*Factories and Shops Act 1890.*

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

CIGARETTE FACTORY OF MESSRS. SNIDERS AND ABRAHAMS, AT DREWERY-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 6th July, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than sixteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than fifteen shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.—BY-LAW No. 6.

WATER SUPPLY.

Preamble. WHEREAS the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works did on the 29th day of May, 1894, make and pass a By-law No. 4, and intitled "A by-law to alter and amend By-law No. 3, and to make other provisions with regard to the charges and rates for water supply, and for the levying of such rates and charges," which by-law was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st, 8th, and 13th June, 1894, and it is expedient to alter and amend certain of the provisions of the said by-law.

1. Be it and it is hereby enacted by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "The Board") that at and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, Repeal of por. section 7 of the hereinbefore mentioned by-law tion of By. shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed, and it law No. 4. is hereby further enacted as follows:—

Hire of meter 2. The Board will, if it so think fit, but not and rate of otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for rent thereof. which, if inferential meters, shall be at the rate per annum of:—

- For 1-inch meter, Five shillings.
- For 2-inch meter, Six shillings.
- For 3-inch meter, Eight shillings.
- For 4-inch meter, Ten shillings and sixpence.
- For 1½-inch meter, Fourteen shillings.

And for other than inferential meters the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 per cent. upon the cost of each such meter, or as near to such rate as can be conveniently calculated, such Meter rent to rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the be exclusive amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the com- Hired meter to ment of the then current quarter; such meter be fixed at ment of the then current quarter; such meter cost of hirer shall be fixed at cost of the hirer on his premises and main- where directed by an officer of the Board, but shall tained at cost be kept in repair at cost of the Board, except in of Board. case of its receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

Testing 3. In event of the hirer being dissatisfied with meters. the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him, but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter Hirer to give notice of removal. from the Board, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Water supply 4. Every consumer of water who shall receive for closets. his supply of water through a meter, and shall pay for such supply by measure an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, out of such excess be allowed, so far as such excess will admit thereof, a deduction equal to Seven shillings and sixpence per annum on account of each water-closet on his premises, the supply of water for the flushing whereof shall pass through, and be recorded by such meter, save and except in the case of factories or premises having a range of privy closets receiving their water flush from one flushing-cistern, in each of which cases the allowance of deduction shall be Five shillings per annum for each privy seat in such range.

Licence to plumbers 5. A licence, issued in conformity with the provisions of *Water Act 1890* or any Act repealed thereby, or any by-law or regulation thereunder, Act and by-law not to apply to sewerage. shall not authorize the holder thereof to do any kind of work connected with the sanitary fittings of houses or the sewerage system.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the 23rd day of June, 1896, in the presence of—

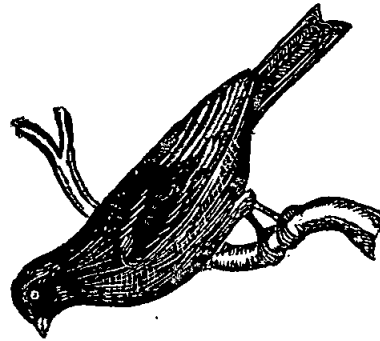

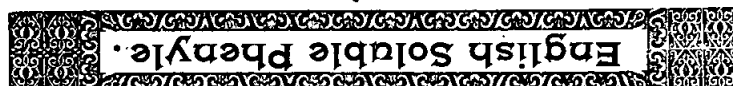

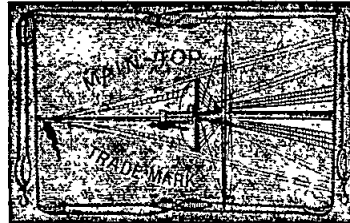

## TORRES STRAITS INNER ROUTE.

DUKE OF BUCKINGHAM SHOAL, in latitude  $11^{\circ} 25' 30''$  S., longitude  $142^{\circ} 56' 02''$  E., has on it a least depth of 10 feet water. The shoal is very small, and has 12 fathoms close around, as shown on Admiralty Chart No. 2919, January, 1895. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of these articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7.
