BANK HOLIDAY AT WYCHEPROOF.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THUBSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Wycheproof.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the fifty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.
