VETERINARY INSPECTOR.—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

A PPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board until Monday, the 27th April instant, from duly qualified Veterinary Surgeons, for appointment to the position of Veterinary Inspector to the Department of Public Health, at a salary not exceeding £400 a year.

Applicants should state the salary they require.

The duties and qualifications of the position are as follow:—
The Veterinary Inspector will be required to devote the whole of his time to the duties of his office. Those duties will embrace the inspecting of dairy farms, dairies, slaughter-houses, butchers' shops, knackers' yards, and other such places; the reporting on the sanitary conditions of such places and on any condition of the animals, of their carcasses and of their products, likely to affect the public health prejudicially; the examining and reporting on all calves used for calf lymph cultivation at the Government Vaccine Station, both before and after death; the examining and reporting on the condition of animals for quarantining purposes, if so required; and generally the giving of advice concerning conditions of animals and of their products in so far as they may prejudicially affect the public health.

He will also be required, on behalf of the Defence Department, to attend encampments, and to treat all horses in camp, as well as to treat all horses belonging to or hired by the Defence Department at any time; also to attend all boards on injured horses belonging to or hired by the Defence Department or members of the Military Forces.

The qualifications of the office are that the Veterinary Inspector must be a practical and capable man, qualified as a Veterinary Surgeon by examination; he must have had responsibility for some years in the diagnosis and treatment of disease among domestic animals in the practice of his profession as a Veterinary Surgeon, and have sound knowledge of modern methods of research, including those of the bacteriological laboratory.

Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION OF COTTON
BLANKETS FREE OF DUTY.

WHEREAS in the Fourth Schedule of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, it is provided that Cotton Blankets shall be admitted free when each blanket is legibly and indelibly branded "all cotton." Now therefore I, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, hereby make the following regulations under which the above-mentioned goods will be admitted free:—

1. All importations prior to the 1st day of October, 1896, may be admitted provided that the words "all cotton" shall be legibly and indelibly marked to the satisfaction of the Customs officer upon each blanket.
2. On and after the 1st day of October, 1896, the words "all cotton" shall be woven in the fabric in letters not less than 1½ inches high of a different colour to the body of the blanket.
3. Such words shall be woven at a distance of not less than 6 inches from the end or selvedge.

STEWART ISLAND DANGERS.

A ROCK, "Ward Rock," having about 3 fathoms of water on it at low-water ordinary tides, has been reported in Abbot Passage; this danger lies approximately in latitude 46° 53' S. and longitude 168° 15' E.

A rock, "Theresa Rock," having about 9 feet of water on it at low-water ordinary tides, has been reported; this danger lies approximately in latitude 47° 4' S. and longitude 168° 18' E., and is about 1 mile to the eastward of Weka Reef.

Broken water is reported to have been seen on what appears to be a sunken rock, situated seaward of Whale Passage, Port Pegasus; this supposed danger lies about 1 cable's length to the southward of the small islet on the east side of the entrance.

These reported dangers will be surveyed at an early date, and their positions gazetted in due course; meanwhile mariners are cautioned to exercise great care when navigating in their vicinity.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.) within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the

service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6 or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

By-Law No. 47.

By-law making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes, and for fixing a Scale of Charges for Water supplied by Measure.

THE Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by Part VI. of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Rate for one year, from the 1st day of January, 1896, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of St. Arnaud, that is to say:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.
2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £5 and under, the annual sum of Ten shillings.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £5 and not exceeding £10, the annual sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of Twenty shillings.
5. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE.

6. The charges for water supplied by measure for all purposes, except market gardens and cases of special agreement with the council, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons. For market gardens, except in special cases to be determined by the council, the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per thousand gallons.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens), and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the council for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

8. One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 5,000 gallons.
9. Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 7,500 gallons.
10. Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons.

11. For every additional half-acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

12. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of market gardens shall be as follows:—

13. One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 10,000 gallons.

14. Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 15,000 gallons.

15. Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons.

16. For every additional half-acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

17. Within six months from the coming into operation of this by-law, the owners of all market gardens must apply to the council for a licence for the land described in the application for market garden purposes, such licence to be granted or withheld, as the council may decide.

18. Market garden shall mean a garden used for the growth of fruit and vegetables for sale.

19. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of livery, bait, coaching, carriers', and carters' stables shall be as follows:—

20. For each stall exceeding four and not exceeding ten, 1,250 gallons per annum.

21. For each stall above the first ten and not exceeding twenty, per annum, 750 gallons.

22. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

23. For each private trough the charge shall be 10s. per annum.

24. Water for steam boilers shall be charged on a sliding scale, with a minimum of 7s. 6d. per inch of the diameter of the cylinder, and a maximum of 15s. The charge to be determined in each case by the time during which the boiler is in use.

25. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be one thousand gallons for every thousand bricks or fractional part thereof, and five hundred gallons for every cubic yard of concrete or fractional part thereof used in the construction of the building or of the appurtenances thereto.

26. For manufacturing purposes, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is so supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge, at two shillings per thousand gallons, would be equal to the amount of 4d. in the £1 of valuation for the lands and tenements used for such manufacturing purposes. And the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the said borough in which such lands or tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purposes of this section of this by-law.

27. The rates and charges for water supplied by measure under special agreement with the council shall be payable as agreed upon.

28. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance as from the 1st day of January, 1896.
