively. On the 2nd and 4th April an extra train, stopping at North Melbourne and at all attains from Braybrook Junction to Bendigo inclusive, will leave Melbourne at 3.35 p.m. Woodend and Daylesford Line.—On 3rd, 4th, and 6th April, an oxtra train will leave Daylesford at 7.40 p.m., and return from Woodend at 10 p.m. It will connect with

the last passenger train to Melbourne or Bendigo. Wycheproof Line.—On 2nd, 4th, and 6th April, a passenger train will leave Bendigo for Wycheproof at 4.50 p.m., and Wycheproof for Bendigo at 5 p.m. Ingleweed and Maryborough Line.—On 2nd 4th, and 6th April, a passenger train will leave Maryborough for Inglewood at 10.85 a.m., and return from Inglewood at 7 p.m. Avoca Line.—On 2nd and 6th April, the 10.20 p.m. train from Maryborough to Avoca, returning at 11.20 p.m., will be run the same as on Saturdays.

Western System.—From 2nd till 8th April inclusive, special booking windows at the seuth end of Spencer-street station will be open for the issue of tickets. On 3rd April, if required, an extra train will leave Melbourne for Geelong, Ballarat, and stations beyond at 6.19 a.m., and on 2nd and 6th April (vid North Geelong) for Ballarat and stations beyond at 10.45 a.m. On 1st, 2nd, and 4th April, an extra train will leave Melbourne for Ballarat (vid Bacchus Marsh) at 4.15 p.m., taking passengers for Ballarat and stations beyond. On 2nd and 6th April, an extra train, stopping at all stations if required, will leave Ballarat for Melbourne (vid Bacchus Marsh) at 7.25 p.m. Ballarat East.—From 1st till 8th April (both dates inclusive) passengers will not be booked at Ballarat for Ballarat East by any of the trains for Melbourne.
