## FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey,  
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath;  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of  
Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Monday, the 4th day of May, 1896, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Monday, the 4th day of May, 1896, until Monday, the 1st day of June, 1896.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the fifty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND JAPAN SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION OF 16TH JULY, 1894, BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

## SUPPLEMENTARY CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND JAPAN RESPECTING THE DUTIES TO BE CHARGED ON BRITISH GOODS IMPORTED INTO JAPAN.

Signed at Tôkiô, 16 July, 1895.

[Ratifications exchanged at Tôkiô, 21 November, 1895.]

WHEREAS, by the Protocol signed at London on the 16th of July, 1894, it was agreed between the Government of Her Britannic Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan that the ad valorem duties of the Tariff annexed to the aforesaid Protocol should, so far as might be deemed practicable, be converted into specific duties by means of a Supplementary Convention, to be concluded between the two Governments within six months from the date of that Protocol; and

Whereas this period was extended by subsequent arrangement:

The High Contracting Parties have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Convention for this purpose, that is to say:

Her Britannic Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Gerard Augustus Lowther, Her Britannic Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires;

And His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, Marquis Saionji Kimnochi, Junii, first class of the Order of the Sacred Treasure, His Imperial Majesty's Minister of State for Education, and Acting Minister of State for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

1. The Tariff annexed to this Convention shall be substituted for the ad valorem Tariff annexed to the aforesaid Protocol of the 16th of July, 1894; it shall be subject to all the stipulations contained in Article 1 of that Protocol, in so far as these are applicable, and it shall come into force one month after the exchange of the ratifications of this Convention.

2. The specific duties established by this Convention shall be subject to triennial readjustment. Such readjustment shall be based on the difference between the average of the two quarterly rates of exchange adopted by the Japanese Customs during the six months ending 30th June, 1894, and the average of the rates of exchange adopted by the Japanese Customs for the four quarters preceding that in which each successive period of three years expires.

The Schedule of readjusted duties shall be published by the Japanese Government three months in advance, and shall take effect immediately upon the expiration of the said period.

It is understood between the High Contracting Parties that the operation of this stipulation shall be subject to the acceptance of a similar arrangement by the other Powers with whom Conventional Tariffs are now being negotiated by Japan.

3. The quarterly rates of exchange mentioned in the preceding Article are the rates determining the comparative values, as entered in the quarterly Tables published by the Japanese Department of Finance, of the present Japanese silver yen on the one hand, and of the English pound sterling on the other.

4. The present Convention shall have the same duration as the Treaty and Protocol concluded on the 16th of July, 1894, of which it is a complement.

5. The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Tōkiō as soon as possible, and not later than six months from the present date.

WEIGHTS, MEASURES, AND COINS.

The catty mentioned in this Tariff is the Japanese weight. It is equal to 600 grammes of the metric system of weights, or 1-32277 lbs. English avoirdupois weight.

The pound is the English avoirdupois weight. The square yard and square foot are the English Imperial surface measures.

The yen is the present Japanese silver yen of 900 fineness and 416 grains in weight.

RULE FOR CALCULATING AD VALOREM DUTIES.

Import duties payable *ad valorem* under this Tariff shall be calculated on the actual cost of the articles at the place of purchase, production, or fabrication, with the addition of the cost of insurance and transportation from the place of purchase, production, or fabrication to the port of discharge, as well as commission, if any exists.

RULE FOR THE MEASUREMENT OF TISSUES.

In determining the dutiable width of any tissue the Customs shall discard all fractions of an inch not exceeding half-an-inch, and shall count as a full inch all fractions exceeding half-an-inch.

NOTE.—It is understood that selvages shall not be included in the measurement of tissues.

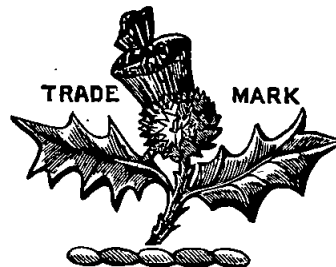

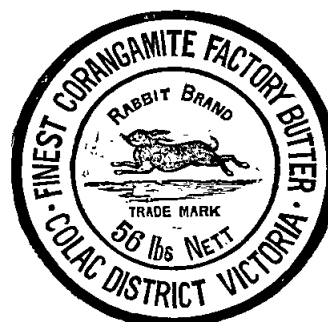

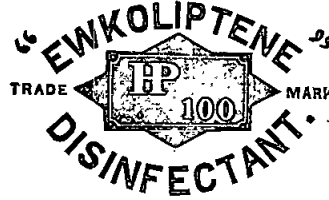

The births of 1,266 children, viz., 624 boys and 642 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. In the corresponding month of the previous year 1,187 births were registered, or 79 less than in the month under review. The births were 85 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 100 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 628, viz., 340 of males and 288 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 638, or 102 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than in the corresponding month of 1895 by 48, and than that of 1894 by 3. They were, however, fewer than in that of any other of the previous ten years, and below the average of the month during the previous ten years by 145. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 134.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 33.26, and of deaths registered 16.50 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.0° on the 7th, and the lowest was 38.8° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (60.1°) was as much as 4.2° below the average; only once in the previous ten years, viz., 1888, was so low a temperature recorded for the month. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.9°) took place on the 6th, and the least range (4.0°) on the 12th. The mean daily range was 17.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.200 inches on the 3rd, and the lowest was 29.500 inches on the 15th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.940 inches) was somewhat below the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.96 inches, or higher than that recorded for the month in any of the ten previous years except 1888, when over 2 inches fell. The average rainfall in March during the previous ten years was 1.35 inches, or about three-fifths of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 39 per cent. to that mortality, as against 37 per cent. in March, 1895; 42 per cent. in March, 1894; 48 per cent. in March, 1893; 47 per cent. in March, 1892; 44 per cent. in March, 1891; and 44 per cent. in March, 1890.

Forty-six deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of paraplegia; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a cutter, and an undertaker, each aged 75, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 75, of pneumonia; a painter, aged 75, of hernia; a gardener, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a cabinetmaker, aged 76, of cerebral hemorrhage; a gentleman, aged 76, of insanity; a carpenter, aged 76, of cirrhosis

of the liver; a ship chandler, aged 76, of uræmia; two gentlemen, each aged 77, of cancer and apoplexy respectively; a boot importer, aged 77, of paralysis; a Presbyterian minister, aged 78, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a labourer, aged 78, of insanity; a gentleman, aged 78, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 78, of injuries to the chest, the result of being run over by a lorry; a female, aged 78, of burns; a farmer, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gardener, aged 79, of pneumonia; an electoral registrar, aged 79, of pleuro pneumonia; a female, aged 79, of suffocation by food; three females, each aged 80, of gout, paralysis, and pleurisy respectively; a male, of unknown occupation, aged 80, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of nephritis; two females, each aged 81, of diarrhoea and heart disease respectively; a hotel-keeper, aged 82, of heart disease; a medical practitioner, aged 82, of enteritis; two females, each aged 84, of apoplexy and pneumonia respectively; a female, aged 86, of diarrhoea; a landing waiter, aged 86, of atrophy of the brain; a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, a Crown prosecutor, aged 79, a miner, a labourer, and a boarding-house keeper, each aged 80, a registrar, aged 84, a tinsmith, aged 85, and a female cook, aged 90, of old age.

Thirty deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 22 were ascribed to accident, 5 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—An ironmoulder, aged 47, and a female gatekeeper, aged 51, were passed over by railway trains; a boy, aged 14, and a labourer, aged 78, by vehicles; a boy, aged 5, by a tramcar; a labourer, aged 20, died of injuries received through falling into a lift well; a labourer, aged 30, of fracture of the spine, the result of a fall from a scaffold; a female servant, aged 25, was killed by a hoarding falling on her; a male, of un stated occupation, aged 74, died of internal injuries accidentally received; two females, aged 60 and 78 respectively, of burns; a seaman, aged 34, was accidentally drowned in the River Yarra whilst under the influence of drink; a tailor, aged 25, a female, aged 25, a clerk, aged 28, a dealer, aged 69, and a seaman, aged 70, were found drowned—the first-named in the Saltwater River, and the others in the Yarra; a male infant, newly born, and one, aged 2 months, were overlain; a female, aged 79, was suffocated by food; a boy, aged 7, died under chloroform; and a new-born female infant was accidentally strangled during birth by the umbilical cord. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant, found in the River Yarra; a female and a male child, aged 3 and 5 years respectively, whose throats were cut; a female child, aged 5, who was shot; and a barrister, aged 48, who died of injuries received in a fight, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the first four cases, and of manslaughter in the last case. The suicidal deaths were those of an engineer, aged 46, who shot himself; a brassfinisher, aged 13, and a bootmaker, aged 65, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and twenty-three deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 14 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 14 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 236, of which 127, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 109, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 182 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 392. Of these, 213, or 54 per cent., were males, and 179, or 46 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 33 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 26 were between seventy and seventy-five, 26 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 was between ninety and ninety-five.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one in the preceding year, there was an increase of 11 deaths under the head of zymotic, of 9 under constitutional, of 37 under local diseases, and of 6 under violence; whereas there was a decrease of 12 under ill-defined causes, and of 3 under other heads. In the zymotic class, deaths from scarlet fever fell from 4 to 2, and influenza and septic diseases each from 5 to 1; but on the other hand those from typhoid fever rose from 19 to 25, diarrhoeal diseases from 16 to 20, and syphilis (chiefly congenital) from 1 to 3. The increase in the constitutional class was chiefly due to tabes mesenterica and tubercular meningitis, the mortality from which rose from nil to 3, and from 10 to 15 respectively. In the local class there was an increase of 9 under nervous diseases, of 13 under diseases of the circulatory system, of 19 under those of the digestive system (an increase of 24 having occurred under enteritis alone); but decreases of 3 each under diseases of the generative organs and of the integumentary system respectively. One case of beriberi occurred during the month.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first three months of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that fewer deaths were set down to typhoid fever in March than in the corresponding month for any previous years shown except 1893 and 1895; also that the mortality from diphtheria was below the average.

GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, No. 1156, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust, when the supply is not by meter, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell such water to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
3. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any

pipe or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust, of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. Wrought galvanized iron piping, of approved quality only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No services of a larger bore than half-inch to properties valued under £25 per annum will be permitted, but those properties which are valued at £25 and over per annum will be allowed a three-quarter inch service.

7. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe of the Trust with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing such approved self-acting valves as may be directed by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of offence from the Trust. All water troughs must be fitted with self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

10. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

11. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offenders from payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890*, or these Regulations.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pan, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be used and contrived as that the water supplied to him by the Trust is, or is likely to be wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation or otherwise, howsoever, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noisome or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes or make any fittings or connexions, and attach the same to any service-pipes of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already laid and connected with the pipes of the Trust, unless he can be proved to be a competent person.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence, and according to the directions, of the Trust's officer, and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final, and binding on all parties.

16. Any person guilty of any offence against these Regulations not otherwise specifically provided for shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in

addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

The above Regulations, from one to sixteen, were agreed to at a meeting of the Trust held 29th February, 1896.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWN OF RUSHWORTH AND PARISH OF MOORA.**

WE, Timothy Taylor, James Taylor, Jeremiah Dooley, Henry Gregory Brice, Henry Pocknee, Henry Lambden, and William Henry Geyle, the duly appointed committee of management of the public park in the town of Rushworth and parish of Moora, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The park shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.
  5. No person shall train or exercise horses in the park, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained, or put goats or pigs in the park.
  6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
  7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
  8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, King-street, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, St. Kilda-road, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

Samples of the sago, soaps, rice, teas, and sugars required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, Ararat, and Ballarat can be seen at the respective lunatic asylums; and samples of the tins, sugars, soaps, and tobacco required at Geelong, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale can be seen on application to the governors of the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The prices must be expressed without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of the tender stated.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and the conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale; and the Medical Superintendent, Lunatic Asylum, Sunbury, by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Melbourne Saving's Bank Deposit Book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received). Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for at" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, they must be prepaid, and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good-coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Meat.—With the exception of meat for the Victorian Naval Forces at Williamstown, fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than 10 inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef. As regards meat for the Naval Forces at Williamstown, the fresh meat must be supplied in sets of ribs, sirloin, and thick flanks, and, when the quantity admits, hind and fore quarters will be taken alternately; shins and sticking pieces to be removed from fore quarters; shins and kidney suet from hind quarters; mutton to be delivered in sides; kidney fat to be removed.

7. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

9. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

10. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

11. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

12. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.

13. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor: failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

15. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

16. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

17. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

18. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

20. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

21. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

23. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

24. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 23 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays. All work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture, &c., of the articles tendered for in these

schedules are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and at the minimum wage specified in the schedules concerned. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8.
