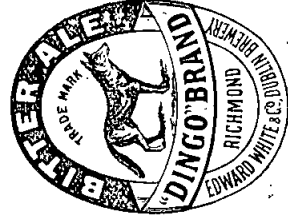

Section 125 of Act 1098.

Health Act 1890.
SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH.
BY-LAW No. 22.

For keeping free from noxious matter yards, stables, places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, and other places of a like nature, for regulating the management of earth-closets and privies, and for regulating the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter.

THE Council of the Shire of Tungamah, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 22 of the said council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall have operation in the townships of Tungamah, St. James, Cobram, Katamatite, Lake Rowan, and Yarraweiyah.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said townships of Tungamah, St. James, Cobram, Katamatite, Lake Rowan, and Yarraweiyah shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, or refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter removed as aforesaid the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land situate in the said townships of Tungamah, St. James, Cobram, Katamatite, Lake Rowan, and Yarraweiyah on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-house, cow yard, cattle shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be properly and sufficiently ventilated, and shall be constructed so as to admit of the pan being placed and fitted beneath the seat in such manner as may effectually prevent the deposit elsewhere than in such pan of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat; and such privy building shall be constructed and placed so as to afford proper means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and contents thereof. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room,

or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

7. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

8. No person shall empty any closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, and approved of by the said council; and when a nightman is appointed by the said council such nightman only shall be empowered to remove night-soil.

9. All night-soil or other offensive matter shall be removed to and deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the said council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and be trenched into friable earth in a layer not exceeding six inches thick, and be covered over with at least one foot thickness of clean earth.

10. The occupier of every house or premises shall provide a properly constructed galvanized iron closet-pan, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and shall keep the same in good and thorough repair.

11. Each occupier as aforesaid shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the closet, or closets, on his premises a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

12. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil each occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the Council of the Shire of Tungamah annually, per pan, such sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for emptying and removing night-soil.

13. Such annual charge, if any, shall be payable by each occupier in four equal instalments, due and payable on the first day of January, April, July, and October in each year, commencing from the date of the coming into operation of this by-law. Such charges shall be paid to the person appointed by the said council to demand and recover the same.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

THE SHIRE OF CHARLTON.
BY-LAW No. 1.

(By-law under *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 1.)

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Charlton, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms shall, if not consistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“*House*” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“*Cesspool*” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“*Street*” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, (whether a thoroughfare or not).

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Charlton.

3. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier of a house or any person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. *Removal of refuse from houses or premises.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove or cause to be removed therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon at least once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein as often as the same

shall amount to two cubic yards or once at least every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the council may remove the same at the expense of the occupier.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing section shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the council or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof do not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleaning the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

8. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all the night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle.

9. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every owner having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

10. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

11. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or assisting in placing or depositing on any land (whether by way of manure or otherwise) any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

12. *Earth-closets not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

13. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

14. *Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or to be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within 24 hours of notice given by the council or one of its officers.*

15. *Animals not to be kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

16. *Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person who is the occupier or owner of any dairy farm or milk store situated within the Shire of Charlton shall on or before the 1st day of July in each and every year register himself by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form prescribed by the regulations approved by the Governor in Council, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee registration of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

17. *Draining of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such buildings, and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

18. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any

cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood, manure, garbage, filth, and other refuse products from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a receptacle constructed of iron or some non-absorbent material to be provided for that purpose, and if allowed to remain therein for twelve hours to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of zinc, in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer, and to be removed within 48 hours after such blood is shed.

19. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

20. *Dairyman, &c., to report disease to the Health Officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer, the recurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

21. *Keeping swine at slaughter-houses.*—An occupier of a slaughter-house shall not at any time keep any swine, unless intended for immediate slaughter, or any dog, or cause or suffer any swine (unless as aforesaid), or any dog to be kept in or about such slaughter-house, nor shall he at any time keep, or cause or suffer to be kept in or near such slaughter-house any animal of which the flesh may be used for the food of man, unless such animal be so kept in preparation for the slaughtering thereof upon the premises, and any swine intended for slaughter shall not be so kept in or about such slaughter-house for more than twenty-four (24) hours.

22. *Disposal of dead or diseased animals.*—No person being the owner of any dead animal shall allow such animal to remain in any place for a longer period than twelve hours, so as to become a nuisance and injurious to health, in default the Council will cause such animal to be removed and destroyed at the expense of such owner.

23. *Repeal of existing by-laws.*—All by-laws under the *Health Act 1890*, or any other Act passed for the preservation of health by the Shire of Korong, the Shire of St. Arnaud, and the Shire of Gordon, and which until the passing of this by-law were in existence, or were or which now might by law be applied to the several territories severed from the said shires by the order of the Governor in Council which constitute the Shire of Charlton, are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into existence.

24. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of the foregoing by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and such penalties, together with all expenses incurred by the council under this by-law, may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BY-LAWS.—CASTLEMAINE
AND SANDHURST WATER SUPPLY.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1890, doth hereby make the following Rules, Regulations, and Orders respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, the same being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act, viz.:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The district which shall be rated for the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be the whole of the Borough of Castlemaine, the whole of the Borough of Chewton, the whole of the United Shire of Mount Alexander, the whole of the United Shire of Metcalfe, the whole of the City of Bendigo, the whole of the Borough of Eaglehawk, the whole of the Shire of Marong, the whole of the Shire of Huntly, the whole of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye, and the whole of the Shire of Maldon.

3. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board within the said district (that is to say):—

- (i.) On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.
- (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and Two pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of valuation in excess of £700.
- (iii.) On every shop not used as a domicile above the annual value of £20, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.
- (iv.) The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (v.) The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Board from the mains by measure shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and from the channels Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, except in cases hereinafter specially mentioned.
- (vi.) For water supplied from the mains for building purposes the minimum charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per month, except in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (vii.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes, including sluicing, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (viii.) For water supplied from the channels to crushing mills, pyrites works, &c., the rate shall be One penny per 1,000 gallons.
- (ix.) For water supplied from the mains to gardens, nurseries, vineyards, or other lands cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket grounds, the rate shall be Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels for like purposes, or for factories or works other than crushing mills or pyrites works, the rate shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons. All such supplies from the channels shall be continuous or regularly intermittent, and the minimum amount of water to be supplied shall be 30,000 gallons per month, to be made in one (1) delivery; and the water shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply shall from time to time direct.

- (x.) For water supplied to any cemetery the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (xi.) For water supplied to any public parks or gardens the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (xii.) The rate to be charged for water supplied for sluicing purposes from the main aqueduct or from the branch aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be One halfpenny ($\frac{1}{2}$ d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge to any consumer shall be for not less than 1,000,000 gallons per month. Water supplied from the aqueducts for sluicing purposes shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply may from time to time direct.
- (xiii.) For water supplied to any trough the rate shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per annum.
- (xiv.) The rate to be charged for water supplied for gas-engines shall be Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied from the mains or pipes shall be—

- (i.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and
- (ii.) If for other than domestic purposes only 12,500 gallons per quarter.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes. No hose or pipe is to be attached to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by a meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

6. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

9. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

10. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board or the local inspector of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or

alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or with service-pipe therefrom, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for such an offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services—

| 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch | 16 lbs. |
| 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ inch | 20 lbs. |

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength sufficient to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subject. Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock, screwed ferrules, and with 2 feet of lead piping with brass unions. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service-pipes, unless by special consent of the Board, shall be—for tenements of annual value not exceeding Thirty pounds, $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. bore; for tenements exceeding Thirty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. bore.

13. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings, all joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

14. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

15. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Board shall be lined with metal so as to be perfectly watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough the supply to which is charged under sub-section (xiii.) of section 3 of these by-laws shall be of greater capacity than

25 gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto will be cut off until the same has been properly and efficiently repaired.

17. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to be run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

18. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

19. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

20. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board, unless for the purpose of repair as mentioned in the last preceding section, in which case notice in writing must be given to the officer in charge of the works of the Board 48 hours at least before removal.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except when the supply is by meter, must not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centre line, by a mean width of 2 feet, and a depth of 1ft. 9in., with the ends sloping inwards. Over-flow pipes to baths will not be permitted.

22. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

23. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only; so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush; and the supply shall be by meter.

24. If any person supplied with water by the Board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

25. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts, or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

26. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m.

27. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

28. In the construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made under the provisions of the *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, and bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1886, the district of the Loddon United Water Trust was divided into divisions for rating purposes: And whereas it is expedient now to make another Order in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the aforesaid Order, and, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, doth re-divide the said Trust District into the following divisions, that is to say:—

- No. 1. The Shire of Marong Division, comprising all that portion of the Loddon United Waterworks District within the Shire of Marong.
- No. 2. The Shire of East Loddon Division, comprising all that portion of the Loddon United Waterworks District within the Shire of East Loddon.
- No. 3. The Shire of Gordon East Division, comprising all that portion of the Loddon United Waterworks District east of the River Loddon within the Shire of Gordon.
- No. 4. The Shire of Gordon West Division, comprising all that portion of the Loddon United Waterworks District west of the River Loddon within the Shire of Gordon.
- No. 5. The Shire of Korong Division, comprising all that portion of the Loddon United Waterworks District within the Shire of Korong.
- No. 6. The Shire of Charlton Division, comprising all that portion of the Loddon United Waterworks District within the Shire of Charlton, formerly part of the Shire of Gordon West Division of the said Waterworks District.

BUCHAN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Buchan Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges must be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. By the 23rd section of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these Rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to maintain and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or representatives for ever.

4. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. If approved, a certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in Schedule A.

5. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced satisfactory to the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made to the secretary at least eight working hours before the time fixed for burial.

7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or other graves will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

9. That between every grave site there shall be a space of not less than 1 foot, and every family vault site, or between every grave site and family vault site, a space of not less than 2 feet.

10. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

11. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

12. The hours for burial shall be:—From September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

13. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

14. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in or cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

15. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument, stone, tomb, pedestal, epitaph, or inscription which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of such stone, tomb, monument, or pedestal, which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

16. Any fence, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

17. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

18. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

19. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept, and may be inspected by any person during business hours.

20. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF TRUGANINA.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of Charles Frederick Orr, Robert Alexander Wright, Abraham Fredman, Samuel Rowley Peel, Thomas Edward Seal, John Henry Barber, Michael Wall, Henry William Bryant, George Bevis, Thomas Mason, George Thomas Chirnside, Angus McNaughton, George Missen, John Robinson, Edward McRobert, Henry Hick, Frederick Woods, and William Henry Treganowan (hereinafter designated the said trustees), and to their heirs in respect of the Reserve for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Truganina, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by a majority of the trustees as provided in the said Crown grant; and whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section. Now therefore the said Charles Frederick Orr, Robert Alexander Wright, Abraham Fredman, Samuel Rowley Peel, Thomas Edward Seal, John Henry Barber, Michael Wall, Henry William Bryant, George Bevis, Thomas Mason, George Thomas Chirnside, Angus McNaughton, George Missen, Edward McRobert, Henry Hick, and Frederick Woods do hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said Reserve for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Truganina.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, and the divisions into which the reserve, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out and known, are as follow:—
 1. The lawn, the grand stands, the saddling paddock, the members' stand, and carriage paddock and approaches.
 2. The weighing yard, the stewards' room, the committee room, the committee stand, the stewards' stand, the judge's box and approaches.
 3. The enclosures called the reserved paddocks, stands, and approaches.
 4. The inner enclosure.
 5. The outer enclosure.
 6. The flat enclosure.
 7. The training ground and approaches.
 8. The enclosure called "The outer carriage paddock" and approaches.
 9. The enclosure called "The bird-enge."

2. Subject to the provisions of the Seventh Regulation, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the seventh of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto, with their horses, for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders as the trustees, or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards may from time to time give as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

For admission to the seventh division for training or exercising each horse, for every half-year £ s. d. 2 0 0

3. No person except the judge and timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room except the stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club or such persons as they may invite.

4. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard or the approaches thereto, except the trustees or the stewards and committee of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, stewards, or committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

5. No person shall enter the committee stand, the committee room, or the several approaches thereto except the trustees or the committee and stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club or their respective officers, and such other persons as the trustees and committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, may invite to do so.

6. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these Regulations, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

7. No person who has been proved, to the satisfaction of the trustees or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved, to the satisfaction of such trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to be a defaulter, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or any part thereof.

8. Every member of the Williamstown Racing Club, and every person paying for admission to the first, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth divisions, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce or (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the trustees, or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to demand the production or surrender of the same.

9. No person shall remain upon the reserve, or any division or part thereof except the seventh division, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

10. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stands, or any portion thereof respectively, or any booth upon the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the trustees, or committee, or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections thereon.

11. No person shall take any dog into the reserve or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon.

12. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, or climb, jump over, remove, or destroy the fences or gates, or roll or throw stones or glass upon the reserve, or discharge firearms therein; nor shall fires be lighted within 100 yards of the race-course, as defined by fences, posts, or buildings.

13. Any person committing in the reserve, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start, or are running, for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in the first, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, or ninth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the trustees, or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy such trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.
8. Obtaining admission to the reserve, or any division or part thereof, when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.
9. Remaining in the reserve, or any division or part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the reserve.

14. The scale of tolls and charges which shall be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the reserve and the buildings thereon respectively on race days and other special occasions (not exceeding in the whole fifteen days in any one year, except with the express permission of the Governor in Council) shall be as follows:—

Provided always that the money so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied in the permanent improvement of the Reserve for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation, or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, and in prizes for any race, or for the owner of any horse engaged in any race, or in such other manner in or upon the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and other purposes of public recreation.

15. No person shall, after the 11th day of October, 1895, carry on any trade, business, or calling whatever on any portion of the reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart by the trustees or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, for the carrying on of such trades, businesses, or callings, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of such trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards.

16. No person shall, after the 11th day of October, 1895, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on the portions of the said fourth, fifth, sixth, and ninth divisions respectively set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—

1. That he be registered annually, or for each or for any race meeting, as a bookmaker by the trustees or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards.
2. That during the time he shall be in or upon the said division, carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the trustees or the committee or stewards of the Williamstown Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

AREA OF LANDS WHICH MAY BE SOLD BY AUCTION INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase the area of Crown lands which may be sold by auction to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in section 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of a machine known as a "Jagger," or of any machine whatsoever tending to impede the lawful taking of fish or to be in any manner detrimental to the preservation or increase of fish in any river, creek, lake, stream, or waters in Victoria: And do further order that if any person having in his possession any fish as well as any net or fixed engine, or any part thereof, be found within half-a-mile of any river, creek, or stream, or of the distance from the mouth of any river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, such person shall be deemed to have used such net or fixed engine for the purpose of catching such fish in such river, creek, or stream, or such prohibited place, unless he prove the contrary to be the fact.
