SHIRES OF ELTHAM AND HEALESVILLE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1245 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Eltham described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Eltham and annexed to the Shire of Healesville.

Area described in petition is as follows.:-Commencing at a point in allotment 6 (Mrs. Chandler's), where the Eltham-road crosses the Watts River; proceeding thence along the said road north-westerly to the south-west corner of allotment 3A (Hall's); thence north along Hall's-lane to the aqueduct of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works; thence easterly along the aqueduct and Syphon track to the boundary of the Healesville Shire at Mount Monda; thence south along the said boundary to the Watts River; thence westerly along the said river to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the council of the Shire of Eltham cannot, by reason of the geographical position of their properties, construct roads for their convenience and use but to a very small extent, and, as a matter of fact, have not done so, with the exception of making the main Eltham-road and one piece of formation of Hall's-lane, which road and lane form part of the boundary of the land desired to be severed; and, in addition, the council has contributed one-third of the cost of a bridge over the Watts River. That the township of Healesville, being immediately adjacent to their properties, all their business is done there, its streets and roads are being continually used by them, and they consider that their interests are identical with those of the Shire of Healesville.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Eltham above described, and annex same to the Shire of Healesville.

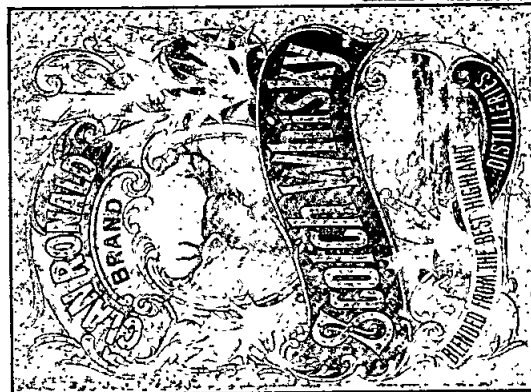

**WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATIONS.**

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 52.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Murtoa, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds; the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation:

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1896, commencing on the 1st January, 1896, and terminating on the 31st December, 1896, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 52, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 18th day of February, 1896.
