FURTHER PROROGUING PARLIAMENT AND
FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE THIRD
SESSION OF THE SIXTEENTH PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey,
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath;
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of
Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Monday, the 1st day of June, 1896, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same, and to fix the time for holding the next Session thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the 23rd day of June, 1896; and also I do hereby fix Tuesday, the 23rd day of June aforesaid, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament-place, Spring-street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

QUEEN'S REGULATION.

(Made by Her Britannic Majesty's Assistant High Commissioner
for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order
in Council, 1893.)

TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF THE BIRTHS, DEATHS,
AND MARRIAGES OF FOREIGNERS IN BRITISH SETTLEMENTS AND
PROTECTORATES, AND FOR THE REGISTRATION OF MARRIAGES
OF BRITISH SUBJECTS IN SUCH PROTECTORATES AND SETTLE-
MENTS WHEN CELEBRATED BY A MINISTER OF RELIGION WHO
IS NOT A BRITISH SUBJECT.

1. *Local application of Regulation.*—This Regulation shall
apply only to British Protectorates and Settlements, and shall
apply to islands comprised in the Cook Group Federation.

Celebration of Marriages.

2. *Registration of ministers for marriages.*—Any minister of
religion ordinarily officiating as such, or the head of the denomi-
nation to which he belongs, on his behalf, may forward to the
High Commissioner a requisition for registration as a minister
for celebrating marriages in British Protectorates and Settle-
ments in the Western Pacific. Such requisition shall give the
following information:—

Name of minister;
Nationality;
Date and place of birth;
Denomination;
When and where ordained;
Usual place of residence;
Place where he officiates.

On the receipt of such requisition by the High Commissioner,
the name of such minister, with the foregoing particulars, will be
entered in a register book to be kept for that purpose.

3. *Certificates.*—The High Commissioner will from time to
time furnish every minister so registered with a sufficient number
of forms of the marriage certificate hereinafter mentioned.

4. *Persons pretending to be ministers.*—If any person shall
cause his name to be registered as a minister of religion
ordinarily officiating as such, he being at the time not such a
minister, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this
Regulation.

5. *Marriages may be celebrated by certain ministers of religion
if registered.*—Within the limits of this Regulation marriages
between persons who would, if in England, be legally competent
to contract marriages, may be celebrated by a minister of religion

ordinarily officiating as such if his name, designation, and usual place of residence, together with the place where he officiates, is, at the time of the celebration of the marriage, registered in the office of the High Commissioner.

6. *Removal of minister's name from register.*—If any minister so registered die or depart permanently from the limits of this Regulation, or cease to officiate within the said limits, or be by competent authority deprived of his office of minister, the High Commissioner, upon being satisfied of the facts, shall remove the name of such minister from the register.

7. *Notice of registration or removal.*—The High Commissioner shall notify in the *Fiji Government Gazette*, or in some other public manner, the registration of every minister, and the removal of the name of any minister from the register.

8. *Declaration precedent to marriage.*—No marriage shall be celebrated until each of the parties to the marriage shall have made the following declaration before the minister celebrating the marriage:—

"I, A.B., of _____, do solemnly and sincerely declare that I believe there is no impediment or lawful objection, by reason of any kindred or relationship, any former marriage, or want of consent of parents or guardians, or any other lawful cause, to my being married to C.D., of _____, daughter of E.F., of _____."

(Signature of A.B.)

"And I, the said C.D., do solemnly and sincerely declare that I believe there is no impediment or lawful objection, by any such reason or other lawful cause as aforesaid, to my being married to the said A.B."

(Signature of C.D.)

9. *False declaration.*—Any person who shall wilfully make any false statement in any such declaration shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

10. *Provision for special cases.*—No marriage, in fact, shall be avoided by reason only of the same having been celebrated by a person not being a duly registered minister, if either of the parties to the marriage *bona fide* believes at the time that he was a duly registered minister.

11. *Witnesses and certificate.*—The presence of two witnesses at the least is requisite for the due celebration of a marriage, and the minister, the parties to the marriage, and the witnesses shall sign in duplicate a certificate in the following form:—

I [minister] being [designation] certify that I have this day at [place] duly celebrated marriage between [name, designation, and residence of husband] and [name, designation, and residence of wife] after declaration duly made as required [by the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, or if neither party is a British Subject, or if the marriage is celebrated by a minister who is not a British Subject, by the Registration Regulation, 1890].

The minister shall, immediately after the marriage, deliver one certificate to one of the parties to the marriage, and within one month thereafter, or by the first opportunity, shall transmit the other certificate to the High Commissioner.

Any such certificate purporting to be signed by the minister who solemnized the marriage shall be received as *prima facie* evidence of such marriage at the date set forth in the certificate.

12. *Offences by ministers.*—If any minister (except as herein-after provided):—

- (a) celebrates a marriage knowing that he is not duly registered;
- (b) fails to transmit to the High Commissioner the certificate of any marriage celebrated by him,

he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Registration of Births, Marriages, and Deaths.

13. *High Commissioner to keep registers of births, marriages, and deaths.*—The High Commissioner will keep books for the registry therein of births, marriages, and deaths of foreigners occurring within the limits of this Regulation, and will, as soon as possible after being informed of any such birth, marriage, or death, enter the same respectively in the books in such manner as, subject to any direction of a Secretary of State, he may think convenient.

In the case of a death the High Commissioner will, if possible, also enter the date and place of burial.

14. *Copies of entries to be prima facie evidence.*—A copy of the entry of any birth, marriage, or death, signed by the High Commissioner, shall be received as *prima facie* evidence of the fact of such birth, marriage, or death. But no registry of any death shall be received as evidence of the fact of such death unless the burial of the person named be also registered.

15. *Search and copies.*—Every person, on payment of the fees hereunder mentioned, and on stating in writing the particular entry which he desires to find, shall be entitled, at reasonable hours to be fixed by the High Commissioner, to search the books for such entry, and to have a copy of any such entry certified by the High Commissioner.

16. *Fees.*—Every search (to be paid beforehand) Five shillings. Every certified copy of any entry, Two shillings and sixpence.

17. *Notice of births and deaths.*—In every case of the birth of any child of a British subject or foreigner within the limits of this Regulation, one of the parents shall, within 60 days thereafter, and in every case of the death of any British subject or foreigner within the said limits, the occupier of the house or place where the death occurred shall, within 30 days thereafter, transmit to the High Commissioner a statement of the fact and date of such birth or death; giving also, in the case of a birth, the names, and, as far as possible, particulars of the name, age, and birthplace, and nationality of each parent, the name of the child; and, in the case of a death, the name, age, and parentage (if known) and nationality of the deceased, stating also, as far as known, whether the deceased was married, and to whom, and at what place, together with the names and ages of any children left by the deceased.

The statement of a death must also include the date and place of burial of the deceased, verified if possible by the signatures of two witnesses present at the burial.

18. *Correction of accidental errors.*—Upon the discovery of any error in the form or substance of any such entry, the High Commissioner will correct the error by making and signing a new entry in the margin without altering the original entry, adding the date of the correction, and every certified copy of such entry shall show the original entry and the correction.

19. *Offences.*—If any person—

- (a) refuses or neglects to give any notice or information required by this part of this Regulation;
- (b) wilfully makes or causes to be made, for the purpose of being inserted in any register under this part of this Regulation, any false statement touching any of the particulars hereby required to be registered;

he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

20. The provisions of this Regulation regarding the celebration and registration of marriages shall not be compulsory when both parties to any marriage are aboriginal natives of any island or islands in the Pacific.

21. Nothing in this Regulation shall invalidate any marriage which, but for this Regulation, would have been valid.

CIVIL JURISDICTION.

RULE made by His Excellency the Honorable Henry Spencer Berkeley, Esquire, Assistant High Commissioner and Chief Judicial Commissioner (under Part X. of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893), with regard to judgments against natives.

Rules 114 and 114A of the 28th September, 1893, and the 8th September, 1894, are hereby revoked, and the following substituted in their place:—

When a judgment or order for payment of money has been made against an aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific, and such judgment or order remains unsatisfied, an application for the sale of such native's lands shall not be entertained by the Court:

Such native will be liable to the provisions of Rules 35, 36, 37, 38, and 39, with regard to the committal of a judgment debtor.

This Rule may be cited as "The Native Judgments Rule, 1896."

CIVIL JURISDICTION.

RULE made by His Excellency the Honorable Henry Spencer Berkeley, Esquire, Assistant High Commissioner and Chief Judicial Commissioner (in accordance with Article 101 of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893), with respect to written statements and settlement of issues.

1. There shall ordinarily be no written pleadings; but the Court may, with a view to the saving of time and expense—

- (a) Order a plaintiff to put in a written statement of his claim or a defendant to put in a written statement of his defence; and may at any time, if it thinks fit, either on or without application from any of the parties, order a further and better statement of the nature of the claim or defence, or further and better particulars of any matter stated in any written proceeding requiring particulars;
- (b) Direct the parties to prepare issues, and, if the parties differ, settle the issues;
- (c) Defer the fixing of the date of trial until the filing of the statement of defence, or until the issues have been settled.

2. Before a summons is issued in a matrimonial cause the plaintiff shall lodge with the Court a petition setting forth the nature of the relief sought, and the facts relied on in support; as well as an affidavit of the truth of the facts alleged, and (in suits for dissolution of marriage) to the effect that there is no collusion.

These Rules may be cited as the "Rules as to Pleadings, 1896."

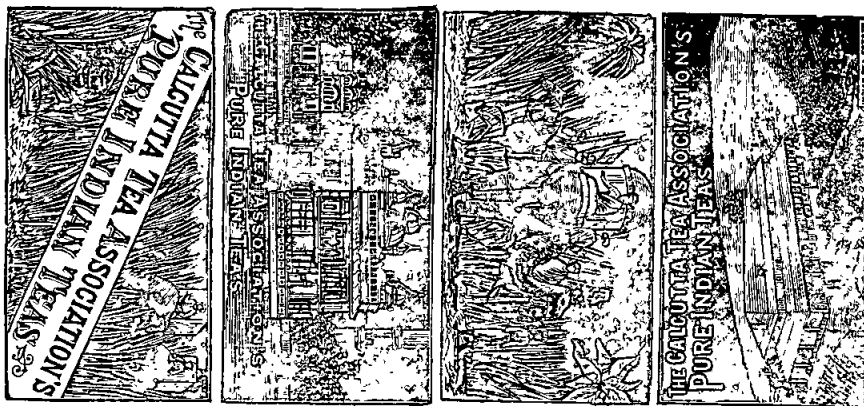

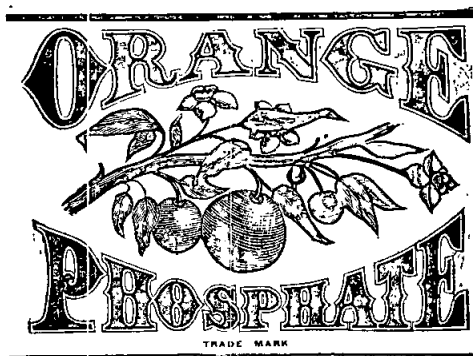

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of continuous municipal districts; and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the rate-payers of portions of the North and West Ridings respectively of the Shire of Borung as described in such petition, praying that the portions so described be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Karkaroc: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Karkaroc, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Borung and of the North and West Ridings thereof respectively as hereby reduced, also of the South and East Ridings thereof, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth further order that the Council of the said newly-constituted Shire of Karkaroc shall consist of twelve members, and that the said new shire shall not be subdivided at present.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GOBUR RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Phillip Ryan, Thomas Cumming, Duncan Stewart, and John Hewlett, a majority of the duly appointed Trustees of the Gobur Race-course and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the written consent of the trustees.
4. No person shall climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or to fence any portion thereof.

6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and also for persons desiring to take water for domestic supply.

Special Conditions:

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st July, 1896, to 30th June, 1897.

2. The licence-fee must be paid in advance. The fee for the period from 1st July, 1896, to 30th June, 1897—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.
