



The births of 1,133 children, viz.. 581 boys and 552 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. This number was, it will be observed, 139 lower than in the corresponding month of the provious year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and one-third less than the maximum recorded, viz., in 1890. It was, moreover, 244 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 205 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of

the month during the nest event years, and constituting the previous ten years, and 255 below that average, it allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 629, viz., 349 of males and 280 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 504, or 80 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, much higher than in the corresponding month of the two preceding years, were about the same as in 1893, but were fewer than in any of the other preceding years except 1886, 1887, and 1892. They were 20 above the average of June during the previous ten years, and if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 11.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 30.56, and of deaths registered 16.77 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.5° on the 10th, and the lowest was 33.2° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (49.7°) was one degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.5°) took place on the 3rd, and the least range (4.5°) on the 18th. The mean daily range was 13.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.41 inches on the 7th, and the lowest was 29.581 inches on the 28th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.976 inches) differed from the average by a small fraction.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.58 inches, or 54 of an inch more than in June, 1895, or 53 of an inch above the average of the month during the previous ten years. During the first six months of the current year the rainfall amounted to 15.56 inches, or 6.95 inches higher than in the corresponding period of 1895.

Fog occurred on four days during the month.

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway porter, aged 31, and a station-master, aged 54, were passed over by railway trains; a law student, aged 19, died of injuries, consequent on a fall from his horse whilst hunting; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, was killed by a burning tree falling on him; a boy, aged 7, died of injuries to the head, the result of a fall from a bridge; a sawyer, aged 32, and a boatswain, aged 40, of fracture of the skull, che the skull, caused by falls, the former whilst drunk; a seaman, aged 54, of injuries, consequent on falling from the main yard of a ship; a gentle

Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 157, of which 88, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 69, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 99 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 472. Of these, 261, or 55 per cent., were males, and 211, or 45 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between the thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five and fity-five, and forty-five, 20 were between fity and fifty-five and fity, 34 were between fity and sixty-five and sixty-five, 60 were between sixty-five and seventy, 34 were between seventy-five, 31 were between seventy-five, 31 were between eighty-five and one hundred.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one in the previous year, an increase of 14 occurred in the deaths from zymotic diseases, of 7 from developmental, of 26 from local diseases, and 6 from violence; as against which a decrease of 9 took place under other heads. In the zymotic class, deaths from influenza rose from 6 to 13, diphtheria from 2 to 6, and typhoid fever from 3 to 6; but those from crysipelas fell from 5 to 1. In the constitutional class, phthisis caused 6 fewer deaths. In the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 16 to 28, but those from old age fell from 22 to 18. In the local class there was an increase under diseases of the respiratory system from 94 to 112, of the circulatory system from 72 to 80, of the urinary system from 28 to 34, and of the locomotive system from 3 to 8; but a decrease under diseases of the nervous system from 68 to 62. A marked increase also took place in the number of suicides, viz., from 2 to 7; although during the first six months of the year the valid by the following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first six months of 1895, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.
