## VETERINARY INSPECTOR.—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board until Monday, the 27th April instant, from duly qualified Veterinary Surgeons, for appointment to the position of Veterinary Inspector to the Department of Public Health, at a salary not exceeding £400 a year.

Applicants should state the salary they require.

The duties and qualifications of the position are as follow:—

The Veterinary Inspector will be required to devote the whole of his time to the duties of his office. Those duties will embrace the inspecting of dairy farms, dairies, slaughter-houses, butchers' shops, knackers' yards, and other such places; the reporting on the sanitary conditions of such places and on any condition of the animals, of their carcasses and of their products, likely to affect the public health prejudicially; the examining and reporting on all calves used for calf lymph cultivation at the Government Vaccine Station, both before and after death; the examining and reporting on the condition of animals for quarantining purposes, if so required; and generally the giving of advice concerning conditions of animals and of their products in so far as they may prejudicially affect the public health.

He will also be required, on behalf of the Defence Department, to attend encampments, and to treat all horses in camp, as well as to treat all horses belonging to or hired by the Defence Department at any time; also to attend all boards on injured horses belonging to or hired by the Defence Department or members of the Military Forces.

The qualifications of the office are that the Veterinary Inspector must be a practical and capable man, qualified as a Veterinary Surgeon by examination; he must have had responsibility for some years in the diagnosis and treatment of disease among domestic animals in the practice of his profession as a Veterinary Surgeon, and have sound knowledge of modern methods of research, including those of the bacteriological laboratory.

MARKING OF LOAD LINES ON SHIPS.  
FURTHER NOTICE.

THE attention of owners, masters, and agents of ships is particularly directed to the provisions of section 122 of the *Marine Act 1890*, relating to the marking of load lines, which is as follows:—

*Penalty for Offences in relation to Marks on Ships.*

Any owner or master of a ship who neglects to cause his ship to be marked as by this Act required, or, in the case of a ship registered in Victoria, to keep her marked as so required, or any owner or master who allows the ship to be so loaded as to submerge in salt water the centre of the disc, and any person who conceals, removes, alters, defaces, or obliterates, or suffers any person under his control to conceal, remove, alter, deface, or obliterate any of the said marks, except in the event of the particulars thereby denoted being lawfully altered, or except for the purpose of escaping capture by an enemy, shall, for each offence, incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds. If any of the marks required by this Act is in any respect inaccurate so as to be likely to mislead, the owner of the ship shall incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.

The Regulations relating to the marking of Load Lines came into operation on the 1st September, 1895, and, in order to allow time for the marking of vessels thereunder, the Marine Board has not yet taken action to enforce the provisions of the Marine Acts 1890 and 1892, but hereby notifies that on and after the 1st day of July, 1896, proceedings will be instituted in the case of any vessel not marked as by the aforesaid Acts required.

NOTIFICATION.

IN supersession of this Department Notification No. 4932-D, dated the 8th October, 1895, it is hereby notified that the number of imported horses suitable for army purposes, which it is anticipated will be purchased by the Army Remount Department during the year 1896-7, is increased to 2,346. But this estimate is subject to alteration hereafter.

2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Remount Depôts will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st of November, 1896, to the end of the purchasing season.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, and, in the case of Australian horses, 15 hands 1 inch to 16 hands high.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse and field artillery.

6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at £45 sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the exchange rate for demand bills on London declared to be the opening rate for the day on which payment is made in the ordinary course of business by the Bank of Bengal, Madras, or Bombay, according to the place of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 700, and horses of this class should be not less than 14 hands 2 inches in height. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, under such rules as may be made by the Director, Army Remount Department; but the averages fixed above are not to be exceeded on the whole number purchased in any class.

VICTORIAN NAVAL AND MILITARY FORCES.—  
ALTERATION OF FINANCIAL AND STORE  
REGULATIONS.

At Government House, Melbourne, the fourth day of April, 1896.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Turner | Mr. Gavan Duffy.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke so much of the Order made on the 23rd day of March, 1896, as relates to Horse Allowances under Section III. of Part IV. of the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces, and, in lieu thereof, doth make the following alterations in the said Regulations, such alterations to take effect from the 1st day of January, 1896, inclusive (that is to say):—

PART IV.—ALLOWANCES.

Section III.—Military Allowances.

Sub-section III.—Horse Allowances.

Paragraphs 100 to 103, inclusive, are cancelled, and the following are substituted therefor:—

100. The following shall be the scale of horse allowance for the undermentioned officers:—

All mounted officers (regularly employed) for whom horse allowance is approved, £50 per annum.

Permanent Instructors, Field Artillery Brigade, £50 per annum.

All mounted officers, Militia (except as provided hereafter), £40 per annum.

This allowance is to cover forage and stabling.

Should stabling be provided by the Government, a reduction of £10 per annum from the fixed allowance will be made, but such reduction may be remitted by the Minister in any case where stalls, available for use at the barracks, are allotted to officers who are in occupation of quarters there.

101. The allowance will be paid to officers, &c., upon their producing certificates, signed by themselves, that they have been in possession of horses during the period for which the allowance is claimed, and that the same have been available for duty. Such horses must be the *bona fide* property of the claimant, must be sound and suitable for the service, and registers of such horses must be kept in each corps.

102. No permanent officer, &c., however, will be deprived of his horse allowance for want of such a certificate unless he shall have been without a horse for more than two calendar months.

103. Mounted officers who do not keep horses, and officers attached on probation to Mounted Corps, provided that there are vacancies in the establishment of officers of such corps, will be allowed the actual amount of horse hire, not exceeding 15s. for a whole day and 10s. for a half day, for attendance at parades and drills. Horse allowance will not be paid to any officer for any period during which he may have been on leave of absence, unless during such period his horse shall have been left available for military duties.

104. The following officers will receive horse allowance at the authorized rate per day or half day when called upon to perform mounted duty:—

Field officers of Garrison Artillery when attending brigade parades.

Officers of the Army Service Corps.

Surgeons-Major of Infantry Corps.

Field Officers on the Reserve.

Surgeons-Major on the Unattached List, Medical Staff, but in all cases, before any expense for horse hire is incurred, the authority of the Commandant must be obtained.

105. Forage allowance and horse hire will be issued to Instructors of the Mounted Rifles on the Certificate of the Officer Commanding the Regiment, provided that such forage allowance and horse hire does not exceed in any one month the sum of £37 10s. These allowances are to cover all expenses connected with the provision of horses for parade purposes by such Instructors.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

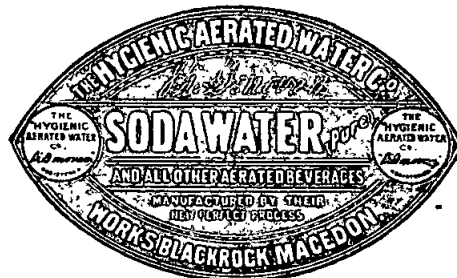

### WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

#### No. 52.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Murtoa, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1896, commencing on the 1st January, 1896, and terminating on the 31st December, 1896, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 52, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 18th day of February, 1896.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1.
